TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 9th October, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt

Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000 but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th October, 1925, to Saturday, the 17th October, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000,

and will, as indicated in the Notice of 2nd October, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th October, 1925, to Saturday, the 17th October, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th April, 1926, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated respectively 31st October, 1918, and 1st August 1922, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, in Great Britain, for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice P. (10) dated 5th April, 1924. The proposed variations are as set out below:—

(1) *Male Workers employed on Machine Tackling.*

The Trade Board propose to substitute for the General Minimum Time Rates for Machine Tacklers specified in Section I (a) and (b) of Part I of the Trade Board's Notice P. (10) dated 5th April, 1924, and for the General Minimum Time Rates for male learners of 15 years of age and over specified in Section IV of Part I of the before-mentioned Notice P. (10) in so far as they are employed on any operation of machine tackling, the following General Minimum Time Rates for Machine Tacklers (as defined below) and certain other male workers employed on any operation of machine tackling, viz.:—

Provided that in the case of workers under 21 years of age the minimum rates set out above shall apply to such workers when employed in machine tackling notwithstanding that they may not be engaged in the whole of the operations specified in the definition of a Machine Tackler as set out below.

* The proposed weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

(2) *Definition of Machine Tackler.*

For the purposes of this Notice a Machine Tackler is a male person who is engaged in setting, adjusting and keeping running paper bag machines, and in superintending and carrying through all other operations that can be performed in whole or in part by such machines.

(3) *Definition of Male Learner.*

The Trade Board propose to amend the definition of a Male Learner set out in Section II of Part V of the above-mentioned Notice P. (10) in the following manner:—

“A Male Learner is a male worker under 21 years of age other than a worker of any of the classes in respect of whom minimum rates are proposed under (1) above and other than a paper bag cutter as specified in Section II of Part I of the before-mentioned Notice P. (10), who while employed is engaged during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning any branch or process of the trade.”

(4) *Proposed Overtime Rates.*

The Trade Board propose to substitute Overtime Rates calculated on the minimum rates as varied in accordance with the Proposals set out in this Notice in the manner specified in Part IV. of the before-mentioned Notice P. (10) for the Overtime Rates at present applicable to male workers whose minimum rates are proposed to be varied.

(5) *Proposed Consequential Variations.*

The Trade Board propose to Vary the Minimum Rates for Male Learners set out in Section IV of Part I of the Schedule to the before-mentioned Notice P. (10) and the Overtime Rates based thereon in so far as and in such manner as may be necessary to provide that they shall not apply to any workers to whom the proposed minimum rates for workers employed on operations of Machine Tackling set out in (1) above apply and that they shall apply to all male learners to whom the proposed minimum rates for workers employed on operations of Machine Tackling do not apply.

NOTE.—This Notice, which also incorporates certain further Proposals relating to the minimum rates for Machine Tacklers takes the place of the Trade Board's Notice of Proposal P. (11) dated 22nd April, 1925, which is withdrawn.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 2nd day of October, 1925. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Paper Bag Trade Board (Great Britain), 1 Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that the Objection should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

The animals on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
