The following Addresses were presented to the KING on the occasion of His Majesty's visit to Stoke-on-Trent on the 5th instant:—

STOKE-ON-TRENT CORPORATION.

TO THEIR MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTIES THE KING AND QUEEN.

The Dutiful and Loyal Address of the Mayor, Alderman and Burgesses of the County Borough of Stoke-on-Trent in Council Assembled.

May it Please Your Majesties:—

We, Your Majesties dutiful and loyal subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Stoke-on-Trent, in Council assembled, humbly offer to your Majesties our glad and loyal welcome to this Borough.

We gratefully recognise in this visit of Your Majesties a further signal mark of Your Majesties' keen solicitude in the welfare of your subjects, and we crave leave to express our heartfelt thanks for such an acknowledgment of your Royal favour.

We heartily rejoice that Your Majesty is again restored to health and vigour and pray that you will be able to continue your efforts for the welfare of the Empire and your subjects with the same energy as in the past.

The foundation stone of the present North Staffordshire Infirmary was laid by His late Majesty King Edward VII in the year 1866, then His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

We deeply appreciate Your Majesties' ever ready, kind, and sympathetic interest in

schemes for the alleviation of suffering and sickness, and we regard Your Majesties' present visit for the purpose of laying the foundation stone of the new extensions to the Institution as a happy augury for the success of the Scheme.

Your Majesties' visit to the County Borough in 1913 on the occasion of the opening of the Pottery Exhibition is vividly remembered by many of the inhabitants of the Borough and the continued interest at all times displayed by Your Majesties in one of the staple industries of the Borough—the Pottery Industry—is a source of gratification and pleasure to us.

With renewed assurances of our dutiful loyalty to Your Majesties and Your Royal house, we humbly pray that every happiness may in future attend Your Majesties and that you may be long spared to reign over this mighty Empire.

On behalf of the Queen and myself I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and enthusiastic welcome. We are glad to learn that the people of Stoke-on-Trent retain so happy a recollection of our visit to the Potteries twelve years ago, and it gives us great pleasure to come here again.

The welfare of the Hospitals of our country is very near to my heart. To-day's ceremony has a further interest because of my dear Father's association with the North Staffordshire Infirmary. The town of Stoke-on-Trent has never been backward in the relief of the

sick and suffering. Your Infirmary has been established for more than a century and it is also, I am informed, the largest Hospital outside London. These extensions are a striking proof that the people of the Potteries are fully alive to the responsibilities consequent upon the development of their district, and that their reputation for public spirit and generosity towards all good objects is well deserved.

It is indeed most satisfactory that all members of the community have contributed both to the cost of enlarging your Hospital and to the ordinary maintenance expenses, and shows that the support of the Infirmary rests upon a broad and sure basis.

The Queen and I are gratified by the reference in your Address to our constant interest in the great industry of this district. Pottery is a branch of applied art which necessarily concerns every home throughout the land. Those who make and decorate it can exercise a strong influence on the artistic education of the nation. In their hands lies the power to kindle the desire for beauty of form and colour and to satisfy it in the common objects of everyday life.

The development and importance of your town and industry enable me gladly to consent to the request that the title and status of a City shall be conferred upon your County Borough.

I pray that the Divine Blessing may rest upon your labours: and that the City of Stoke-on-Trent may enter upon and enjoy a future of even greater usefulness and prosperity.

#### NORTH STAFFORDSHIRE INFIRMARY.

May it Please Your Majesty:—

It is recalled with sincere pleasure and gratitude that 59 years ago, on the 25th June, 1866, our forefathers had the signal honour of welcoming Your Majesty's august and beloved Father and Mother, when the Foundation Stone of this Infirmary was laid by H.R.H. Albert Edward, Prince of Wales. Since that date 125,000 In-patients and 758,000 Out-patients have received gratuitously the services of our able and devoted Staff of Physicians, Surgeons and Nurses.

To-day, Your Majesties have graciously come amongst us to lay the Stone of the Extensions of our Infirmary, and this great and loyal population rejoice to recognise in this most gracious act the traditional sympathy of Your Majesties with those who may need the services of this and similar Hospitals.

It is our object, by these Extensions, to add the accommodation necessary to meet the needs of the district. The present additions will be erected at the cost of £150,000. Of this sum we have received no less than £100,000. This money has been contributed in varying sums from every section of our population, including splendid donations from leaders of our trade and commerce and by the extremely generous and enthusiastic response of the working people and children of the district.

We are deeply grateful to Her Majesty for so kindly consenting to receive purses to-day.

In the history of our Infirmary, we have been privileged to associate many portions of our establishment with the Royal Family, e.g. The Victoria Ward: The Albert Ward: The

King Edward VII Nurses' Home (in commemoration of the Coronation Year, 1903); The King Edward VII Memorial Out-patients Department (erected in 1911); the Princess Mary Beds and Cot (endowed in honour of the marriage of H.R.H. to the Viscount Lascelles).

We feel it fitting and permissible on this occasion for us to express the hope that Your Majesty has, by the blessing of God, been restored to a full measure of health and strength and pray that you may long be spared to reign over your loyal and devoted subjects.

*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—*

The Queen and I thank you for your loyal Address. It gives me especial pleasure to lay the Foundation Stone of the Extensions to the North Staffordshire Infirmary, and thus to carry on the work begun by my dear Father in 1866, when he laid the Foundation Stone of the existing Infirmary at Hartshill.

In 1802, when the Hospital was first founded, the population of the Potteries was less than 25,000. To-day it is much nearer half a million. It is not only this increase and concentration of population that necessitates extensions to your buildings—these are also demanded by the simultaneous advance of medical and surgical treatment during the past hundred years.

I have been informed that upwards of 90 per cent. of the beds in this Hospital are in regular occupation: and that now an in-patient remains there for less than a month, thus making it possible last year to treat over 5,000 in-patients:—a striking testimony to the beneficent service rendered by the Hospital.

It is gratifying to learn that the extensions of the Hospital have received wide and generous financial support throughout your district, from working people and their children, as well as from employers and leaders of industry.

All that I have heard of the character, administration and efficiency of this great Infirmary is most satisfactory and I have much pleasure in acceding to the request that it shall in future be known as the North Staffordshire Royal Infirmary.

I pray that God may bless this Hospital and all who within its walls labour for the relief of the sick and suffering.

#### BRISTOL CORPORATION.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY AND TO HER MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY THE QUEEN.

The Humble Address of The Lord Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the City of Bristol.

May it Please Your Majesties:—

We Your Majesties' faithful Subjects, the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the City of Bristol, humbly beg to offer to Your Majesties a most hearty and loyal welcome to our Ancient City to-day.

We crave leave to thank Your Majesties for coming amongst us to open the new Buildings of the Bristol University which form a fitting capstone to the other Educational Advantages which have been built up in our midst; and whilst we have always remembered with feelings of gratitude Your Majesties' former visits to our City we respectfully look upon Your Gracious presence here to-day as a further proof of Your Goodwill.

Your Majesties' Munificent works of Charity, Your unflinching sympathies with distress, and the deep and abiding interest which Your Majesties have ever shown in all things relating to the welfare of Your Empire and Your people both at home and abroad have endeared Your Majesties to Your Subjects all over the world and have knitted a life-long bond between You and them such as no Nation has ever known.

It is our humble prayer that Your Majesties may be spared for many years to reign over a united and happy people, and that the blessing of peace and prosperity may rest upon our land.

*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—*

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address and for the warmth and cordiality of your welcome.

The Queen and I retain pleasant recollections of our previous visits to your City and we are happy to think that these are still remembered by the people of Bristol. It is especially gratifying to come here again to-day and inaugurate the new buildings of Bristol University and I heartily congratulate the Corporation and Citizens upon these magnificent buildings. The private generosity which has made their erection possible is a convincing proof that the race of pious founders and benefactors did not become extinct in England with the passing of the Middle Ages.

I know that the advance of education is a traditional virtue in Bristol: and that the great merchants of the 16th Century and afterwards, who made the City famous in exploration and trade, were also great founders of schools. But over a century ago, educational zeal somewhat declined in Bristol as elsewhere. It is a most happy omen for the future of your City that the marked revival in its trade and prosperity during the last 40 years has been accompanied by a revival of learning and of liberality in the endowment of education.

At one time it was thought that a University town was the seat of a University and nothing else, and people would have seen something incongruous in the idea of a University being placed in a great commercial and manufacturing town like Bristol. But it has been the most characteristic feature in the modern development of higher education that the newer Universities have been founded in busy and populous centres. I am convinced that this is in the best interests of both learning and business and that the interaction of the two is stimulating and helpful to each other.

I shall always retain a warm interest in the well-being and prosperity of your City: my earnest prayer is that its commerce and industry may long continue to flourish, and that the Divine Blessing may rest alike upon the life and activities of the City and University of Bristol.

## UNIVERSITY OF BRISTOL.

May it Please Your Majesties:—

We, the Court, Convocation and whole body of Members of this your University of Bristol humbly desire to bid Your Majesties welcome to the University and to express our loyal and joyful thanks for your gracious acceptance of our request that you would honour the opening of these Buildings with your Royal presence.

