

he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulation 2, as may be necessary to maintain after 12 o'clock noon an augmented service at intervals of not less than 8 minutes; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate

from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH JULY, 1925.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 30).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Contraction of certain Infected Area.*

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1925 (No. 29) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of July, 1925

*Short Title*

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 30), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Cambridge and Isle of Ely have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum rates of wages and overtime rates of wages for all workers employed in agriculture for time work during the corn harvest in 1925 in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 20th day of July, 1925.

SCHEDULE.

1. The rates of wages for the employment of male and female workers on harvest work during the period of the corn harvest in 1925 shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—

2. Any employment of male workers in excess of 64 hours in any one week (excluding Sunday) shall be paid for at not less than the above rates.

3. In the case of a whole-time worker who is employed on harvest work on a farm during the whole period of harvest on that farm, the period of such harvest shall be deemed to be 24 working days (not necessarily consecutive working days) and, in the event of the harvest being completed in less than 24 days, the rate of wages
