TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's

- (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
- (b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

- 3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 27th July, 1925, to Saturday, the 1st August, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 27th July, 1925, to Saturday, the 1st August, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

TRADE & BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX AND TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated respectively 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO FIX AND TO VARY Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of Male and Female Workers as shown in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS (IN CLUDING HOME-WORKERS) AND PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS (OTHER THAN HOME-WORKERS) EMPLOYED ON HAND BRAIDING OF TRAWL, SEINE OR OTHER NETS FROM HARD FIBRES, NAMELY MANILA, SISAL, MAGUEY FIBRE OR NEW ZEALAND HEMP OR A MIXTURE THEREOF.

SECTION II.

CONDITIONS.

The General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Section I. of this Part are on the basis that the needles are filled by or at the expense of the worker. In cases where workers have their needles filled for them at the expense of the employer the above General Minimum Piece-Rates are subject to a reduction of 7½ per cent.

SECTION III.

The General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Section I. of this Part are for Single Twines. The General Minimum Piece-Rates for Double Twines are three-quarters of the General Minimum Piece-Rates for Single Twines.

SECUTION IV

In cases where a Net Section contains meshes of more than one size the rate payable will be based on the weighted average mesh size, arrived at as follows, that is to say, by multiplying the number of rows of each separate mesh size by the size of the mesh, adding the product, and dividing this added product by the total number of rows in the Net Section. For example: The belly of a Trawl Net made up from Twine of 125 yards per lb. and consisting of 75 rows of 3-inch mesh, 50 rows of 4-inch mesh, 25 rows of 5-inch mesh: Calculation of weighted average mesh:—

The Net Section must be paid for as though the mesh was $3\frac{3}{3}$ inches throughout, viz., under Column 6.

SECTION V.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

Female workers (other than Home-workers) employed on work to which the Proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in this Part are applicable shall be entitled to receive, in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to the Appropriate General Minimum Piece-rate, a sum of $1\frac{11}{16}d$., $3\frac{2}{8}d$., or $6\frac{3}{4}d$., according as the overtime rate which would have been payable under the provisions of the Notice R. (37) if the worker had been employed on time work, were time-and-a-quarter, time-and-a-half, or double time respectively.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR FEMALE HOME-WORKERS.

The Trade Board propose to vary the General Minimum Piece-Rates for Female Homeworkers set out in Section I. of Part I. of the Schedule to their Notice R. (38) by limiting he application of such rates to nets made from fibres other than Hard Fibres, namely from three other than Manila, Sisal, Maguey Fibre, or New Zealand Hemp, or a mixture thereof. fi

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES, PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR TWINE MAKERS.

SECTION I.

The Trade Board propose to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male and Female Workers employed as Twine Makers set out in their Notice R. (32), by providing that the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for "Twine Makers, Double, in Walk" shall be those set out in Section I. (B) of Part I., and for "Twine Makers, Single, in walk" shall be those set out in Section I. (C) of Part I., of the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice R. (32).

SECTION II.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the minimum rates of wages proposed in Section I. of this Part, in the manner specified in Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R. (32), shall apply in substitution for such proposed minimum rates of wages in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Notice R. (32) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

PROPOSED ADDITIONAL GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR HAND MACHINE BRAIDING.

SECTION I.

The Trade Board propose to Fix, as respects Workers other than Homeworkers, General Minimum Piece-Rates for Hand-Machine Braiding additional to those fixed and set out in their Notice R. (33) (which apply only to Netting of 55 yards) by providing that the General Minimum Piece-Rates in respect of Netting of a size greater or less than 55 yards shall be the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Trade Board's Notice R. (33), subject to a proportionate increase or reduction, according as the size of the Netting is more or less than 55 yards.

SECTION II.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the minimum rates of wages proposed in Section I. of this Part, in the manner specified in Part II. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R. (40), shall apply in substitution for such proposed minimum rates of wages, in respect of all time worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Notice R. (40) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART V.

