WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of December, 1925, in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“ And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of March, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to approve the formation of the Special Reserve of Engineer Officers, Royal Navy, and to sanction Regulations for the Reserve :

“ And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1925, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that Officers of the Special Reserve who fail to carry out the training prescribed by the aforesaid Regulations shall be liable to removal from the Reserve and to forfeiture of retaining fee :

“ And whereas we consider that the provisions in the Regulations established by Your Majesty's aforesaid Orders in Council requiring Officers of the Special Reserve to undergo periodical training and permitting them to perform voluntary training are no longer necessary and that payment of retaining fees should be discontinued :

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to cancel Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1925, and to approve of the Schedule to Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of March, 1920, being amended as follows, these alterations to take effect from the 1st day of January, 1926 :—

“ Paragraph 4. To be cancelled.

“ Paragraph 5. The words ‘ during training or ’ and ‘ while undergoing training or ’ to be omitted.

“ Paragraph 9 (3rd section). To be cancelled.

“ Paragraph 11. To be cancelled.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (1) of Section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare:—

(a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to Income Tax payable under the law in force in any foreign State; and

(b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that foreign State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the foreign State;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British Income Tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Income Tax payable in the foreign State, have the effect of law in the foreign State:

And whereas the agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government and the Finnish Government:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to the Income Tax payable under the law in force in Finland; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said agreement between His Majesty's Government and the Finnish Government have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in Finland.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (Finland) Declaration, 1925."

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT AND THE FINNISH GOVERNMENT.

His Britannic Majesty's Government and the Finnish Government, being desirous of concluding an agreement for the reciprocal exemption from income tax in certain cases of profits accruing from the business of shipping, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

His Britannic Majesty's Government agree to take the necessary steps under section 18

of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, for exempting from income tax (including super-tax) chargeable in Great Britain and Northern Ireland for the year of assessment 1923-24 commencing on the 6th day of April, 1923, and for every subsequent year of assessment, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Finland or by a company managing and controlling such business in Finland.

Article 2.

The Finnish Government hereby declare that, under the laws of Finland regarding income and property tax, tax was not, before the 1st day of January, 1925, chargeable in respect of profits which accrued from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Great Britain or Northern Ireland or by a company managing and controlling such business in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The Finnish Government undertake, in pursuance of the powers reserved to them by article 3 of the Income and Property Taxation Law of 5th December, 1924, to grant exemption from income tax in Finland as from the 1st day of January, 1925, in respect of any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Great Britain or Northern Ireland or by a company managing and controlling such business in Great Britain or Northern Ireland.

Article 4.

The expression "the business of shipping" means the business carried on by an owner of ships, and for the purposes of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

Article 5.

This Agreement shall cease to have effect if and so soon as either the relief to be granted under Article 1 hereof in respect of income tax in Great Britain and Northern Ireland, or the relief to be granted under Article 3 hereof in respect of income tax in Finland, ceases to have legal operation.

In witness whereof the Undersigned, duly authorised to that effect, have signed this Agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 10th day of December, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mary, Liscard, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, is a Cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas a piece of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District, and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

“ And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of

erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chester as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Luke, now Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint Thomas, Liscard.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Henry Luke, Bishop of the said Diocese of Chester, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint Thomas, Liscard, being:—

“ All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mary, Liscard, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester, which is bounded upon the north by the New Parish of Emmanuel, New Brighton, upon the west by the Parish of Wallasey, upon the south partly by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Poulton, and partly by the New Parish of Saint John, Egremont, otherwise Liscard, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Egremont, otherwise Liscard, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, at a point in the middle of Liscard Road opposite to the middle of the footpath leading into Greenheys Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Liscard Road for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Liscard Village, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of

Liscard Village for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Rake Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Rake Lane for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway leading to the New Brighton Football and Cricket Ground upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, from the said New Parish of Emmanuel, New Brighton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the New Parish of Saint Mary, Liscard, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of December, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva and the Benefice of Chediston (being part of the United Benefice of Halesworth with Chediston) all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva and the said Benefice of Chediston duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and

Ipswich and therein recommended the severance from the said United Benefice of Halesworth with Chediston of the said Benefice of Chediston and the union of the Benefice of Chediston so severed to the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva and Chediston, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva and Halesworth with Chediston are now full, the Reverend John Alfred Burness being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva and the Reverend Henry Christian Newbery being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Halesworth with Chediston:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Halesworth with Chediston, that is to say the said Benefice of Chediston, shall be severed from the said Benefice of Halesworth with Chediston and that the Benefice of Chediston so severed and the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Linstead with Chediston,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That with the consents of the said John Alfred Burness and the said Henry Christian Newbery (testified by their signing this Scheme) upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Alfred Burness if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice of Linstead with Chediston shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Linstead Magna with Linstead Parva.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect a portion of the endowments of the said Bene-

rice of Halesworth with Chediston shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Linstead with Chediston namely all those Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £13 14s. 6d. arising within the parish of Chediston and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Halesworth with Chediston and all capital sums of money and stocks (if any) representing or being the produce of any sale redemption or other conversion of any part or parts of the said Tithe Rent Charges.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, Walsall, situate within the Parish of Rushall, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

" Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Rushall, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Walsall, and of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Peter, Walsall, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parishes:

