- (3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be:—
  - (a) A five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid), or (b) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

## Offences.

4. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, or in respect of Article 3 the railway company loading or unloading the animals or owning the loading banks, railway trucks or other railway vehicles in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, shall each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

## Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) (TEMPORARY MODIFICATION OF RESTRICTIONS) ORDER OF 1926, and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

# ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH APRIL, 1926.)

SHEEP DIPS (REGULATION) ORDER OF 1926.

Whereas the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has ascertained that in common practice there is risk in the use of Arsenical Dips in cases where sheep are dipped twice within the period prescribed by Orders of the Minister relating to Sheep Scab and Sheep Dipping and by Regulations of Local Authorities made thereunder;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Regulation of Use of Arsenical Sheep Dips.

1. Where, by any Order of the Minister or by any regulation of a Local Authority made

thereunder, the dipping of sheep twice in an approved sheep dip is required, with an interval of not less than 7, and not more than 14, days between the two dippings, the use for the second dipping of any dip containing arsenic is hereby prohibited.

Labels to be Affixed to Approved Sheep Dips.

- 2.—(1) Every package or vessel containing an approved sheep dip shall, before being placed on sale or delivered to a purchaser, be clearly and distinctly labelled by the manufacturer or vendor thereof, in a form approved by the Minister.
- (2) In the case of every approved sheep dip of which arsenic is an ingredient the label shall include an additional statement to the effect that the dip contains arsenic and that its use for a second dipping, in cases where sheep are required by any such Order or regulation to be dipped twice with an interval of not less than 7 and not more than 14 days between the two dippings is prohibited.

#### Offences.

3. If any sheep dip which has not been approved by the Minister is falsely marked with a statement or indication that it has been so approved, or if any sheep dip purporting to be an approved sheep dip is not marked with a label as required by this Order, the manufacturer and the retailer, or other person selling the dip, and the person who shall have so marked the dip or caused it to be so marked, knowing the same to have been falsely marked, or omitting so to mark the dip, as the case may be, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

## Interpretation.

In this Order,

"The Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries;

"Approved Sheep Dip" means a Sheep Dip which has been approved for the time being by the Minister for use for the purposes of the Orders of the Minister relating to sheep scab and sheep dipping in Great Britain, or of any regulation made by a Local Authority thereunder, or purporting to be so approved;

"Sheep" includes lambs;

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

### Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

#### Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP DIPS (REGULATION) ORDER OF 1926.
