## SUPREME COURT OF JUDICATURE.

JURISDICTION OF DISTRICT PROBATE REGISTRARS  
WITH RESPECT TO GRANTS OF PROBATE AND  
ADMINISTRATION.

Whereas by section one hundred and fifty-eight of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act, 1925, it is provided that the foregoing provisions of Part VII of that Act shall have effect subject to certain temporary provisions set out in Part I of the Fifth Schedule to that Act:

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

**Authorisation of Sales at Reading.**

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Midlands and South of England (Regulation of Movement of Animals) Order of 1925, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," the holding of Sales by Messrs. John Thornton and Company at the Cattle Market, in the county borough of Reading, on the sixth and thirteenth days of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-six, is hereby authorised subject to the conditions hereinafter specified.

*Movement of Animals to the Sales.*

21.—(1) No animal shall be moved to either of the sales from any premises situated in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area to which the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 for the time being apply.

(2) No animal shall be moved to either of the sales unless it is accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by the Local Authority of the county borough of Reading or by some person authorised by that Local Authority to issue such licences.

(3) The licence shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to the Order referred to in Article 1 with the modification that condition 7 shall not apply in the case of animals being moved with a licence under this Article.

*Removal of Animals from Sales.*

3. Animals shall not be removed from either of the Sales unless they are accompanied by a movement licence in the form referred to in Article 2 granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the premises to which the animals are intended to be moved are situate, which licence the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant in respect of movement to any premises in their district not within two miles of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place. No such licence shall be granted for the movement of an animal otherwise than to premises situate either in the Regulated Area to which the provisions of the principal Order for the time being apply, or in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area to which the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 for the time being apply.

*Conditions of Sales.*

4. A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed at the sales authorised by this Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

*Contraction of certain Infected Area.*

2.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1925 (No. 15) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were excluded from and ceased to form part of the Infected Area No. 6 described in the First Schedule to that Order.