GENERAL.

The Proposed Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Workers of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Rope, Twine and Net Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919 (as amended by the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920) and as set out in Section II. of Part V. of the Trade Board's Notice R. (32), dated 22nd February, 1923.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Fix and to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 17th July, 1925. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

- 1. The limits of age are 16 and 17. FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 30).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of certain Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1925 (No. 29) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of July, 1925

Short Title

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 30), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

- 3. In the case of a whole-time worker who is employed on harvest work on a farm during the whole period of harvest on that farm, the period of such harvest shall be deemed to be 24 working days (not necessarily consecutive working days) and, in the event of the harvest being completed in less than 24 days, the rate of wages

applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the number of days worked had consisted of 24 days.

- 5. In the event of any inconsistency between the provisions of this and any other Order the provisions of this Order shall apply.

(ii) Where a male worker has worked a part only of the harvest period the rate of wages payable to such worker shall be not less than the minimum rate of wages applicable to a worker of his age under the above mentioned Orders for the time being in force and such worker shall in addition be entitled (as part of his wages) and in lieu of the overtime rates of wages otherwise applicable on the completion of the harvest to a proportion of such sum as may be applicable to the worker under the Table as set out above, according to the time spent by the worker in employment on the corn harvest.

2. Farms of 60 acres of corn and under.

In the case of all male workers employed on harvest work on farms comprising 60 acres of corn or less, on the premises on which the worker is employed the rate of wages per hour payable to such worker shall be such sum as

In the case of male workers partly employed on harvest work and partly on other employment in agriculture the sum payable for all overtime employment in respect of hours for which overtime rates of wages would otherwise be payable under the Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 13th January, 1925, shall be wages at a rate of not less than the sums mentioned in Clause 1 of this Order for such employment in agriculture as the employer may require the worker to perform for a period of 24 days (excluding Sundays) the commencement of such period to be mutually agreed between employer and worker—

Provided that during the said period of 24 days excluding Sundays not less than 80 hours of overtime shall have been worked by the worker if so required by the employer.

And provided also that such overtime employment shall not exceed 20 hours per week (excluding employment on Sundays).

In the case of a worker who declines to work 20 hours of overtime per week if so required by his employer (excluding employment on Sundays) on harvest or other employment in agriculture on the premises on which he is employed such overtime shall be payable at the overtime rate applicable to his case as set out in the Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 13th day of January, 1925.

3. (1) In the case of a worker employed wholly or mainly as a horseman, stockman or shepherd and who is entitled by reason of the circumstances of his employment to the full harvest bonus or a due proportion thereof under Clause 1 or 2 such sum shall include the sum of 6s. in respect of employment in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding down and mucking out stock or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals as provided by Clause 3 of the Order of the Agricul-

tural Wages Board dated 13th January, 1925, when such duties (except on a Sunday) are performed within the hours of employ-

ment specified in Clause 1 above.

- (2) In the case of a worker employed wholly or mainly as a horseman, stockman or shepherd who in addition to working the full harvest hours specified above performs the above mentioned duties in connection with stock outside those harvest hours such worker shall be entitled to the sum of 6s. in repect of such employment as provided by Clause 3 of the Agricultural Wages Board Order dated 18th January, 1925.
- 4. Where a worker is paid wages in accordance with the terms of a Permit of Exemption the rate of wages for his work on the corn harvest on the premises on which the worker is amployed shall be such proportion of the rate of wages as specified in Clause 1 of this Order as corresponds with the proportion of the wages payable to an ordinary worker which is payable to that worker in accordance with the terms of his Permit,
- 5. All employment on harvest work on a Sunday shall be paid for in the case of any worker at the rates applicable to such worker for Sunday work under the Orders of the Board for the time being in force.
- 6. Any existing rate or Order in so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded in respect of any premises for the harvest period on those premises.
- 7. This Order shall apply to the corn harvest in 1925 only.
