The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, provision has been made for the reciprocal enforcement of judgments in the United Kingdom and in other parts of His Majesty's Dominions:

And whereas by the said Act it is, amongst other things, provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His Dominions of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the said part of that Act shall extend to that part of His Dominions and that on any such Order being made the said part of that Act shall extend accordingly:

And whereas on the 6th day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, (Session 2):

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of judgments obtained in the High Court in England,

the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

New South Wales.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable

in respect of services in His Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 2 of the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, as amended by Section 1 of the War Pensions Act, 1920, it is enacted that there shall be transferred to the Minister of Pensions (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") certain powers and duties of the Admiralty with respect to pensions and grants to persons who have served as officers or men and to their widows:

And whereas it has been represented to His Majesty by the Minister that it is desirable to increase in certain cases the retired pay or pension of persons of small means:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, having taken the said proposals into consideration, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and hereby sanctions the Regulations hereto annexed.

REGULATIONS REGARDING INCREASE OF CERTAIN PENSIONS.

1. A person who on the 16th day of August, 1920, was in receipt of a pension which commenced before the 4th day of August, 1914, and

(a) who has attained the age of 60 years (or in the case of a widow in receipt of a pension in respect of her husband, 40 years) or who was retired or discharged on account of physical or mental infirmity; and

(b) whose means, including pension, are shown to the satisfaction of the Minister to be less than £150 a year if unmarried, or £200 a year if married;

may, on making application in the manner prescribed by the Minister and subject to the succeeding Regulations, be granted as from the 1st April, 1920, or from such later date as eligibility may be established, an increase of pension in accordance with Scale I or Scale II in the Schedule hereto, whichever may be applicable and more advantageous.

2. If the amount to which a pension may be increased under these Regulations is less than the amount to which a smaller pension might be increased, the pension may be increased to the latter amount.

3. No pension under these Regulations shall be increased by an amount which is greater than is sufficient to bring the total means of the pensioner up to £150 a year if an unmarried person, or £200 a year if a married person.

4. Where a person is in receipt of a pension to which these Regulations apply as well as any other pension to which any Royal Warrant or any Order in Council providing for the grant of corresponding benefits applies, or a pension to which Section 1 of the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920, applies, the percentage of increase of pension under these Regulations shall be at the rate appropriate to the aggregate amount of such pensions.

5. Where a pension has, since the 3rd August, 1914, been increased by reason of an improvement in the pension scale, the increase authorised by these Regulations shall be calculated on the amount of the pension as at that date, and the amount by which it may be increased under these Regulations shall be reduced by the amount of the increase already granted.

6.—(1) A pension granted with effect from a date later than the 3rd August, 1914, but not later than the 16th August, 1920, and in force on such latter date, may be increased under these Regulations provided that:—

(a) the increased pension shall not exceed the amount to which the corresponding pre-war pension might have been increased under the provisions of these Regulations; and

(b) the increased pension shall not exceed the pension payable under any Regulation taking effect not later than the 1st October, 1921.

(2) A pension granted after but with effect not later than the 16th August, 1920, shall be deemed to be in force on that date.

7.—(1) These Regulations shall not apply to any pension or part of a pension which has been commuted.

(2) A pensioner shall not by reason of commutation of any part of his pension be eligible for a greater increase of pension than if he had not commuted part of his pension.

(3) Where part of a pension has been commuted, any increase under these Regulations shall be calculated on the remaining part at the percentage which would have been payable had there been no commutation.

8. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:—

(1) The expression "pension" means the pension or retired pay of an officer, nurse or man, or the widow of an officer or man, administered by the Minister.

(2) The expression "married person" includes a widower or widow with one or more children (including step-children) under 16 years of age, dependent on him or her, and the expression "unmarried person" includes a widower or widow having no such child.

(3) The expression "means" in the case of a married person includes the means of both husband and wife, and in the case of a widow includes any such child's allowance.

9. The Minister shall be the sole administrator and interpreter of these Regulations, and may issue such detailed instructions in reference thereto as he may from time to time deem necessary.

SCHEDULE.

Scale I.—Applicable as from the 1st April, 1920, to the 6th August, 1924, to a pensioner, otherwise eligible, whilst resident in the British Islands, and from the 7th August, 1924, to a pensioner, otherwise eligible, wheresoever resident.

Where the existing pension does	it may be increased by
not exceed £50 a year	

Where it exceeds £50 a year but does not exceed £100 a year in the case of an unmarried person, or £130 a year in the case of a married person ... } it may be increased by 40 per cent.

Where it exceeds £100 a year but is less than £150 a year in the case of an unmarried person, or exceeds £130 a year but is less than £200 a year in the case of a married person ... } it may be increased by 30 per cent.

Scale II.—Applicable as from the 1st July, 1923, to the 6th August, 1924, to a pensioner, otherwise eligible, whilst resident in the British Islands, and from the 7th August, 1924, to a pensioner, otherwise eligible, wheresoever resident.