" And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Rushall, of the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Walsall, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mark, Walsall, situate as aforesaid:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, as such Bishop, with the consents of Lieutenant Colonel Henry Mellish, C.B., of Hodsock Priory, Worksop, in the County of Nottingham, of Agnes Mellish and Evelyn Frances Mellish, both of Hodsock Priory aforesaid, Spinsters, of Andrew Archibald Buchanan, of Folkestone, in the County of Kent, Esquire, and of Sir Eric Alexander Buchanan, Baronet, of Craighend Castle, Stirling, Scotland, acting by the said Henry Mellish pursuant to an Order under the Act of the 53rd year of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 5, and amending Acts, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Rushall, and with consent of the Reverend Basil Frederic William Relton, Clerk in Holy Orders and Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Walsall, in the said County and Diocese, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall, as well as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Walsall, (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those con-

iguous portions of the said Parish of Rushall, of the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Walsall, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Mark, Walsall, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Walsall.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of St. Mark, Walsall, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Rushall, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Walsall, and of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Peter, Walsall, all in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the bridge which carries Littleton Street West across the middle of the line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Walsall, from the said Parish of Rushall, crosses the middle of such line of railway, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the said boundary for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the loop line connecting the Wolverhampton and Walsall line and the Walsall and Water Orton line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the last mentioned line of railway for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Coal Pool Lane across such line of railway, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Coal Pool Lane for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mill Lane, and extending thence first south eastward, then southward and then again south eastward along the middle of Mill Lane for a distance of $16\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point south east of the bridge which carries Mill Lane across the South Staffordshire and the Walsall and Water Orton lines of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway where such lane turns south westward, and extending thence south eastward and in a straight line for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the north western end of the wall or fence forming the north eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 142, Borneo Street, and extending thence south eastward along the said wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Borneo Street, and

extending thence north eastward along the middle of Borneo Street for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Westbourne Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Westbourne Road for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Westbourne Street, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Westbourne Street for a distance of $8\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Butts Road and the road called Butts, and extending thence first south westward and then southward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Butts Street and Upper Forster Street, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Upper Forster Street (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Rushall from the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall) for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Littleton Street East upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall, from the New Parish of Saint Paul, Walsall, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Littleton Street East) for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Littleton Street East with Hatherton Street and Littleton Street West, where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall, the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Walsall, and the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Walsall, all meet, and extending thence westward along the middle of Littleton Street West for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such road across the said line of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Lord Bishop of Salisbury, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, The Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, do hereby repre-

sent to Your Grace that at the date of the Order in Council hereinafter recited there were in the County of Wilts and my Diocese of Salisbury the Rectory or Benefice of Bishopstone and also the Rectory or Benefice of Stratford Tony.

" That by an Order of His Most Excellent Majesty in Council dated the 25th day of June, 1925, and published in the London Gazette on the 30th June, 1925, made under the provisions of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, it was ordered that the said Benefice of Bishopstone and the said Benefice of Stratford Tony should be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony' but the parishes of the said Benefices should continue distinct in all respects and further it was ordered that upon the said union taking effect all the Tithe rent charges, Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the United Benefice or which might thereafter belong thereto should be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the Benefices of Marlborough Saint Peter and Saint Paul with Saint Mary the Virgin and Edington both in the said Diocese of Salisbury with certain annual sums or yearly rent charges as therein mentioned.

" That adjoining the said Parish of Stratford Tony on the east is the Vicarage or United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington consisting of the ecclesiastical parishes of Coombe Bissett and of Homington and that adjoining the United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington on the east thereof is the Vicarage or Benefice of Britford all being in the County of Wilts and Diocese of Salisbury.

" That the ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony is shown on the plan annexed hereto and is thereon verged green, yellow, red, blue and brown of which the portions verged yellow, red, blue and brown are detached and are entirely within other neighbouring parishes of which they form part for civil purposes.

" That is to say :—

" (a) The outlying portion of the ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony coloured yellow is situate wholly within the civil parish of Coombe Bissett.

" (b) The outlying portions of the ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony coloured red and blue are situate wholly within the civil parish of Homington.

" (c) The outlying portion of the ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony coloured brown is situate wholly within the civil parish of Britford.

" That so much of the outlying portion of the ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony coloured blue and situate in the civil parish of Homington as is etched in red is glebe land formerly belonging to the Benefice of Stratford Tony but now to the United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony and enjoyed by the Incumbent of that United Benefice for the time being and contains forty-three acres two roods or thereabouts.

" That according to the last census the population of the said ecclesiastical parish of

Bishopstone was five hundred and twenty-six and of the said ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony excluding the outlying portions thereof was eighty-six and the populations of the ecclesiastical parishes of Coombe Bissett and Homington including the outlying portions of Stratford Tony contained therein respectively were respectively four hundred and twenty-five and one hundred and eighty-six. That the population of the said ecclesiastical parish of Britford including the detached portion of Stratford Tony coloured brown was five hundred and seventeen.

" That there is a parish church in each of the said parishes.

" That the parish church of Bishopstone contains accommodation for two hundred and forty persons. That that at Stratford Tony contains accommodation for eighty-four persons. That that at Coombe Bissett contains accommodation for two hundred and fifty persons. That that at Homington contains accommodation for two hundred persons and that that at Britford contains accommodation for two hundred and forty persons.

