TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 14th August, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 17th August, 1925, to Saturday, the 22nd August, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000. and must specify the date on

which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 17th August, 1925, to Saturday, the 22nd August, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The provisions of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 (*Restrictions on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) as applied by the Order of the Minister (No. 3977) dated the 18th June, 1925, to the Area described in the Schedule to the latter Order, shall not apply to the movement of sheep of the Kerry Hill Breed to or from the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order, provided that the following conditions are complied with.

Special Conditions Applicable to Sheep Moved to the Sales referred to in this Order.

2. All sheep exposed at the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) The sheep shall be accompanied by a Certificate of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the sheep are moved to the effect:—

(i) that the sheep have within 56 days before the movement been dipped twice

under the supervision of an Inspector of the Local Authority, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved for Sheep Scab by the Minister or purporting to be so approved.

(ii) that the sheep, since the second dipping, have been kept isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground or saleyard.

(b) Such Certificate shall on the arrival of the sheep at the said special Sales, be delivered up to the Inspector of the Ministry.

(c) The sheep may be moved from the said special Sales only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, authorising movement of the sheep to any destination in Great Britain and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be specified in the licence.

(d) All sheep exposed at the said special Sales shall be kept separate from all other sheep during movement to and from the sales and whilst being exposed thereat.

shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

TUBERCULOSIS ORDER OF 1925
(No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The Tuberculosis Order of 1925 shall be read and have effect as if the following Article were therein inserted after Article 5:—

Procedure in respect of slaughter of animals where the carcasses are proposed to be used for human consumption.

5A. (i) Where a Local Authority propose to slaughter an animal under this Order and to dispose of its carcase or any part thereof for human consumption a copy of the notice of intended slaughter served under the preceding Article together with a statement of the address of the premises on which and the time at which the animal is intended to be slaughtered shall be sent by the local authority with

all practicable speed to the officer of the Sanitary Authority (or in Scotland of the Public Health Local Authority) to whom notices of intention to slaughter are required to be sent by any Regulations made by the Minister of Health (or in Scotland by the Scottish Board of Health) under the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and in any such case the carcase of the animal or any part thereof shall not be removed for human consumption from the premises on which the slaughter takes place except with permission in writing of the Medical Officer of Health or other competent officer of the Authority having under the Acts relating to public health or any local Act power to inspect and examine meat intended for human consumption: Provided that where a Meat Inspector has been appointed by a Public Health Local Authority in Scotland in terms of the foresaid Regulations the permission to be obtained under this Article shall be the permission of the Meat Inspector.

(ii) If any carcase is removed in contravention of this Article the person removing or causing the removal of the carcase shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