We venture to remind Your Majesties that the Charter which was granted to us sixteen years ago by the illustrious and beloved King Edward the Seventh, and under which, Sir, you are our Visitor, incorporated this University "for the promotion of Arts, Sciences and Learning," and we have striven to achieve the lofty aim thus set before us. It is our happy lot and duty to cultivate and encourage learning both by imparting knowledge to those who seek it, and not less by providing facilities for its development through maturer study and research. It is equally our duty and equally our happy lot so to unite in a common life and so to inspire with a single ideal persons whose fortunes in life have been unequal and whose occupations after they leave us will be diverse that we may breed in them mutual understanding and respect and the spirit of fellowship, and thus send out in each succeeding year men and women fitted both by knowledge and by trained sympathy to do good service to their country and to mitigate the acerbities which are a consequence of ignorance. Nor are the duties of any University now bounded by its walls. We are conscious of the appeals for assistance justly made by those whom circumstances prevent from giving more than their hard-earned leisure, and sometimes but the evening of their lives, to the search for knowledge. We are conscious too that it is incumbent upon us to bring science to the aid of industry, and in this region particularly to the aid of that most ancient and fundamental industry of agriculture in which Your Majesties take so keen and so expert an interest.

Your Majesties are ever ready to encourage all that promotes sound learning, social harmony, and the general prosperity of your subjects, and it is therefore in confident hope of your Royal approval that we submit to you, as evidence that we have faithfully striven to fulfil the duties committed to us, the fact that we receive the generous support, not only of this City of Bristol and its citizens, but also of the Cities of Bath and Gloucester and of the three counties, Gloucestershire, Somerset and Wilts.

The Buildings which Your Majesties grace by your presence to-day, will, we believe, remain so long as stone endures one of the architectural glories of your reign. Erected in memory of the Founder of the University, our first Chancellor, they are a monument at once of the munificence and of the filial piety of the donors, one of whom, alas! has not lived to see this auspicious day. It is our confident hope that they may through each succeeding generation insensibly draw by their beauty the souls of the young into conformity with the beauty of reason as do the buildings of Your Majesties' ancient Universities in this realm.

That Your Majesties may through many happy years see Learning and the Arts ever more increase and flourish among your people and that you may be convinced of our fidelity

and love and may long retain a happy memory of your visit to us is the ardent hope of your most loyal subjects, the Court, Convocation and Members of the University of Bristol.

*To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—*

I sincerely thank the Court, Convocation and Members of the University of Bristol for their welcome. I have much pleasure in opening these magnificent buildings, erected in memory of the first Chancellor of the University through the splendid generosity of his sons—one of whom, to the deep regret of all, has not lived to see the completion of a work to which he dedicated not only wealth, but many years of thought and care. He has however, left for those who come after an inspiring example of unremitting devotion to a high ideal, and his share in this noble family memorial will ever be gratefully remembered—for assuredly nothing should be more productive of enduring good than the endowment of higher learning.

You have set before me in eloquent outline the lofty aims of the University of Bristol—aims which, I am glad to think, unite the youngest and the eldest of our universities in an undivided fellowship of national service. To hold in trust for the common use the treasures of past thought: to provide for the creative minds of the present a congenial and stimulating home: to give to all the opportunity of a liberal education in the arts and sciences: to animate men and women with worthy ideals of clear thinking and social usefulness: to spread the pure light of disinterested studies over an ever-widening circle, these are some of the essential and ennobling duties of the Universities. Their responsibilities are heavy as their opportunities are great: and they can only rise to the full measure of their task if they be strong in public sympathy and support. I am therefore glad to hear that, not only the City of Bristol, but also neighbouring counties and important cities are giving practical proof of a firm belief in the value of the work of this University, and evincing a determination to help in the extension of that work to ever higher levels of achievement.

The new buildings of Bristol University are a conspicuous and beautiful landmark in this ancient City: and serve not only to keep afresh the remembrance of a great gift, but also to remind the friends of the University of their obligation to ensure that this gift, so nobly bestowed, be worthily used to the advancement of learning.

#### THE SOCIETY OF MERCHANT VENTURERS.

We the Master, Wardens and Commonalty of the Society of Merchant Venturers of Bristol humbly desire to present to Your Majesties an address of welcome on the occasion of Your Majesties' visit to this City. We venture to remind Your Majesties that on the occasion of your visit to Bristol in 1912 you showed us this act of favour and allowed us to express our sentiments of loyalty and devotion to the Throne and that since that date His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has graciously been pleased to accept the Freedom of our ancient Society.

