TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 21st August, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £35,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £3,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 24th August, 1925, to Saturday, the 29th August, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

SPITSBERGEN.

NOTICE TO CLAIMANTS OF LAND.

The Norwegian Government have issued a notification drawing the attention of claimants to the following provisions in the Annex to the Treaty of 9th February, 1920, regulating the status of Spitsbergen and conferring the sovereignty on Norway:—

(1) Within three months from the coming into force of the present Treaty, notification of all claims to land which had been made to any Government before the signature of the

present Treaty must be sent by the Government of the Claimant to a Commissioner charged to examine such claims. The Commissioner will be a judge or jurisconsult of Danish nationality possessing the necessary qualifications for the task, and shall be nominated by the Danish Government.

(2) The notification must include a precise delimitation of the land claimed and be accompanied by a map on a scale of not less than 1/1,000,000 on which the land claimed is clearly marked.

(3) The notification must be accompanied by the deposit of a sum of one penny for each acre (40 ares) of land claimed to defray the expenses of the examination of the claims.

As it is anticipated that the above Treaty will come into force in the near future, and as any claims must be notified to the Danish Commissioner *within three months from its coming into force*, claimants are advised to send particulars of their claims, as required by Article 6 of the Treaty and the Annex thereto, to the Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Foreign Office, London, S.W. 1, as early as possible.

(b) All employment on a Sunday.

(c) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in summer.

(d) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in winter.

But so that, in the case of workers employed wholly or mainly as Horsemen, Stockmen or Shepherds, no employment in connection with the duties of feeding, cleaning, milking, bedding down and mucking out stock, or other similar duties in connection with the immediate care of animals shall rank as overtime employment provided that the number of hours worked on such duties shall be 8 hours per week should the farmer so require and shall not exceed 10 hours in any week.

For the purpose of this Order, employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March, and terminating on the last Sunday in October, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

This Order shall come into operation on the 31st August, 1925.
