SCHEDULE.

All that area of land comprising portions of the counties of Wilts, Berks, Surrey, Sussex, Southampton and Dorset lying within a line drawn as follows, including, where any road is named as a boundary, the said road:—

On the North, from the point at Semington in the County of Wilts where the road from Melksham to Westbury crosses the main road from Trowbridge to Devizes, eastwards along the last named road to Devizes; and thence north eastwards along the road from Devizes to Avebury to the point at Beckhampton where that road crosses the main road from Calne to Marlborough; thence eastwards along the last named road through Marlborough and Hungerford to Reading:

On the East, from the point at Reading where the main road from Reading to Wokingham branches off from the main road to London, along the former road to Wokingham, and thence along the main road to Farnham, through Sandhurst and Frimley; thence along the main road from Farnham to Chichester:

On the South, from Chichester along the main road to Fareham, and thence along the main road through Wickham and Botley to Romsey; thence southwards along the main road towards Ringwood to the point near Ower where that road is joined by the main road from Salisbury; thence along the main road towards Salisbury to Landford; thence along a portion of the northern boundary of the New Forest (but not including any portion of the area of the said Forest) to the point about one and three quarter miles east of Fordingbridge where the said boundary crosses the main road from Southampton to Fordingbridge; thence along the said main road through Fordingbridge and Cranborne to Wimborne Minster; thence along the main road north of the River Stour to Blandford Forum:

On the West, from Blandford Forum along the main road to Trowbridge through Shaftesbury, Warminster and Westbury to the point south of Trowbridge where the said road meets the main road from Melksham; thence along the last named road to Semington:

Which area, surrounded on all sides by a red line is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.

WHEREAS by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, Commissioners are constituted styled the University of Cambridge Commissioners.

And whereas it is further enacted in the Act aforesaid that "the powers of the Commis-

sioners shall continue in force until the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-five and no longer: Provided that His Majesty in Council may, on the application of the Commissioners, continue their powers for such further period as His Majesty may think fit, but not beyond the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-seven":

And whereas the University of Cambridge Commissioners have made application to His Majesty in Council for the continuation of their powers under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered that the powers of the University of Cambridge Commissioners shall continue until the end of the year nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations with respect to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships for the purpose of the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of Government ships, apply to Government ships registered in accordance with such Regulations as if they were registered in manner provided by those Acts:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards any Government ships in the service of the Government of the Colony of the Falkland Islands (hereinafter referred to as the Colonial Government):—

1. An application for registry of a Government ship in the service of the Colonial Government shall be made in writing under the hand of the Colonial Secretary of the Falkland Islands or other officer of the Colonial Government nominated by the Governor, or by one of the Crown Agents for the Colonies. Such application shall contain the following particulars:—

(i) A statement of the name and description of the ship.

(ii) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built, or, if the ship was foreign built and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name.