Where the existing pension does not exceed £25 a year ... } it may be increased by 70 per cent.

Where it exceeds £25 a year but does not exceed £50 a year ... } it may be increased by 65 per cent.

Where it exceeds £50 a year but does not exceed £100 a year } it may be increased by 50 per cent.

Provided that—

(1) The addition to any such pension shall not be greater than that required to secure to the pensioner the same total pension as would have been awarded had he retired or been discharged on the 1st July, 1923, from the post from which he actually retired or was discharged, at the same age, after the same service and in the same rank as at the time of his actual retirement or discharge. Any disability element will be assessed for this purpose according to the degree of disablement on which the existing pension is based.

(2) Where the pensioner is a widow the above proviso shall apply with the necessary modifications.

Where in the case of a married person it exceeds £100 a year but does not exceed £130 a year ... } it may be increased by 40 per cent.

Where it exceeds £100 a year but is less than £150 a year in the case of an unmarried person, or exceeds £130 a year but is less than £200 a year in the case of a married person ... } it may be increased by 30 per cent.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th

and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of February, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Great Bookham, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Winchester:

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Great Bookham is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Arthur Bird, of The Grange, Great Bookham, in the said County of Surrey, Esquire:

“ And whereas the said Arthur Bird is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Great Bookham now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Winchester for the time being:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, now Bishop of Winchester, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Great Bookham which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Great Bookham:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Bird (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Great Bookham,

now vested in him, the said Arthur Bird as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Frank Theodore, Bishop of Winchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of December, 1925, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions of certain Benefices, namely (1) the union of the Benefice of North Barsham the Benefice of West Barsham and the Benefice of East Barsham (at present united with the Benefice of Little Snoring), (2) the union of the said Benefice of Little Snoring and the Benefice of Great Snoring (at present united with the Benefice of Thursford) and (3) the union of the said Benefice of Thursford and the Benefice of Barney all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of

the said three Benefices of North Barsham, West Barsham and East Barsham, (2) of the said two Benefices of Little Snoring and Great Snoring, and (3) of the said two Benefices of Thursford and Barney duly made their Reports to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the said unions of Benefices and the terms for effecting the unions, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Reports:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for effecting the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Reports:

“ And whereas the said Benefices of North Barsham, West Barsham, East Barsham with Little Snoring, and Barney are now full, the Reverend Arthur Gilbert Backhouse being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of North Barsham and West Barsham, the Reverend Charles Edward Osborne Griffith being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of East Barsham with Little Snoring and the Reverend Thomas Ghent being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Barney, and the said Benefice of Great Snoring with Thursford is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of or of presentation or nomination to each of the said Benefices of East Barsham with Little Snoring and Barney now belongs to one and the same Patron and such Patron and the Patrons also of the said Benefice of Great Snoring with Thursford have consented to the arrangements recommended and proposed in Clause 6 (b) and (c) of this Scheme:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of East Barsham shall be severed from the United Benefice of East Barsham with Little Snoring and that the Benefice of East Barsham so severed and the said Benefices of North Barsham and West Barsham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices of North Barsham, East Barsham and West Barsham shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That the said Benefice of Great Snoring shall be severed from the United Benefice of Great Snoring with Thursford and that the Benefice of Great Snoring so severed and the said Benefice of Little Snoring shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Great Snoring with Little Snoring ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Walsingham but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Great Snoring and Little Snoring shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 3. That the said Benefice of Barney and the said Benefice of Thursford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Barney with Thursford ’

but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Barney and Thursford shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 4. That with the consents of the said Arthur Gilbert Backhouse, Charles Edward Osborne Griffith and Thomas Ghent (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme), the unions recommended and proposed in Clauses (1), (2) and (3) of this Scheme shall take effect upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and (a) the said Arthur Gilbert Backhouse if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of North Barsham and West Barsham shall cease to be Incumbent of those Benefices and it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the said Diocese of Norwich to admit the said Arthur Gilbert Backhouse to the United Benefice of Great Snoring with Little Snoring as first Incumbent of such United Benefice without any form or fee of or for presentation and he shall thereupon become the Incumbent of the United Benefice (b) the said Charles Edward Osborne Griffith if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of East Barsham with Little Snoring shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham and (c) the said Thomas Ghent if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Barney shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Barney with Thursford.

" 5. That upon the unions taking effect (1) the Parsonage House situate at East Barsham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham (2) the Parsonage House situate at Great Snoring shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Great Snoring with Little Snoring; and (3) the Parsonage House situate at Thursford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Barney with Thursford.

" 6. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say (a) in the case of the United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham in every series of five successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of East Barsham with Little Snoring shall have the first and third turns, the Patron of the said Benefice of North Barsham shall have the second and fifth turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of West Barsham shall have the fourth turn; (b) in the case of the United Benefice of Great Snoring with Little Snoring the right of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Great Snoring with Thursford and (c) in the case of the United Benefice of Barney with Thursford the right of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefices of East Barsham with Little Snoring and Barney.