In those distant days when our Guild first took shape the activities of our Society were chiefly concerned in the regulation of the sea-borne trade of this Port and in the promotion of those voyages of adventure and discovery which contributed so largely to the foundation of the maritime supremacy of this realm. Those stirring days are past but their romance and memory survive and will, we feel sure, touch a responsive chord in the heart of one who like Your Majesty has had his business in great waters.

In later years the energies of our Society have been diverted into other channels and have been mainly engaged in the administration of the Charitable Funds committed to our care and in the provision of educational opportunities for the inhabitants of Bristol and the adjoining Counties. In this connection we venture to refer to the Boys' and Girls' Schools supported by the funds vested in us as Trustees by that great Philanthropist of the XVIIIth Century Edward Colston; to the Merchant Venturers' Technical College built, equipped and financed by the Society; and to the part taken by the Society in the formation and maintenance of the University of Bristol. Nor would it be fitting to omit the name of one whose memory will ever live as that of a Prince among the Benefactors of this City, the late Henry Herbert Wills an Honorary Member of our Society whose gifts to the University of Bristol were only surpassed in munificence by those devoted by him to the erection, equipment and endowment of a Home of Rest for Chronic and Incurable Sufferers, a great and splendid Charity of which he appointed our Society to be the Administrative Trustees.

Your Majesties did this City the great honour of a Royal visit in the Year 1912 to inaugurate the New Wing then lately added to the Royal Infirmary and now Your Majesties graciously repeat that honour to inaugurate buildings erected, not to minister to the necessities of the body, but to furnish in fitting beauty and state a Home for those high ideals of education and research in which the needs and aspirations of the mind of man seek satisfaction.

That Your Majesties may live long and happily and that under Your wise and beneficent rule the blessings of Peace may abound and heal the wounds inflicted by War abroad and industrial strife at home is the earnest prayer of Your Majesties' devoted subjects the Merchant Venturers of Bristol.

I thank you very sincerely for your Address and for the spirit of loyalty and affection to which it gives expression. I am glad to receive again the greetings of your ancient and famous Society, and all the more so because, since my last visit to Bristol, a new tie between my House and the Society of Merchant Venturers has been created by the reception of my son into your Membership.

You have referred with natural and legitimate pride to the long and striking history of your Society. It is a living testimony to the enduring greatness and the continuing vitality of Bristol that in the Merchant Venturers, as in the Livery Companies of the City of London,



we have, still surviving and devoting its wealth and energies to the public good, one of the Merchant Guilds that regulated the trade and administered the government of mediæval cities. As you have rightly said, no sailor and no merchant who has any feeling for the romance of his calling, can fail to be moved by your brief allusion to the past history of your Society.

But the work of bygone centuries is done and cannot be repeated: and your fellow citizens have good reason to be grateful that in these days your Society have devoted their accumulated wealth and their efforts to the cause of education. Not that the interest of the Merchant Venturers in this essential matter is a thing of modern growth: The names of Colston and Whitson, to mention no others, are a proof that the great Merchants of the past had a just appreciation of the value of knowledge.

I am glad to learn that the schools of Colston's foundation are still flourishing and rendering good service to education in Bristol: and that, when the educational system of Bristol grew and developed in directions which Colston would never have foreseen, the Merchant Venturers showed themselves faithful to their old traditions in the new circumstances. We all appreciate the part which they took in founding the University of Bristol.

It is most satisfactory that the facilities which you have provided at your Technical College are freely made use of by those whom they are intended to benefit, and that 2,000 students attend the evening classes after their day's work is over.

It is fortunate for Bristol and for the whole country that your Society have learned so early and so thoroughly to direct their funds and activities to the cause of education. We know by recent and happy experience that your old tradition of munificence is far from extinct, and that there are still families in Bristol who are ready to emulate the generosity of earlier benefactors: for, as your Address rightly reminds us, the name of an Honorary Member of your Society, Henry Herbert Wills, will be handed down to posterity as a noble benefactor not only of education but of the great Charity which he founded in your City for the alleviation of incurable suffering.

I am confident that the Society of Merchant Venturers may look forward to a long and prosperous future of beneficent and public spirited work: and I pray that the Blessing of God may rest upon their labours in the service of their fellow citizens.

Now, therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, and No. 10 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said William Walter Banbury the authorisations granted by the said Regulations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poisons in accordance with the provisions of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, to be in possession of and supply raw opium and to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) by a Special Order called the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order, 1919, dated the 20th day of October, 1919, applied the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Special Order.

And whereas it is provided by Sub-section I of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order.