" That the net annual value of the said United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony is eleven hundred pounds or thereabouts of which the gross sum of forty pounds or thereabouts is derived from the said glebe land situate in the parish of Homington. That the net annual value of the said United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington is three hundred and eighty-seven pounds or thereabouts and that the net annual value of the said Benefice of Britford is two hundred and eighty-nine pounds or thereabouts.

" That there is in the parish, of Bishopstone a house of residence and there is also a house of residence in the United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington situate at Coombe Bissett and that there is a house of residence in the said parish of Britford.

" That the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony belongs to the Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery and to Corpus Christi College Oxford the Earl of Pembroke and Montgomery having two turns in three and that the Reverend Francis Raikes is the present Incumbent thereof. That the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington belongs to myself in right of my See and the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Sarum alternately and that the Reverend Charles Wood is the present Incumbent thereof and that the Patronage of the said Benefice of Britford belongs to the Dean and Chapter aforesaid and that the Reverend Canon Thomas John Woodall is the present Incumbent thereof.

" That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and also of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same Reign, Chapter 49, it will be advantageous to the interests of religion :—

" 1. To separate the said outlying portions of the said ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony and to annex them for ecclesiastical purposes to the parishes in which they are situate, that is to say, the portion shown on the plan and coloured yellow to the parish of Coombe Bissett, the portions coloured red

and blue on the said plan to the parish of Homington and the portion coloured brown on the said plan to the parish of Britford.

" 2. To transfer the glebe land etched with red on the said plan from the United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony to the United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington within which it is situate.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament I have drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the proposed alterations may be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. Which Scheme together with the Consents thereto of the before mentioned Patrons and Incumbents I do submit to Your Grace to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" It is proposed to separate from the Ecclesiastical parish of Stratford Tony the outlying portions the boundaries of which are shown on the plan hereto annexed and thereon verged yellow, red, blue and brown respectively and annex the same to other ecclesiastical parishes as follows, that is to say:—

(a) The portion verged yellow to the ecclesiastical parish of Coombe Bissett.

(b) The portions verged red and blue to the ecclesiastical parish of Homington.

(c) The portion verged brown to the ecclesiastical parish of Britford.

" That the Incumbent of the ecclesiastical parish to which each such portion is annexed as aforesaid shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within each such portion.

" That the inhabitants of each such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the parish Church of the ecclesiastical parish to which it shall be annexed and shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Stratford Tony. Except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the parish Church of Stratford Tony and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

" That the inhabitants of each such portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the parish Church of the ecclesiastical parish to which such portion is annexed as they might have had in the parish Church of Stratford Tony.

" That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from each such portion so to be separated from Stratford Tony shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the ecclesiastical parish to which each such portion shall henceforth be annexed.

" That the Glebe land of the United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony situate in the parish of Homington and shown and etched red on the plan hereto annexed and containing forty-three acres two roods or thereabouts shall be transferred from the said United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony and annexed to the said United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington and shall be enjoyed henceforth by the Incumbent of such United Benefice as part of the emoluments of such United Benefice but no part of the charges created by the said recited Order in Council in favour of the Benefices of Marlborough Saint Peter and Saint Paul with Saint Mary and Edington shall by reason of such transfer of Glebe become payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Coombe Bissett with Homington but the whole of such charges shall continue to be payable out of the revenues of the said United Benefice of Bishopstone with Stratford Tony.

" That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of any of the said Benefices."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS AS OFFICER OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE (MALE) UNDER THE BOARD OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age are 19 and 21. For an examination beginning in one of the first six months of any year the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the first of March in that year; for an examination beginning in one of the last six months of the year the governing date is the first of September. A candidate who attained the age of 19 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 21 on that date would not be admitted. In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made :—

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have served.

(ii) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects, and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects. Provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception to the condition as to the father may be made in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

3. Candidates must be unmarried and without family and must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the examination and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the

appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

The test in Viva Voce, subject 7, will be held at a later date than the examination in the remaining subjects. Of the candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in Subjects 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be summoned to the Viva Voce. The final list of candidates eligible for appointment will be made up by uniting the results of the two parts of the examination. Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. A fee of £3 will be required from every candidate attending an examination.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 23RD DECEMBER, 1925.)

MARKETS, SALES AND LAIRS ORDER OF 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Paving of Markets, Saleyards, etc., used for Animals.

1.—(1) No market, fair or sale of animals shall be held in or upon any market-place, fair-ground, highway, saleyard or other premises on any day until after the expiration of twenty-four days from the date on which the premises or any parts thereof were previously so used, unless the premises or a part thereof sufficient

to accommodate the number of animals usually exposed at such market, fair or sale, are so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material impervious to water, as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing, and are at all times maintained in that condition.

(2) On every occasion of a market, fair or sale of animals held on premises to which this Article applies, the animals shall stand or be penned as far as practicable on the paved accommodation required to be provided under this Order.

(3) This Article shall not be deemed to prohibit the holding of any fair under lawful authority on two or more consecutive days.

Paving of Lairs adjoining Markets and Saleyards, and Regulation of Lairs by Licence.

2.—(1) No lair adjoining premises on which or on any part of which a market, fair or sale of animals is held at intervals of twenty-four days or less shall be used for the reception or temporary detention of animals before or after their exposure for sale on such adjoining premises, unless

(a) the lair is so paved with cement, concrete, asphalt, or other hard material, impervious to water as to permit of the same being effectually cleansed by washing and is at all times maintained in that condition; and

(b) the use of the lair for that purpose has been authorised by a licence of the Local Authority which shall not be granted unless the Local Authority are satisfied after enquiry that the provisions of this Article with regard to the paving of the lair have been complied with.

