# UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, and the King's College, London (Transfer), Act, 1908, that the following amendments (a) of No. 55 of the Statutes of the University, (b) of No. 111 of the Statutes of the said University, (c) a New Statute (No. 113b) of the said University, and (d) a New Statute (No. 23(b)) for the Constitution and Management of University of London, King's College, have been made by the Senate of the University of London, and that copies of the amended Statutes and new Statutes can be obtained on application to "The Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W. 7."

#### UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

Amendment of Nos. 55 and 111 of the Statutes of the University and making of a new Statute (No. 113b) of the University and a new Statute (No. 23(b)) for the Constitution and Management of University of London King's College.

(a) No. 55 of the Statutes of the University as amended.

[Note.—The amendment consists in the addition of the words "and the Chairman of Convocation."]

55. The election by Convocation of the Chancellor and the Chairman of Convocation and the election by the graduates of persons to be appointed by Convocation members of the Senate shall be by voting papers to be delivered by voters personally or to be sent by post to the Clerk of Convocation.

(b) No. 111 of the Statutes of the University as amended.

[Note.—The amendment consists in the substitution in the first sentence of the words "passed the examination or examinations for "for the word "taken."]

111. Except as hereinafter provided no degree other than an honorary or ad eundem degree shall be conferred on any student who. has not satisfied the Examiners in the prescribed examination or examinations and fulfilled all other prescribed conditions and no Student shall be allowed to become a candidate for any higher degree who shall not have previously passed the examination or examinations for the lower degree or degrees of the same class. Provided that Students whose qualifications are considered suitable may be admitted by the Senate as Candidates for the Degrees of Doctor of Laws and Doctor of Science without their having previously obtained the Degrees of Master of Laws and Master of Science respectively, and Students who have obtained the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy in subjects within the purview of the Faculty of Arts may be admitted by the Senate as Candidates for the Degree of Doctor

of Literature without their having previously obtained the Degree of Master of Arts. Provided also that during the War begun in 1914 and after its termination for such period as the Senate shall see fit the Senate shall have power to waive the conditions of this Statute in such a way as will prevent as far as possible any Student of the University (whether an honorary (War) degree has been conferred on him by the University or not) from being placed at a disadvantage through going on active service or undertaking other approved duties in connection with national defence and in particular the Senate may accept such test as the Senate may consider adequate in lieu of the prescribed examinations.

- (c) New Statute (No. 113b) of the Statutes of the University.
- 113b. Provided also that persons on whom the Senate have conferred the title of Professor or Reader in the University may after a period of not less than two years from the date of such conferment be admitted as Internal Students as candidates for any of the higher degrees (except in Medicine and Surgery) without their having previously taken any lower degree and without their having pursued a course of study approved by the University.
  - (d) New Statute (No. 23(b)) for the Constitution and Management of University of London King's College.
- 23(b). The Librarian of King's College shall be ex officio a member of the Professorial Board of King's College.

The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 2nd October, 1925, rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. Provided always that if at any time lands, tithes or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the Benefice in (L.S.)

substitution for such yearly sum or stipend or for such part thereof our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine. Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule and is in lieu of and in substitution for the temporary grant hitherto payable out of our Common Fund of the amount stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule which will cease to be payable as from the date stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule. Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall only operate as one single Grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

# CLITHEROE CORPORATION GAS (EXTENSION).

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.)

NOTICE is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Clitheroe (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation"), whose address is the Town Hall, Clitheroe, intend to apply forthwith to the Board of Trade under and in pursuance of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):

- 1. To extend the limits within which the Corporation are authorised to supply gas by the addition thereto of the townships and parishes of Chatburn and Downham in the rural district of Clitheroe in the County of Lancaster and to authorise the Corporation within the said townships and parishes to exercise all or any of the powers, rights, privileges and authorities with reference to the supply and distribution of gas and the opening and breaking up of streets, roads and ways which are exercisable by them within their existing limits of supply.
- 2. To empower the Corporation to purchase the business of the Bold Venture Lime Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") as manufacturers and suppliers of gas in the townships and parishes of Chatburn and Downham aforesaid and the goodwill of such business and the gas mains service pipes meters and other similar appliances matters and things belonging to the Company in connection with such business and the benefit of all existing contracts and engagements for the supply of gas made or entered into by the Company and to maintain carry on and continue the said business.
- 3. To authorize the Corporation to purchase, make, use, work up, store, utilise and distribute residual products and materials arising from, resulting in, or producible from the manufacture of gas.
- 4. To enable the Corporation to purchase additional lands by agreement for and in con-

nection with their gas undertaking, to confer powers upon them with regard to retention and disposal of lands and to make provision as to the proceeds of sale of surplus lands.

