FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARA-TION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 13).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Further Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 8) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule hereto were included as Area No. 9 in the First Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 14).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Release of a certain Area from Restrictions.

1. The Infected Area No. 4 described in the First Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 8) shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the Foot-And-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 14).