(2) A licence granted under this Article may be cancelled at any time by a Notice served upon the occupier of the lair (or upon the person to whom the licence was granted) by an officer of the Ministry or of the Local Authority if the surface of the lair is not, in the opinion of the Minister or of the Local Authority, as the case may be, maintained in the condition required by this Article.

(3) This Article shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Markets, Saleyards and Lairs.

3.—(1) Any market-place, fairground, highway, saleyard, or other premises in or upon which markets, fairs or sales of animals are habitually held and any lair adjoining such premises which is used for the reception or temporary detention of animals before or after their exposure for sale, shall, as soon as practicable after being used for any such purpose on any day and before being again so used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:—

(i) The premises or lair or the parts thereof used for the purposes of the market, fair or sale shall be thoroughly saturated with an approved disinfectant. The said premises or lair or parts thereof shall then be thoroughly scraped as far as practicable, and swept, and then effectually cleansed by washing; after such cleansing the said premises

or lair or parts thereof shall be thoroughly washed with an approved disinfectant:— Provided that in the case of any such premises or lair which are incapable of being cleansed and disinfected in the aforesaid manner, such cleansing and disinfection shall be carried out as far as may be practicable.

(ii) All pens, hurdles, and other fittings used in or in connection with the market, fair, sale, or lair, shall as soon as practicable after being used for such purpose, and before being again so used, be thoroughly saturated with an approved disinfectant, and shall then be thoroughly cleansed by scraping and washing. After such cleansing the pens, hurdles and other fittings so used shall be thoroughly washed with an approved disinfectant.

(iii) The scrapings and sweepings of the premises, lair, pens, hurdles and other fittings, and all dung, saw-dust, litter and other matter removed therefrom, shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with animals, or be effectually destroyed by fire.

(2) The cleansing and disinfection required by this Article shall, in the case of a market-place, fairground, saleyard or other premises or lair in the occupation of any person, and any pens, hurdles and other fittings used in or in connection with such premises or lair, be carried out by and at the expense of that person, and in any other case be carried out by the Local Authority of the District.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1) If a market, fair or sale of animals is held in contravention of this Order, the person holding the same shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the purchaser thereat of any animal, knowing the market, fair or sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place or thing in respect of which anything is so done or omitted (as the case may be) shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“ Animals ” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“ Lair ” means a building, erection, pen, yard, or other enclosure used for the reception or temporary detention of animals before or after their exposure for sale, but does not include a grass enclosure.

“ An approved disinfectant ” means a disinfectant approved for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1925.

“ Local Authority ” means the Local Authority of the District for the purposes of the Act of 1894.

“ Minister ” and “ Ministry ” mean the Minister and Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“ Person ” includes persons or any body corporate or unincorporate.

“ The Act of 1894 ” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Revocation.

7. The Markets and Sales Order of 1910 and all licences issued under that Order or continued in operation by that Order, are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

8. This Order (except Article 2) shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

9. This Order may be cited as the MARKETS, SALES AND LAIRS ORDER OF 1925.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS (RECORDS) ORDER OF 1925.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Records of Movements of Stock.

1.—(1) Subject to the exceptions hereinafter provided:—Any person who moves or permits to be moved an animal to or from any premises

shall keep a record in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, in which shall be entered all the prescribed particulars of the movement of the animal.

Provided that it shall not be necessary to enter in the record any movement hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

(i) Movement of an animal between different parts of the premises.

(ii) Movement of an animal from or to any premises for feeding, watering or milking purposes, if the animal is moved back to the premises from which it was so moved within twenty-four hours; and

(iii) Movement of a pig in respect of which particulars are entered in the register required to be kept by pig dealers in accordance with Article 4 of the Swine Fever Order of 1911, if a statement appears in the Record kept under this Order to the effect that such other register is kept.

(2) For the purposes of this Order contiguous premises which are in the same occupation shall be regarded as one premises.

(3) The provisions of this Order as to keeping the prescribed record shall not apply (a) to any person moving or permitting the movement of an animal to or from any lair authorised by the Local Authority for use for the temporary detention of imported animals under and in accordance with the provisions of the Importation of Animals Act, 1922 (Session 2), or any Order of the Minister thereunder, or for the detention of fat swine imported under and in accordance with the provisions of the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923, or any Order amending the same; or to or from an imported animals wharf or approved landing place; (b) to any person whilst acting as a market authority or as an auctioneer at any market, sale yard, fair ground or other premises, or to a person responsible for holding any exhibition of animals; or (c) to any Railway Company moving or permitting the movement of any animal to or from a railway station for transit.

Provisions as to Form of Record.

2.—(1) Every entry in a record shall be made in ink or indelible pencil within thirty-six hours after the movement of the animal required by this Order to be entered therein.

(2) Every record required by this Order to be kept by any person shall be retained by him for a period of twelve months from the date thereof, and shall be produced by him for inspection at all reasonable times on demand to any Inspector of the Ministry or of a Local Authority, and the Inspector shall be entitled to make copies of any entries therein.

(3) A Local Authority may supply forms of record for the purposes of this Order to any person in the District of the Local Authority.

Revocation.