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the said Special Order by altering the description of the trade specified in the Appendix thereto.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

1. Subject to the provisions of this Appendix the following operations shall be operations of the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade:—

- (a) the making, wherever carried on, of perambulators, invalid carriages, folding push-cars, and the wheels or axles therefor;

(b) the making of the following articles for perambulators, invalid carriages, or folding push-cars when such making:—

(i) is done in association or in conjunction with the making mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) above, or

(ii) constitutes the main business of the establishment, branch, or department, or

(iii) is done in a toy-making establishment,

that is to say:—springs, tubular under-carriages, hood frames, bodies (including cane or wicker bodies), canopy frames, levers of all kinds, aprons, hood and canopy covers;

(c) the making of motor-cycle side-car bodies when done in an establishment, branch or department, in which the main business is any of the making mentioned in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) above;

(d) the making of fittings or accessories for perambulators, invalid carriages, or folding push-cars when done (a) in association or in conjunction with any of the making specified above, or (b) in a toy-making establishment;

(e) the repair of any of the articles, the making of which is an operation of the trade herein specified, when done in association with or in conjunction with such making.

2. All operations of packing, warehousing, despatching, stock-taking, and other similar operations and all operations of crate making when such operations are incidental to any of the operations referred to in the preceding paragraphs hereof shall be deemed to be operations of the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade.

3. Notwithstanding anything in this Appendix the following operations shall not be operations of the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade:—

(a) the manufacture of self-propelled chain or lever-driven or mechanically propelled invalid carriages or parts thereof;

(b) operations included in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, or any amendment or variation thereof.

4. For the purpose of this Appendix:—

(a) the expression "invalid carriages" shall include spinal carriages;

(b) the expression "perambulators" shall not include Toy perambulators;

(c) the making of hood and canopy covers shall include the covering or re-covering of hoods and canopies;

(d) "Toy-making establishment" means an establishment, branch, or department, in which the main business is the work specified in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, or any amendment or variation thereof.

(DRAFT) INSTRUCTIONAL CIRCULAR

#### TRADE BOARDS (PERAMBULATOR AND INVALID CARRIAGE) ORDER, 1925.

1. It has been represented to the Minister of Labour that it might prove of assistance to employers and workers and others concerned in the application of the Trade

Boards Acts, 1909-1918, if, in suitable cases, when he makes an Order applying the Acts to a trade for the first time or when he makes an Order varying the existing description of a trade contained in an Order made under the said Acts, some information were given by a departmental Instructional Circular as to his understanding of the scope of the Order.

2. An authoritative interpretation of the Trade Boards Acts and/or of Orders made thereunder can be given only by the Courts of Law and, on the understanding that any views which he may express provisionally as to the inclusion within or exclusion from the scope of the Acts and/or Orders made thereunder of any trade, process, operation, article, or of any class of worker, are given on the information at the time in his possession and are subject to revision in the light of further information, the Minister makes the observations which follow in paragraph 3 below for the guidance of all concerned in the application of the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order, 1925.

3. The Order of 1925 amends the Order of 1919, and the principal effect of the amendment is to bring in various fringes of the trade which were not previously specified.

#### Paragraph 1 (a) and (b).

The work included in these sub-paragraphs is in general that included in the 1919 Order. The manufacture of such parts of perambulators as springs, tubular under-carriages, hood frames, bodies, canopy frames and levers, and the making of aprons, hood or canopy covers, including the covering or re-covering of hoods or canopies (see also paragraph 4 (c) of the definition) is now, however, included where it is the main business of the establishment, branch, or department in which it is performed as well as when the work is done directly in association with or in conjunction with the making of perambulators, invalid carriages, etc. It is also included when done in toy-making establishments. The reason for this inclusion is that this work is understood to form an integral part of the Perambulator Trade, although the firms concerned may, in some cases, not manufacture any completed perambulators.

#### Paragraph 1 (c).

The manufacture of motor cycle sidecar bodies which was within the scope of the original definition when carried on in association with the manufacture of perambulators, invalid carriages or folding push-cars, is now included only when carried on in establishments or departments mainly engaged in the perambulator and invalid carriage trade. It was not the intention of the original definition to bring within the scope the making of these bodies when their manufacture constituted the main business of the establishment or department and the making of the perambulators, etc., was an occasional or subsidiary part of the business and the opportunity has been taken in the new definition to make the position clearer.

