- (2) To empower the Corporation to charge for water supplied within the said Parish of Telscombe for domestic purposes a rate equal to two shillings in the pound on the rateable value of the premises supplied and for water supplied by meter at the rate of two shillings and sixpence per one thousand gallons; or such other rate or rates as may from time to time be agreed between the Corporation and the Rural District Council of Newhaven;
- (3) To empower the Rural District Council of Newhaven to give any guarantee for securing payment to the Corporation of such sum or sums of money as may be agreed by and between the Council and the Corporation with respect to the providing and laying down of any main or pipe or works for the supply of water within any part of the said Parish of Telscombe;
- (4) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable:

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX.

Notice is hereby given that on the tenth day of November, 1925, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of a certain highway in the County of Middlesex.

The Order, which will come into force on the first day of December, 1925, and will remain in force for a period of five years, is to the

following effect:-

No person shall drive or cause to be driven on the Highway specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said road") any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver.

Nothing in the Order shall prevent the driving on the said road of:—

(1) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said road or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;

(2) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said road;

(3) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstructon of the said road, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity.