3. Article 12 (1) (f) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1920, as substituted by the Sheep Scab (Amendment) Order of 1923, is hereby revoked, and any Regulation made thereunder requiring the keeping of registers by sheep dealers shall cease to have effect.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5. If any person required by this Order to keep a record fails to keep the same or omits from a record any of the particulars required by this Order to be entered therein, or makes any false entry therein or fails to produce a record for inspection on demand under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

6. In this Order:—

“The Minister” and “The Ministry” mean the Minister and the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animal” means cattle, sheep, goat or pig.

“Person” includes a body corporate or unincorporate.

“Premises” includes land with or without buildings and also any market, saleyard, fair ground, place of exhibition or lair.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS (RECORDS) ORDER OF 1925.

2. To authorise the Council on the lands hereinafter described or some part or parts thereof to erect maintain alter extend improve and renew works for the manufacture, storage, conversion, utilisation and distribution of gas and residual products resulting from such manufacture, and to make and store gas and to make, use, store, utilise, purchase, sell and distribute all such residual products and materials as aforesaid.

The lands hereinbefore referred to are:—

1. All that piece of land with the buildings thereon containing 332 square yards or thereabouts belonging or reputed to belong to the Council, and bounded on the north east by the Gasworks property, on the north west by land belonging or reputed to belong to the United Dairies Limited and on the south west and south east by land belonging or reputed to belong to Lord Brownlow.

2. All that piece or parcel of land containing 980 square yards or thereabouts belonging or reputed to belong to Lord Brownlow, and bounded on the north west by land belonging or reputed to belong to the Council, on the north east by the towing path of the Shropshire Union Canal, and on the south west and south east by land belonging or reputed to belong to the said Lord Brownlow;

the said lands being shown and coloured respectively blue and red on the 25 inch Ordnance Map deposited as hereinafter mentioned.

3. To authorise the Council to purchase additional lands by agreement for and in connection with their gas undertaking.

4. To enable the Council to purchase or take on lease or annual tenancy, erect and maintain dwelling-houses for employees, and offices and showrooms for the purpose of the gas undertaking.

5. To make provision for the charges for gas supplied by means of prepayment meters, and for gas used in heating and cooking appliances supplied by the Council and to authorise the Council to charge for the hire of such prepayment or other meters and appliances.

6. To enable the Council to specify the size and material of pipes and fittings, to relieve the Council from the obligation to supply gas in any case where the capacity of their distribution works are insufficient, to enable the Council to compel the repair of pipes or appliances in a dangerous condition, to lay pipes in private streets and for ancillary purposes, to require a valve where high pressure air is used in connection with the supply of gas by the Council, to authorise a special charge for stand-by supplies, to prescribe the mode of cutting off supplies of gas, to enable the Council to supply and fix gas fittings, cooking heating and lighting appliances, to enable the Council to enter premises and remove fittings where a supply of gas is discontinued and to charge for re-connecting discontinued supplies of gas, to require consumers to give notice before removing from premises supplied with gas, to require anti-fluctuators to be used in connection with gas engines, to enable the Council to refuse to supply persons in debt for other premises to provide for allowance to be made in the case of defective meters and to enable the Council to sell or purchase a supply of gas in bulk, to provide a reserve fund and other purposes.

7. To empower the Council to borrow and re-borrow further money for the purposes of the Order and of their gas undertaking and to prescribe the periods for and mode of the repayment of money so borrowed and to charge the moneys so borrowed on the revenue of the gas undertaking and the General District Fund and General District Rate of the District and to provide that moneys borrowed or to be borrowed for the purposes of the gas undertaking shall not be reckoned for the purpose of limiting the borrowing powers of the Council as prescribed by the Public Health Act, 1875.

8. To vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with the objects of the Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

9. To incorporate in the Order and apply with or without amendment all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871 and the Acts amending the same, and to amend or repeal or extend so far as may be necessary for the purposes aforesaid all or any of the provisions of the Ellesmere Gas Order 1885 and of any other Act or Order relating to the Gas undertaking of the Council.

THAMES CONSERVANCY.

- (a) For the Regulation and Licensing of Motor Launches on the River Thames; and
- (b) For Repealing Bye-law 57. of the Thames Bye-laws 1898 (Trespassers on tow-paths), and for substituting therefor a Bye-law for Prohibiting the Use of Towpaths by Vehicles, etc.

(A) BYE-LAWS for the Regulation and Licensing of Motor Launches on the River Thames and for other purposes made by the Conservators of the River Thames in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Acts 1894 to 1924 and of every other authority them hereunto in anywise enabling.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Thames Motor Launch Bye-laws 192" and shall come into operation on the expiration of fourteen days after the date of the confirmation thereof by the Minister of Transport.

2. The Thames Motor Launch Bye-laws 1914 are hereby repealed.

3. These Bye-laws shall be applicable to:—

(a) So much of the Rivers Thames and Isis as is between the east side of the Town Bridge at Cricklade in the County of Wilts and an imaginary straight line drawn from high-water mark on the bank of the River Thames at the boundary line between the Parishes of Teddington and Twickenham in the County of Middlesex to high-water mark on the Surrey bank of the river immediately opposite the last hereinbefore mentioned point; and

(b) so much of the River Kennet as is between the River Thames and an imaginary straight line drawn from a point on the north bank of the River Kennet seventy yards eastward of the east side of the High Bridge at Reading in the County of Berks to a point on the south bank of the River Kennet immediately opposite the last hereinbefore mentioned point:

and all locks cuts and works within the said portions of rivers Provided that no dock lock canal or cut existing at the passing of the Thames Conservancy Act 1894 and constructed under the authority of Parliament and belonging to any body corporate established under such authority and no bridge over the Thames or the River Kennet belonging to or vested in any county council municipal authority railway company or any company body or person other than the Conservators shall be deemed to form part of the Thames.

4. In these Bye-laws the words and expressions hereinafter mentioned have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction viz.:

"The Thames" or "the River" means and includes those parts of the Rivers Thames and Isis and Kennet respectively to which these Bye-laws are made applicable by the provisions of Bye-law 3;

"Motor Launch" means any vessel propelled by an internal combustion engine using fuel as hereinafter defined not being used solely as a tug or for the carriage of goods and not being certified by the Board of Trade as a passenger steamer to carry two hundred or more passengers;

"Fuel" means and includes any inflammable hydrocarbon (either alone or in admixture with any other liquid) which is capable of providing the necessary motive power for a launch and also any other liquid capable as aforesaid which when tested in the manner set forth in Schedule 1 of the Petroleum Act 1879 gives off an inflammable vapour at a temperature of less than 73 degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer;

"Master" when used in relation to any motor launch means any person whether the owner master or other person lawfully or wrongfully having or taking the command charge or management of the motor launch for the time being;

"Officer of the Conservators" means and person employed by the Conservators and authorised by writing under the hand of the Secretary to carry out the provisions of these Bye-laws;

"The Acts of 1894 to 1924" means the Thames Conservancy Acts 1894 to 1924.

Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided words and expressions to which a special meaning is assigned by the Acts of 1894 to 1924 have respectively the same meaning in these Bye-laws as they have in the said Acts.

5. Every motor launch navigated on the Thames shall be constructed and equipped in accordance with such reasonable specification in that behalf as may from time to time be prescribed by the Conservators Provided that if any question shall arise as to the reasonableness of any such specification or part thereof such question may (on application in writing being made jointly to the Conservators by not less than six persons who shall at the time of making such application be registered owners of motor launches used on the Thames) be determined by an arbitrator appointed by the Minister of Transport.

6.—(1) Upon application for that purpose made to the Conservators either

(a) by the owner of a motor launch registered under the Acts of 1894 to 1924 or

(b) by the owner of any other motor launch who shall at the time of making such application pay to the Conservators such reasonable sum in respect of their expenses as the Conservators may demand (not exceeding the sum of £3)

and provided that in any or either of such cases reasonable facilities are afforded to the Conservators for inspecting the launch the Conservators shall inspect or cause to be inspected such launch in order to ascertain whether it complies with the provisions of these Bye-laws as to construction and equipment.

Provided that in the case of a launch which at the time of such application being made is not registered but thereafter and prior to the 31st day of December then next is registered under the Acts of 1894 to 1924 there shall be deducted from the charge leviable by the Conservators in respect of such registration the sum (if any) paid to the Conservators at the time of such application in respect of their expenses as hereinbefore provided.

(2) Every person applying to the Conservators for the inspection of a motor launch shall do so in writing addressed to the Conservators at their head offices for the time being and shall specify the name of the launch the name and address of the owner thereof and the place where the launch can be inspected.

(3) On the occasion of the said inspection being made the owner of the motor launch if required so to do by an officer of the Conservators shall cause the whole installation on the launch to be in working order and the fuel tank to be filled with fuel.

(4) If after being inspected as aforesaid a motor launch be found and certified by the officer of the Conservators making the inspection to comply with the provisions of these Bye-laws as to construction and equipment

they shall grant to the owner of the launch a licence in writing under the hand of the Secretary containing the name and address of the owner of the launch and such other particulars as the Conservators think fit. Provided that nothing herein contained shall prejudice or affect the provisions of the Acts of 1894 to 1924 relating to the registration of motor launches and the payment of the charges for the time being leviable by the Conservators in respect of such registration.

(5) The Conservators shall also when granting a licence under this Bye-law provide a plate which shall be made in accordance with a pattern approved by and shall remain the property of the Conservators and the master of the launch in respect of which the plate is issued shall place and keep such plate in a conspicuous position upon the said launch and shall not transfer such plate to any other vessel.

(6) The owner of every motor launch in respect of which a licence under this Bye-law has been granted and is for the time being in force shall upon being required so to do by notice in writing under the hand of the Secretary from time to time give to any officer of the Conservators reasonable facilities not exceeding four times in any one year for the inspection of the said launch by an officer of the Conservators in order that it may be ascertained whether the construction and equipment have been maintained in accordance with the provisions of these Bye-laws. And if upon any such further inspection a launch be found in the opinion of the officer of the Conservators making the inspection not to comply with the provisions of these Bye-laws as to construction and equipment it shall be lawful for the Conservators to cancel the said licence or to suspend the same until such time as the said launch be found and certified by the officer of the Conservators making the inspection to comply with the said provisions of these Bye-laws.

(7) No person shall navigate or assist in navigating a motor launch on the Thames unless a licence under these Bye-laws relating to the launch be then in force.

(8) Every licence under these Bye-laws shall if not previously cancelled expire on the 31st day of December next after the date thereof.

