

rice of Halesworth with Chediston shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Linstead with Chediston namely all those Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £13 14s. 6d. arising within the parish of Chediston and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Halesworth with Chediston and all capital sums of money and stocks (if any) representing or being the produce of any sale redemption or other conversion of any part or parts of the said Tithe Rent Charges.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of

the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 12th day of November, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, Walsall, situate within the Parish of Rushall, in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Rushall, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint George, Walsall, and of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Peter, Walsall, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Rushall, of the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Walsall, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mark, Walsall, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, as such Bishop, with the consents of Lieutenant Colonel Henry Mellish, C.B., of Hodsock Priory, Worksop, in the County of Nottingham, of Agnes Mellish and Evelyn Frances Mellish, both of Hodsock Priory aforesaid, Spinsters, of Andrew Archibald Buchanan, of Folkestone, in the County of Kent, Esquire, and of Sir Eric Alexander Buchanan, Baronet, of Craighend Castle, Stirling, Scotland, acting by the said Henry Mellish pursuant to an Order under the Act of the 53rd year of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 5, and amending Acts, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Rushall, and with consent of the Reverend Basil Frederic William Relton, Clerk in Holy Orders and Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Walsall, in the said County and Diocese, and, as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint George, Walsall, as well as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Walsall, (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those con-
