

Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Pendlebury, and in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Weaste, from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Brindle Heath), for a distance of  $27\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chaseley Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Chaseley Road for a distance of  $12\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the gateway at the entrance of the house and premises known as Claremont, where Chaseley Road diverges eastward, and extending thence first westward to the middle of the said gateway and then first northward, then westward and then north-westward along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the said house and premises for a distance in all of  $6\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the northern end of such wall or fence upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Brindle Heath, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Pendlebury, and extending thence north-westward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of  $8\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary crosses the middle of Dronfield Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Dronfield Road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bolton Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Bolton Road (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Brindle Heath, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Pendlebury) for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Acresfield Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Acresfield Road for a distance of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway running between the houses and premises known as Numbers 10 and 12, Acresfield Road, and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading along the backs of the houses on the northern side of Acresfield Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway (thereby crossing Elleray Road, Duffield Road, Alresford Road and Sumner Road) for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to the point where such roadway reaches the eastern side of Glenfyne Road, and extending thence first south-westward to and then north-westward along the middle of Glenfyne Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Penelope Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Penelope Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Claremont Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Pendlebury, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Hope, and extending thence first northward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Claremont Road, the middle of Farmer's Lane, the middle of Park Lane, crossing the northern corner of the Claremont Park Recreation Ground and following the walls or fences forming the north-western and part of the south-western boundaries of the

said Recreation Ground) for a distance of  $40\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary diverges south-westward from the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the said Recreation Ground, and extending thence south-eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the said Recreation Ground on the northern side of the proposed new road to be called Winchester Road, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then south-westward along the middle of the course of the said proposed new road for a distance of  $15\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Light Oaks Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Light Oaks Road for a distance of  $22\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Claremont Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Hope, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Pendlebury, and extending thence first south-westward and then south-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Claremont Road) for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Eccles Old Road where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint James, Hope, the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Pendlebury, and the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Weaste, all meet, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas one of the Patrons and also the Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Pendlebury, have offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the said New Parish of Saint James, Hope, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of the drafts of the said Scheme as aforesaid:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.