#### Paragraph 1 (d).

This sub-paragraph specifies work which is held to be part of the Perambulator Trade when carried on in association with the manu-

facture of perambulators, invalid carriages, folding push-cars, and integral parts thereof, or in establishments or departments mainly engaged in the Toy Trade. The operations covered were already covered by the Order of 1919. An important difference is, however, that the manufacture of the toys specified in inclusion (e) of the 1919 Order is not now covered, but by an Order of even date is included within the revised scope of the Toy Trade Board. This amendment is the result of an agreement reached by the two Boards after exhaustive consideration of the circumstances (see also Note above). The two Boards also agreed that the manufacture of perambulator fittings or accessories by Toy firms should be covered by the Perambulator Board. The phrase "fittings or accessories" should be understood to cover everything made for a perambulator other than the parts specified in paragraph 1 (b) of the definition.

*Paragraph 2.*

Apart from the fact that stocktaking and crate making are now definitely included, this paragraph is the same as inclusion (f) of the 1919 Order, and appears to call for no comment.

*Paragraph 3.*

The object of this paragraph is to avoid overlaps with other trades, self-propelled chain or lever driven and mechanically propelled invalid carriages, being understood to form part of the cycle trade.

As regards sub-paragraph (b), see note on paragraph 1 (d) above.

And whereas it is provided by Sub-section 1 of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order.

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to vary the said Special Order by altering the description of the trade specified in the Appendix thereto.

Now, therefore, the Minister by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, and of any other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes a Special Order varying the said Special Order:—

1. The description of the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, shall be varied by the substitution therefor of the description set out in the Appendix to this Order.

**APPENDIX.**

**TRADE.**

*Definition.*—1. Subject as hereinafter provided the Toy Manufacturing Trade shall consist of all work in connection with the making of children's toys when performed:—

(a) in a toy making establishment or in a perambulator making establishment, or

(b) in any other establishment by a worker who during the whole time that he works in any week in such other establishment is wholly employed on such work.

*Construction.*—2. For the purpose of this Appendix the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

“ *Toy making establishment* ” means an establishment, branch or department in which work in connection with the making of children’s toys is the principal business carried on.

“ *Perambulator making establishment* ” means an establishment, branch or department in which the principal business carried on is the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order, 1919, or any amendment or variation thereof.

“ *Children’s Toys* ” includes any part of such toys.

“ *Making of children’s toys* ” includes the assembling of parts of such toys.

“ *Work in connection with the making of children’s toys* ” includes all operations of sweeping up in any part of an establishment, branch or department mainly engaged upon work in connection with the making of such toys, and packing, warehousing, despatching, stock-taking and any other such work in connection with children’s toys when carried on in association or in conjunction with the making of such toys.

*Saving.*—3. Notwithstanding any of the foregoing provisions of this Appendix, but without prejudice to the construction of any expression contained in those provisions, there shall not be deemed to be included in the Toy Manufacturing Trade any of the following operations, that is to say:—

- (a) the making of sports requisites;
- (b) the making from ceramic materials of dolls or dolls’ parts, dolls’ china, marbles or similar articles, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other pottery;
- (c) operations included in the trades specified in the Orders hereinafter mentioned or any amendments or variations thereof, that is to say:—

The Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1918.

The Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Order), 1918.

The Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919.

The Trade Boards (Women’s Clothing) Order, 1919.

The Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919.

The Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919.

#### INSTRUCTIONAL CIRCULAR.

#### TRADE BOARDS (TOY MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1925.

1. It has been represented to the Minister of Labour that it might prove of assistance to employers and workers and others concerned in the application of the Trade Boards Acts, 1909-1918, if, in suitable cases, when he makes an Order applying the Acts to a trade for the first time or when he makes an Order varying the existing description of a trade contained

in an Order made under the said Acts, some information were given by a departmental Instructional Circular as to his understanding of the scope of the Order.

2. An authoritative interpretation of the Trade Boards Acts and/or of Orders made thereunder can be given only by the Courts of Law and, on the understanding that any views which he may express provisionally as to the inclusion within, or exclusion from the scope of the Acts and/or Orders made thereunder of any trade, process, operation, article, or of any class of worker are given on the information at the time in his possession and are subject to revision in the light of further information, the Minister makes the following observations for the guidance of all concerned in the application of the Trade Boards (Toy Manufacturing Order, 1925).

3. The Order of 1925 amends the description of the Toy Manufacturing trade contained in the Order of 1920, its main effect being to bring within the scope of the Board various fringes of the trade hitherto unscheduled. In particular, the manufacture of toy perambulators and other toys manufactured by perambulator makers is transferred from the scope of the Perambulator and Invalid Carriages Board to that of the Toy Board.

