Stanhope Arkwright, of Kinsham Court, in the said County of Hereford, Esquire: "And whereas the Right Reverend Martin

Linton, now Bishop of Hereford, and the said John Stanhope Arkwright have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Byton and Bodenham may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed :

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John Stanhope Arkwright (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this

Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Byton and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said John Stanhope Arkwright, his heirs and assigns for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bodenham and the Church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said John Stanhope Arkwright and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of his late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 10th day of December, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King
