ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH DECEMBER, 1925.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1925 (No. 10).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Substitution of certain Infected Areas.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1925 (No. 9) shall be read and have effect as if the Areas Nos. 1 and 12 described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted respectively for the Infected Areas Nos. 1 and 12 described in the First Schedule to that Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED
