PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Boston in the County of Lincoln did on the 13th day of March, 1925, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, for an alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 2nd day of May, 1925, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council of the 25th day of June, 1925, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough of Boston should be henceforth divided and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be three:

And whereas on the 21st day of July, 1925, the Right Honourable Sir William Joynton-Hicks, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, Barrister at Law, to be a Commissioner for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Boston:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 8th day of December, 1925:—

“ SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF BOSTON IN THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN AND APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF THE ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 25TH JUNE, 1925.

“ I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

“ *Bargate Ward.*

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Vauxhall Bridge on the eastern boundary of the Borough thence running westward along the centre of the whole extent of Main Ridge thence following the north side of Pump Square and continuing along the centre of the whole extent of Dolphin Lane to the Market Place thence straight south westward to the centre of the Town Bridge and along the centre of the said Bridge as far as the centre of the River or Haven thence north west along the centre of the Haven and River Witham to the Borough boundary opposite Mile House thence following the Borough boundary eastward and northward and continuing along the said Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

“ *South Ward.*

“ A line commencing at a point in the centre of Vauxhall Bridge on the eastern boundary of the Borough thence running westward along the boundary of Bargate Ward as hereinbefore
