### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th day of March, 1926 (C.W. 2492/26), in the words following. viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that Officers employed on photographic duties in Your Majesty's Navy should receive a special allowance in view of the amount of extra work involved in such duties:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of an allowance at the rate of 1s. a day being paid to Officers not above Lieutenant-Commander's rank who are appointed to Ships of Your Majesty's Navy for photographic duties in addition to ordinary Ship's duties, this allow-

ance to be payable from the 9th March, 1926, and to be subject to the Regulations applicable to payment of duty allowances generally:

Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."
His Majesty, having taken the said