" 7. That upon the unions taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands and all

other the endowments belonging to the United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice of Barney with Thursford with the annual sum or yearly rent charge hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £22 17s. 11d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the statutory provisions for the time being and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the said half yearly instalment of the said yearly rent charge to be paid on each half yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid statutory provision have become payable in respect of such sum of £22 17s. 11d. Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. The said yearly rent charge to be as from the date of the unions taking effect due and payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Barney with Thursford and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Barney with Thursford or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by half yearly instalments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rent charge the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Barney with Thursford and his successors shall have and be entitled to all such or the like powers and remedies as are expressed to be conferred by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in relation to rent charges within the purview of that Section. Provided always that if at any time by reason of any redemption of Tithe Rent Charge belonging to the said United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham or any sale of or other transfer of the right to receive any such Tithe Rent Charge the endowments chargeable with the said yearly rent charge shall no longer include any sum whatsoever of Tithe Rent Charge then and in such case as from the date on which such redemption sale or transfer shall take effect the amount of the said yearly rent charge shall cease to be regulated by the value of Tithe Rent Charge and shall thereafter be a fixed annual sum equivalent to the amount payable in respect of the said yearly rent charge for the year ending on the half yearly day for the payment thereof which last preceded the aforesaid date. Provided also that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex or if by any other Instrument in accordance with statutory authority there shall at any time be annexed to the said United Benefice of Barney with Thursford in lieu of or in substitution for the

yearly rent charge hereby created any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Norwich for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the yearly rent charge hereby created as aforesaid then the said yearly rent charge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable. And provided also that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of East Barsham with North Barsham and West Barsham.

" 8. That upon the unions taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the United Benefice of Great Snoring with Little Snoring or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice of Barney with Thursford with the annual sum or yearly rent charge hereinafter mentioned that is to say a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £41 4s. 2d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the statutory provisions for the time being and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the said half yearly instalment of the said yearly rent charge to be paid on each half yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid statutory provision have become payable in respect of such sum of £41 4s. 2d. Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. The said yearly rent charge to be as from the date of the unions taking effect due and payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Barney with Thursford and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Barney with Thursford or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by half yearly instalments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year; and for the recovery of the said yearly rent charge the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Barney with Thursford and his successors shall have and be entitled to all such or the like powers and remedies as are expressed to be conferred by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in relation to rent charges within the purview of that Section. Provided always that if at any time by reason of any redemption of Tithe Rent Charge belonging to the said United Benefice of Great Snoring with Little Snoring or any sale of or other transfer of the right to receive any such Tithe Rent Charge the endowments chargeable with the said yearly rent charge shall no longer include any sum whatsoever of Tithe Rent Charge then and in such case as from the date on which

such redemption sale or transfer shall take effect the amount of the said yearly rent charge shall cease to be regulated by the value of Tithe Rent Charge and shall thereafter be a fixed annual sum equivalent to the amount payable in respect of the said yearly rent charge for the year ending on the half yearly day for the payment thereof which last preceded the aforesaid date. And provided also that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Stepney, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is

delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Faith, Stepney, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Faith, Stepney':

"And with the like consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Faith, Stepney, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

On October 1st, 1925, a youth named Harper employed at the works of the High Speed Steel Alloys Ltd., at Widnes, fell into a vat 6½ feet high and 8 feet in diameter containing vanadic

acid. The contents of the vat formed a jelly-like substance at a scalding temperature and Harper though his head was clear of the acid was quickly sinking and would have been submerged in a few seconds. Welding, a fellow worker, heard Harper's shout for help. He ran to his assistance and without hesitation jumped into the vat and, by holding up Harper, prevented the latter's complete immersion. It was some three or four minutes before help arrived and both men were severely scalded before being dragged out. Welding showed great promptitude in going to Harper's assistance. He must have known the grave risk he ran in entering the vat and there is no doubt that but for his help Harper would have lost his life.

On October 8th, 1925, Locke was engaged in the erection of steel work for the rebuilding of the premises of Messrs. Bourne & Hollingsworth in Oxford Street. He and another workman named Frederick Dowser were standing on parallel girders on the fourth floor level when Dowser tripped and fell, striking his head in his fall and lying stunned on the girder. The girders on which the men were working were only 7 inches in width and were no less than 7 feet apart. Locke, on seeing his comrade fall, with great presence of mind immediately leapt across the intervening space and throwing himself upon the legs of the fallen man pinned him to the girder until help arrived and they were dragged back to safety. But for Locke's prompt action there is little doubt that Dowser would have fallen to the ground and been killed. Locke's action was a very brave one and he showed total disregard of his own safety. To spring from one girder to the other at a great height was no small feat and he must have recognised in holding down his comrade that any struggle on the latter's part must endanger the lives of both.
