His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Gordon Lees, of Newcastle, New South Wales.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

' A youth named Jack Canning was attacked by a man-eating shark when bathing from the beach at Newcastle, New South Wales, on the 12th March, 1925. A rush was made to launch the surf boat but before this could be done Gordon Lees, employed by the City Council to patrol the beach and assist surf bathers in difficulties, put on a belt with a life line attached, and swam out alone to Canning's assistance. Canning had been attacked three times by the shark and was terribly injured, and Lees reached him just as he appeared to abandon all further effort to save himself. The shark was then only a few yards away from rescuer and rescued. Lees lifted Canning up when he was almost submerged and the two were then immediately hauled in to the beach by the life line.

The rescued man, unfortunately, died from his injuries shortly afterwards.

Section 90 (Agreements with local authorities for common use of fire appliances), and

Part IX (Sky Signs):-

Section 91 (Sky Signs); provided that this section shall not apply to any sky sign erected or to be erected upon any part of the Estate of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board.

Sections 39 to 42 (inclusive) comprised in Part III.

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 19, 23, 25, 27, 35, 38 and 75 of the Act of 1907 to the conditions specified in the Order.

SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.
