Regulations upon the occasion of the dismantling of the Wembley Exhibition so that during the period from the 1st day of November, 1925, to the 1st day of December, 1925, both dates inclusive, nothing in those Regulations shall prevent any person who was maintaining a regular service in accordance with the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon Approved Route No. 6 from using on any week-day during the abovementioned period in any of the streets or parts thereof declared to be "restricted streets" by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925, and forming part of that route, such number of particles of the number which has omnibuses in excess of the number which he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulation 2 as may be necessary to maintain a regular service of omnibuses on that route at intervals of not less than 6 minutes if such excess is due solely to the use of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining a regular service on that route; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST OCTOBER, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fjsheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals on being landed shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

LEICESTERSHIRE AND NORTHAMP-TONSHIRE FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREA) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Extension of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Leicestershire and Northamptonshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Area) Order of 1925, as amended by any subsequent Order shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were
