(2) This Article shall come into operation on the eighth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Release of certain Area from Restrictions.

- 2.—(1) The Infected Area No. 3 described in the First Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Declaration of Infected Areas Order of 1926 (No. 39) shall cease to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.
- (2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE DECLARATION OF INFECTED AREAS ORDER OF 1926 (No. 42).