The following explanation (which must not be taken as exhaustive) is given of the terms employed in the definition of the trade:—

#### *General Principles of Inclusion and Exclusion.*

*Paragraph 1.*—The principles on which the definition is based are to be found in its first paragraph. Generally speaking, all work in connection with the making of children’s toys is brought within the scope of the Board in two sets of circumstances (i) when carried on in an establishment, branch or department mainly so engaged, or (2) when carried on by a worker so engaged, irrespective of the main work of the establishment, branch or department in which he is employed, provided in this case that the worker is wholly\* so employed during his working hours in any week. In addition, in the case of perambulator-making establishments, any toy work done in the establishment is brought within the scope of the Toy Board, whether the worker is employed on both types of work or not. Hitherto such work has been within the scope of the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Board, and the present arrangement is the result of an agreement between the two Boards concerned.

#### *Interpretation “ Toys.”*

*Paragraph 2,* contains interpretations of the terms used in the first part of the definition; only the following call for comment:—

While no precise definition of “ children’s toys ” can be embodied in the Order of 1925, the term applies essentially to any article made for sale as a plaything for children. Toys of all classes, e.g., metal toys, wooden or other hard toys, soft and other stuffed toys, dolls, children’s books of textile materials, requisites for table games, Christmas crackers, Easter eggs, toy musical instruments, etc., are of course included. There

\* NOTE.—In interpreting the word “ wholly ” in the definition, the Minister does not propose to regard interruptions in the making of children’s toys for insignificant periods as taking such making outside the scope of the Board.



are, however, classes of articles (e.g., bats and balls) which are toys in certain circumstances only; e.g., according to the pattern made. A determining criterion in all such cases will be whether the article in question is made mainly for sale as a child's toy. If so, it is within the scope of the Board. The position is similar with regard to articles used for instructional or educational purposes. Children's toys are not excluded merely by reason of their being also used for those purposes.

It will be noted that, under paragraph 2 of the definition, the expression "children's toys" includes any part of such toys. There is thus brought within the scope of the Order the making in a toy-making establishment, branch or department, of paste or other adhesive material, or nails, screws, nuts, hinges, catches or other similar articles used in the assembling of toys. The making of such articles elsewhere may, however, be presumed not to form part of the toy-making trade and is therefore not included.

#### *Assembling.*

The assembling of parts of toys is considered to be an integral part of the making of toys and is therefore within the scope of the Order in the same circumstances in which toy manufacture in general is included. For instance, a firm which had an establishment, branch or department wholly or mainly engaged upon assembling parts of toys bought either from some other English firm or abroad or which employed a worker wholly upon such work, would thus be within the scope of the Order. By "assembling" is understood the putting together of parts in such a way that they cannot be separated afterwards without breaking the article. Such operations as the filling of Christmas stockings or the putting together of component parts of table games are not intended to be covered by the term "assembling." They are considered to be operations of "packing" and, as such, are within the scope of the Order only in the circumstances specified in paragraph 2 (1). That is to say, such packing operations would be within the scope of the Order (and not otherwise) when performed in a toy making establishment, branch or department, irrespective of whether the firm itself manufactured the stockings or parts thereof or not.

#### *Avoidance of overlapping with other trades: Clothing, Pottery, Sports Requisites.*

Paragraph 3.—The object of this paragraph is to avoid overlaps with other trades; for example, in the absence of a provision of this kind, articles of clothing worn by children for the purpose of "dressing up" as red Indians, policemen, nurses, etc., might be argued to be articles made for sale as children's playthings. Such articles are, however, in general, manufactured in the clothing trades and fall within the present scope of the appropriate clothing Trade Board. A further example of this kind is the manufacture of a toy animal from sugar, which clearly forms part of the Sugar Confectionery Trade, and is covered by the Sugar Confectionery Trade Board. In addition, in order to avoid encroaching upon the pottery trade, the manufacture of such articles as dolls' heads from pottery is excluded when carried on in

conjunction with the manufacture of other pottery, even though the workers are not interchangeably employed. If, however, an establishment were engaged exclusively on the manufacture of dolls' heads or other toys or parts thereof from pottery, such an establishment would, in the Minister's view, be a toy-making establishment, and fall within the scope of the revised Definition. The express exclusion of the making of sports requisites not only emphasises the separate character of the Trade but is also in accordance with the criterion referred to above, of exempting articles which are not made wholly or mainly for sale as children's playthings.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 13TH JUNE, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Animals for  
Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quaran-



time) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

*Definition of Quarantine Station.*

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the Animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

*Examination before Landing.*

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulation applicable to the Animals on Landing.*

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this thirteenth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

*Application of Part I of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920.*

1.—(1) Part I (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-five, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

*Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, Subject to Certain Modifications.*

2. Part II (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the Principal Order is hereby applied, subject to the modification hereinafter appearing, to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall comprise a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

*Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.*

3.—(1) The dates between which all sheep on lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the Principal Order are hereby fixed to be the tenth day of August and the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

(2) Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed

by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.