5. To make further provision with regard to the supply of gas by the Corporation and in

particular to provide for:-

(a) the repeal of any enactments or other provisions requiring the Corporation to supply gas of any particular illuminating or calorific power and the substitution therefor of power to charge for thermal units supplied in the form of gas; and

(b) the modification of the statutory or other provisions affecting the charges which may be made by the Corporation by substituting for the maximum price per 1,000 cubic feet now authorised with an addition to meet increases in the cost and charges of and incidental to the production and supply of gas by the Corporation since 30th June 1914 a maximum price per therm (i.e., 100,000 British thermal units).

The maximum price now authorised in respect of the supply of gas by the Corporation is five shillings per 1,000 cubic feet and the maximum price which the Corporation will ask the Board of Trade to substitute for that price in accordance with paragraph (b) above throughout the existing limits of supply of the Corporation is sixteen pence per therm. It is also proposed that additional charges per therm should be authorised in respect of gas supplied through a prepayment meter varying according to whether such meters are with or without fittings.

6. To provide that the Corporation may charge for gas supplied by them at different rates in their extended limits of supply to the rates charged in their existing limits of supply.

7. To confer upon the Corporation further powers in regard to their gas undertaking, including the breaking up of public and private streets for the purpose of laying down and maintaining pipes and other works for the supply of gas and for conducting residual products and other things and for ancillary purposes; exempting the Corporation from the obligation to supply gas when the capacity of the distribution works is insufficient; the making of provision for the supply of gas to premises having a supply of electricity, gas, etc. from other sources; the making of further provision with regard to the method of cutting off supplies of gas; empowering the Corporation to enter premises and remove fittings, etc.; the recovery of expenses of reconnecting discontinued supply; specifying the nature, size and material of pipes and fittings laid and fixed on consumers' premises; further powers to supply and repair gas fittings and other apparatus and appliances and to provide all materials and work necessary or proper in that behalf; to provide that fittings, apparatus and appliances let on hire shall remain the property of the Corporation and be removable by them; power to prescribe situation of meters in new buildings and buildings not previously supplied with gas and the right to inspect the same; empowering the Corporation to compel repairs of piping or appliances, etc. in dangerous condition; exempting fittings on hire from distress; requiring the use of anti-fluctuators for gas engines; the provision of valves

where high-pressure air is used; the prescribing of the period of error in defective meters; the giving of notice by gas consumers before removal and of discontinuance of supply; empowering the Corporation to refuse to supply gas to persons in debt for other premises; empowering the Corporation to purchase or lease and to erect, fit up, maintain and let houses, cottages, offices, showrooms and other buildings; to contract with any local authority, company or person for the supply and purchase of gas in bulk; to provide for the payment of interest on money deposited as security for gas meters, etc.; to acquire and use patents; and the recovery of demands and penalties.

8. To authorise the Corporation to borrow further money for and in connection with their gas undertaking and in connection with the purchase of the business, goodwill and property of the Company and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the revenue of the gas undertaking and the district fund and general district that either jointly or separately and to provide that moneys borrowed under the Order shall not be reckoned in the limit of borrowing prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875.

9. To prescribe the mode of raising money and repayment thereof, audit of accounts, sinking fund, application of revenue and other financial provisions.

10. To authorise the Corporation to pay the costs, charges and expenses of the Order out of the revenue of the gas undertaking or out of moneys to be borrowed for the purpose.

11. To vary or extinguish all rights, powers and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer other rights

and privileges.

12. To incorporate in the Order and apply with or without amendment all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, and any Acts amending the same, and to repeal, alter and extend with or without amendment all or some of the provisions of the Clitheroe Gas Act, 1861, the Clitheroe Corporation Act, 1878, the Borough of Clitheroe Order, 1895, the Clitheroe Order, 1896, the Clitheroe Order, 1900, and any other Act or Order relating to the gas undertaking of the Corporation.
