WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1906.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified the painting of vehicles with lead paints to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations to apply to all factories and workshops, or parts thereof, in which any such painting is carried on.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London, S.W. 1.

Objections to the draft Regulations by or on behalf of any persons affected by the Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State, Home Office, London, S.W. 1, within 30 days from the date of this notice. Every such objection must be in writing and must state

(a) the draft Regulations or portions of draft Regulations objected to; (b) the specific grounds of objection; and (c) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an order authorising the employment on two day shifts of women of 18 and male young persons of 16 years of age and over in buffing and machining motor parts in the Bayonet Department at the works of Messrs. Sanderson Brothers and Newbould Limited, Newhall Road, Sheffield, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks, and that suitable cloakroom and mess-room accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an order authorising the employment of two day shifts of male young persons of 16 years of age and over in milling, drilling and finishing copper blades for turbines, at the Turbinia Works, of the Parsons Marine Steam Turbine Company Limited, Wallsend-on-Tyne, on the conditions that subject to any arrangements that may be made to meet the convenience of individual workers a young person shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; and that a young person shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause him injury.
