SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part I of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920:—

An Area comprising:—
 The administrative counties of Kent and East Sussex.
 And also comprising:—
 The county boroughs of Brighton, Canterbury, Eastbourne and Hastings.
 (24th July, 1925.)

An Area comprising such parts of the administrative counties of Chester, Derby, Lancaster, and the West Riding of Yorkshire,

and such parts of the county boroughs of Halifax, Huddersfield and Sheffield as lie within the following boundary, namely:—
 Commencing at a point in the boundary between the counties of Derby and Chester where the River Goyt intersects the road from Macclesfield to Buxton at Moss House, proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the northern side of that road by Goyt's Moss Farm and Clough House to St. John's Road, Buxton, thence along the northern side of that road to the junction of Station Road with The Quadrant, thence along the northern sides of
