ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 19TH OCTOBER, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. An Inspector of the Ministry, with a view to prevent the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease may, by notice, require the removal to a convenient and isolated place approved by him of any animal now at the British Dairy Farmers' Association Show at the Royal Agricultural Hall, Islington, in the county of London, which has been brought from the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected area declared by Order of the Minister dated 19th October, 1925, and entitled the Cheshire and District Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area Order of 1925, and of any other animal at the Show which, in the opinion of the Minister, has been exposed to the risk of infection of Foot-and-Mouth Disease. The notice shall require any such animal to be detained and isolated at the said place of isolation until the notice is withdrawn by a further notice of an Inspector of the Ministry.

2. A notice under this Article shall be served upon the owner of the animal, and a copy shall be sent to the Ministry and to the Secretary of the Show.

3. The removal, detention and isolation of any animal under a notice served under this Order shall be carried out at the expense of the owner of the animal.

4. If any animal is not removed, detained, or isolated as required by notice served under this Order, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall be guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

CHESHIRE AND YORKSHIRE DIS-
TRICT FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE
INFECTED AREA ORDER OF 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease
Infected Area.*

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall take immediate effect and may be cited as the CHESHIRE AND YORKSHIRE DISTRICT FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE INFECTED AREA ORDER OF 1925.

Revocation.

3. The Cheshire and District Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area Order of 1925 is hereby revoked.