(3) Each dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where such dipping is not practicable, the Notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the Notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the Notice.

(4) If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a Notice served under paragraph (2) of this Article relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such Notice he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4.—(1) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which they may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice, and shall cease to apply to any such lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) A copy of every Notice served under this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Inspector signing the same.

*Power to Prohibit Exposure of Undipped Sheep on Lands in Double Dipping Area.*

5.—(1) The Local Authority may, by Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and served on any person entitled to turn out sheep on any lands in the Double Dipping Area described in the Second Schedule hereto, prohibit such turning out during the then current year after the expiration of the double dipping period unless the sheep have since the tenth day of July in the current year been dipped twice by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Minister for sheep scab or purporting to be so approved with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dippings, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(2) If any person served with a Notice under this Article turns out or causes or permits to be turned out, sheep in contravention of the Notice, he shall, in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

*Short Title.*

6. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1925.

(a) the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Corporation to supply gas of any particular illuminating or calorific power, and the substitution thereof of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas, and

(b) the modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Corporation by substituting for the maximum price per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised, with an addition to meet increases in the cost and charges of and incidental to the production and supply of gas by the Corporation since 30th June, 1914, a maximum price per therm (*i.e.* 100,000 British thermal units).

The maximum price now authorised in respect of the supply of gas by the Corporation is seven shillings per 1,000 cubic feet, and the maximum price which the Corporation will ask the Board of Trade to substitute for that price in accordance with paragraph (b) above throughout the limits of supply of the Corporation as proposed to be extended is sixteen decimal eight pence per therm.

3. To make further provision with regard to the gas undertaking of the Corporation and particularly with regard to the following matters:—the purchase and utilisation of residual products on the existing gas lands of the Corporation: the purchase of additional lands; the laying of pipes in streets laid out but not dedicated to public use and for ancillary purposes; the construction and placing of pipes, etc., to be laid on consumers' premises; the cutting off and re-connecting supplies and expenses thereof; the supply of gas where the consumer has separate supply; the relief from obligation to supply in certain cases; register of prepayment meter to be *prima facie* evidence; the removal of fittings where gas supply is discontinued; the provision of anti-fluctuators in connection with gas engines; the provision of a valve where high pressure air is used; bulk supplies to and from local authorities, companies or persons beyond the limits of supply; the giving of a separate supply of gas for industrial purposes within the limits which the Corporation may be authorised to supply gas; the purchasing or taking on lease dwelling houses for employees, offices, show rooms, etc., and the inclusion of several sums due from a person in one summons or warrant.

4. To authorise the Corporation to borrow money for the purposes of the Order and the Gas Undertaking of the Corporation, and to charge the money so borrowed on the said Gas Undertaking and upon the District Fund and the General District Rate of the Borough of Ilkeston and the undertakings, estates, rates, rents, revenues and other property of the Corporation or any of such securities and to execute and grant and issue mortgages and other securities, to make provision for the formation

and application of sinking funds to provide for the sale of surplus lands and the application of money arising therefrom; and to provide that money borrowed under the powers of the Order shall not be reckoned within the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act 1875.

5. To vary or extinguish all rights or privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

6. To incorporate with the Order so far as applicable and except so far as varied thereby, and to amend, alter or repeal all or some of the provisions of the Ilkeston Corporation Act 1898, the Ilkeston Gas Order 1900 and any other Act or Order relating to the Corporation or their gas undertaking.

7. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, and the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, and the Acts amending those Acts respectively.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 18th day of July, 1925. Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) The specific grounds of objection, and
- (b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection shall be forwarded to the applicants for the Order or their Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

Copies of the draft special Order, together with a copy of an Ordnance Map on a scale of one inch to the mile showing the situation of the existing gasworks of the Corporation, and the boundaries of the proposed area of supply and of the area in which the Corporation are already authorised to supply gas, have been deposited for public inspection at the Corporation's office at the Town Hall, Ilkeston, and with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Derby at his office at Derby.

Printed copies of the draft Special Order may be obtained at the offices of the under-mentioned Town Clerk and Parliamentary Agents at the price of one shilling per copy.

A copy of the application and of all documents submitted to the Board of Trade therewith relating to the matters referred to in paragraph 2 of this notice may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the under-mentioned Town Clerk during office hours.