(9) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Bye-laws the Conservators may by writing under the hand of the Secretary and upon such terms and conditions as to them may seem fit issue to the owner of any motor launch a certificate exempting such launch from all or any of the provisions of these Bye-laws and any motor launch in respect of which such a certificate of exemption is for the time being in force may be navigated on the Thames without there being in force a licence under these Bye-laws relating thereto.

7.—(a) No fuel tank or can shall be opened or manipulated on any motor launch whilst the same is in or waiting to enter any lock on the Thames.

(b) Whilst any motor launch is waiting to enter any lock on the Thames the master of such launch shall take all reasonable care to prevent annoyance of other persons on the River by the escape of fumes from the exhaust.

(c) Immediately a motor launch enters a lock on the Thames the cock on the fuel feed-pipe shall be closed and the engine shall be stopped before the lock-gates are closed and the cock on the feed-pipe shall not be reopened nor shall the engine be restarted until the lock-gates are opened for the egress of the vessel or vessels then in the lock. Provided that the provisions of this sub-section shall not apply to a motor launch when no other vessel is passing through the lock at the same time as the motor launch or when the only other vessel or vessels passing through the lock at the same time as the motor launch is or are a vessel or vessels of the same type.

(d) No person on board any motor launch in any lock on the Thames shall ignite any match artificial lighter or other means of producing a flame.

8. On board every motor launch on the Thames all fuel carried in excess of that contained in the fuel tanks shall be carried only in cans of a pattern approved by the Railway Clearing House for conveyance of such fuel by the railway companies and of a capacity not exceeding two gallons and such cans (whether containing fuel or not) shall be stowed in a closed locker or other place approved by the Conservators not being in close proximity to the exhaust pipe and such locker or other place shall not be used for any purpose while any fuel can is therein other than the housing of the main fuel supply tank. Provided that this Bye-law shall not apply to the master of any motor launch when opening or manipulating such cans for the purpose of filling the fuel tank.

9. On board a motor launch on the Thames no fixed or portable cooking or other stove shall be placed or used in any cabin or enclosed space in which the engine is installed or fuel is stored.

10. The master of every motor launch on the River shall on demand show to any officer of the Conservators the plate in these Bye-laws mentioned and the failure (from any cause whatever other than the default of the Conservators or their Officers) to comply with such demand shall be prima facie evidence that the launch does not at the time of such demand comply with the provisions of these Bye-laws as to construction and equipment.

11. On the occurrence of any fire explosion or other similar accident on board any motor launch on the Thames the owner thereof shall within forty-eight hours thereafter send to the Conservators at their head office for the time being notice in writing giving all information in his power as to the locality as well as the day and hour of the accident the cause of the accident the part or parts (if any) that failed and the extent of the failure and the damage (if any) to persons or property and such other particulars (if any) as the Conservators may from time to time prescribe by previous notice duly published in accordance with the requirements of the Acts of 1894 to 1924. And provided the owner shall give to the Conservators all reasonable facilities for so doing the Conservators shall within three days after the receipt of such notice as aforesaid inspect or cause the launch to be inspected and for that purpose the launch shall be preserved and kept

by the owner as nearly as possible in the exact condition in which the launch was after the completion of the fire or other accident.

12. These Bye-laws shall not apply to a motor launch having no fuel on board and being towed.

13.—(1) Any person who shall offend against any of these Bye-laws shall for every offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty not exceeding the like amount which said penalties shall be recoverable enforced and applied according to the provisions of the Acts of 1894 to 1924.

(2) When any offence against these Bye-laws is committed in respect of any motor launch the person in charge and the owner of the launch shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished. Provided that the person in charge and the owner of the launch be not both punished in respect of the same offence.

SPECIFICATION FOR MOTOR LAUNCHES.

The following is a copy of the Specification which (in accordance with Bye-law 5 of the above-mentioned Bye-laws) the Conservators propose to prescribe as from the commencement of operation of the said Bye-laws:—

In this Specification and in any modification or modifications thereof the word "approved" means (unless otherwise stated) approved by the officer of the Conservators engaged in inspecting the launch: and other words and expressions have the same meanings assigned to them by the Thames Motor Launch Bye-laws 192 unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction.

(a) Carburetters so designed or constructed as to permit in any circumstances an overflow must be so fitted as in the event of an overflow to drain into a gauze-covered receptacle constructed of copper or brass capable of being emptied from time to time as may be necessary and of an approved form.

(b) Fuel tanks must be constructed of copper or an alloy of copper or of steel efficiently galvanised after making up or of other approved material and in any case with seams properly lapped and sweated or rivetted and such tanks must be free from leakage or liability to leakage and must be installed in such a position that ready access can be had to all connections.

(c) All fuel pipes must be of seamless drawn copper or other approved tubing and must be fitted with an approved form of joint and must be carried where they are least liable to become damaged and in all cases so fitted that ready access can be had to them and to all connections throughout their entire length. The main fuel pipe must be provided with suitable means for giving it the necessary elasticity and if bends or coils are fitted one must be placed close to the fuel tank and another close to the carburetter. A filter of an approved form may be fitted to the fuel pipe in an approved manner and in a visible position not being under the floor boards.

(d) One cock must be fitted to the fuel feed pipe where it leaves the tank and another near

the engine in an approved position. The first-mentioned cock must be either efficiently sweated or brazed into the tank or screwed into the tank with an approved washer in such a manner in every case as to make a spirit-tight joint. Provided that the officer of the Conservators inspecting the launch may exercise his discretion as to the necessity of a second cock to such pipe.

