ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES. (Dated 22nd December, 1925.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:---

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes is hereby allowed, subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulation Applicable to the Animals on Landing.

4. The animals, on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twentyeight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARA TION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1625 (No. 17).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Extension of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1925 (No. 15) shall be read and have effect as if the parishes of Broad Town and Clyffe Pypard in the county of Wilts were included in and formed part of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area (No. 7) described in the First Schedule to that Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1925 (No. 17) and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.
