DEEDS OF ARRANGEMENT.

Notice is hereby given that the Lord Chancellor with the concurrence of the Treasury have made the following Order as to Fees under sections 13 and 15 of the Deeds of Arrangement Act, 1914.

The Lord Chancellor and the Treasury, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in them respectively by section 22 of the Administration of Justice Act, 1925,(a) and sections 2 and 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act, 1879,(b) and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make and concur in the following Order:—

1. The fees set out in the second column of the Schedule to this Order shall be taken by

the Board of Trade in respect of the proceedings relating to Deeds of Arrangement set out in the first column of that Schedule.

2.—(i) The fees to be taken in accordance with the provisions of this Order shall be taken by stamps.

(ii) The documents to be stamped shall be those prescribed in the third column of the Schedule to this Order.

(iii) The stamps to be used shall be Bankruptcy Fee stamps, and may be either impressed or adhesive.

(iv) Any adhesive stamp shall be cancelled by the proper officer of the Board of Trade in such manner as may be from time to time prescribed by the Commissioners of Inland Revenue.

(v) The places where documents may be stamped with impressed stamps shall be the Inland Revenue stamping offices at Somerset House and at the Royal Courts of Justice.

3. In this Order the expression "the Act" means the Deeds of Arrangement Act, 1914, (c) as amended by the Administration of Justice Act, 1925, (a) and the expression "the Rules" means the Deeds of Arrangement Rules, 1925. (d)

4. The Orders dated the 28th day of December, 1914, (e) and the 11th day of May, 1920, (f) respectively, and made by the Lord Chancellor with the concurrence of the Treasury as to Fees under sections 13 and 15 of the Act, shall be annulled.

5. This Order may be cited as the Deeds of Arrangement (Board of Trade) Fees Order, 1925, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1925.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF SHORTHAND TYPIST IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered, prior to the first day of the examination and within three years of that day, one full year's approved service in British Government Departments. She must have served for the year either as established Typist or as temporary Shorthand Typist or partly in each capacity.

Candidates appointed by the Civil Service Commissioners as Typists in the Trinity House, the Office of the Crown Agents for the

Colonies, and the Metropolitan Police Office, on the result of a general competition for situations as Typist in the Civil Service, will be regarded as established Typists for the purpose of these regulations although not serving under the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. Candidates must be not less than 19 years of age on the first day of the examination; and candidates who have only temporary service or service in the Trinity House, Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, or the Metropolitan Police Office, or service of two or more of these kinds, must not be more than 40 years of age on the first day of the examination.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) that they are unmarried or widows;
- (b) that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of a person serving in a civil situation to which she was admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

- (1) English Composition.
- (2) Précis Writing.
- (3) Shorthand.

5. No candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Shorthand and in the aggregate number of marks obtained in the examination as a whole.

6. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of the candidates will, where possible, be respected.

7. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. A fee of 12s. 6d. will be required from every candidate attending the examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that a Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations in Belfast, Bristol, Edinburgh, London and Manchester, commencing on the 1st December, 1925.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 8th October, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

FORFARSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf hereby orders as follows :—

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1) The Local Authorities of the Districts specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the Districts, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly con-

firmed shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animal Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (powers of police);
Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the FORFAR-SHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1925.

(g) To regulate the price of Gas and to make provision with regard to (*inter alia*) the recovery of charges for Gas, the laying of pipes in private streets, stand-by supplies, the discontinuance and cutting-off of supplies, the use of anti-fluctuators with gas engines, the period of error in defective meters, the construction and placing of pipes, etc., the provision of a valve where high pressure air is used, and the supply and purchase of Gas in bulk.