(e) The exhaust pipe and cylinder must be water-cooled. Provided that this shall not apply to an exhaust pipe taken into a funnel and where approved provision is made to prevent liability of ignition of inflammable vapour in any part of the launch.

(f) A silencer of an approved form must be fitted for the effective suppression of noise of exhaust and constructed of sufficient strength to prevent it being injured, by the occurrence of an explosion therein. No form of cut-out may be used.

(g) A spirit-tight tray or receptacle must be fitted the sides of which must be carried up as high as the propeller shaft will permit and fitted beneath the engine so as to prevent leakage of fuel and lubricating oil escaping into any other part of the launch.

(h) The ignition circuit throughout must be carefully insulated and the high-tension leads from coil to sparking plugs must be so installed in an approved manner and position as to prevent leakage of current or risk of breakage or damage by water. No form of hot-tube ignition may be used.

(i) Electric leads must be properly supported.

(j) A "spark gap" if used must be so enclosed as not to be capable of igniting inflammable vapour.

(k) An approved form of sparking plug must be used in which external sparking is as far as possible guarded against.

(l) If trembler coils are used the same must be placed in an approved position where an accumulation of inflammable vapour is not likely to occur.

(m) No auto-vac may be installed inside the engine case.

(n) For use in the event of fire a proportionate quantity of dry sand equal to one-half a cubic foot for every complete twelve feet in length of the hull of the motor launch together with a shovel or scoop must be carried in some readily accessible place. Provided that in the event of the Conservators approving in writing under the hand of their Secretary a form of chemical fire extinguisher such extinguisher may be carried in place of sand.

(B.) BYE-LAW for Repealing Bye-law 57 of the Thames Bye-laws, 1898, (Trespassers on Towpaths,) and for substituting therefor a Bye-law for Prohibiting the Use of Towpaths by Vehicles, etc.

The Conservators of the River Thames, in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1894 to 1924, do make the following Bye-law (that is to say):—

As from the day after this Bye-law is confirmed by the Minister of Transport, Bye-law

57 of the Thames Bye-laws, 1898 (Trespassers on towpaths), shall be repealed, and there shall be substituted therefor the following Bye-law:—

57. (1) No person shall ride drive place or leave any motor-car motor-bicycle cart carriage wagon bicycle or any other vehicle of any description or any horse over or upon any towpath of the Thames. Provided that:—

(a) this Bye-law shall not apply to any person riding or driving a horse used for the purpose of towing a vessel or to any person riding a horse or a bicycle when engaged in coaching a person or persons practising rowing for races;

(b) nothing in this Bye-law contained shall take away or diminish any existing right of any riparian owner in any towpath;

(c) this Bye-law shall not apply to any person who in the exercise of any private or public right in or over any towpath causes no obstruction or damage to such towpath so as to interfere with the use thereof for towing;

(d) this Bye-law shall not apply to the towpath which passes over the public walks and pleasure grounds at Reading in the County of Berks under the control of the Corporation of Reading.

And notice is hereby further given that the said Conservators of the River Thames will during the period of six weeks from the date of this Notice afford to all persons the opportunity of making in writing or otherwise objections to or representations respecting the above-mentioned proposed Bye-laws respectively. And will thereafter proceed to take all such objections and representations into consideration.

In the administrative county of Derby.

The parishes of Hope Woodlands, Derwent, Edale, Dore and Topley, and such parts of the parishes of Charlesworth, Hayfield, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Peak Forest, Castleton, Aston, Thornhill, Bamford, Outseats and Hathersage, as lie to the south, east and north of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the point of intersection of the boundaries of Cheshire, Derbyshire and Yorkshire, near Saltersbrook Bridge, then in a westerly direction along the county boundary of Cheshire and Derby to Crowden Station, thence along the road via Torside, and the Devils Elbow to the point where it reaches the boundary of the borough of Glossop, thence along the eastern boundary of the said boundary, to the point where it meets the main road to Hayfield, thence in a southerly direction along that road via the Grouse Inn to Hayfield, thence continuing in a generally south-easterly direction via Chinley Head and Bole Hill to Chapel-en-le-Frith, thence in an easterly direction along the road via Laneside to the Inn at Sparrowpit, thence along the road via Perryfoot, Oxlow House and the Winnats to Castleton, thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the main road via Hope to Hathersage, thence by the road under the Railway from Hathersage to Grindleford, west of Hathersage Station, to Grindleford Bridge, thence in a north-easterly direction along the road from Grindleford Bridge to Sheffield, to the point where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Topley, near Fox House Inn, thence in a northerly direction along the western boundaries of the parishes of Topley and

Dore, to the county boundary, thence in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction to the point of commencement.

In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary.

(11th January, 1926.)

In the administrative county of Radnor.

The parishes of Abbeycwmhir, Llanbadarn-Fynydd, Llanbister, Llananno, and Llandewi-Ystradenny, and such parts of the parishes of Beguildy, Heyop and Llangunllo which lie to the North of the London, Midland and Scottish Railway between the point where the railway crosses the road leading from Llangunllo to Llanbister, and the railway bridge at Knucklas.

Inverness.—(1) An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

(2) An Area in the county of Inverness comprising the islands known as Skye or Inner Hebrides.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising the island of Lewis, including the smaller island adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

NOTE.—The term "administrative county" used in the description of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs therein which are not county boroughs.
