NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE A SPECIAL ORDER TO BE CITED AS THE TRADE BOARDS (BUTTON MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1925.

The Minister of Labour hereby gives notice that with a view to altering the description of the button-making trade specified in the Appendix to his Special Order dated August 6th, 1924, he intends pursuant to the powers conferred upon him by Section I and Section II of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order altering the description of the button-making trade contained in the Appendix to his Special Order dated August 6th, 1924, in the manner shown in the Draft Special Order contained in the Appendix hereto.

Further copies of the Draft Special Order may be obtained on application in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Labour, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Objections to the Draft Special Order must be sent to the Minister of Labour at the above address within forty-two days from the twenty-third day of June, 1925, that is to say, on or before 3rd August, 1925. Every objection must be in writing and must state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection, and
- (b) the omissions additions or modifications asked for.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

DRAFT SPECIAL ORDER MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, ALTERING THE DESCRIPTION OF THE BUTTON MAKING TRADE CONTAINED IN THE APPENDIX TO THE MINISTER'S SPECIAL ORDER DATED AUGUST 6TH, 1924.

Whereas it is provided by Sub-section 4 of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that, if the Minister of Labour is of the opinion that it is desirable to alter or amend the description of any of the trades specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act, 1909, he may make a Special Order altering or amending the said Schedule accordingly;

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is desirable to alter the description of the trade specified in the Appendix to his Special Order dated August 6th, 1924;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour in pursuance of the powers in him vested as before cited does hereby make a Special Order that from and after the day of the following provisions shall have effect, that is to say:—

Article I.—The description of the trade specified in the said Appendix to the said Special Order dated August 6th, 1924, shall be altered by the substitution therefor of the description set out in the Appendix to this Order.

Article II.—This Order may be cited as the TRADE BOARDS (BUTTON MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1925.
