## FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in hosiery knitting and winding processes at the works of Messrs. Sherriff and Simpkin, Bridge Mills, Long Eaton, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable washing facilities, cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS 1909 AND 1918.

PERAMBULATOR AND INVALID CARRIAGE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX minimum rates of wages for periods dependent upon the cost-of-living index figure for male and female workers and TO CANCEL minimum rates of wages for certain classes of indentured apprentices.

In accordance with regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act 1909 by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922 and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts 1909 and 1918 in Great Britain for the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade, as specified in the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order 1926, hereby give notice:—

(1) That they propose to vary the minimum rates of wages for male and female workers set out in their Notice I (14) dated 22nd December 1922 for the cost-of-living periods specified therein by amending the definitions of certain of the classes of workers as specified in that notice.

(2) That they propose to cancel the minimum rates of wages for certain classes of indentured apprentices and other workers as specified in their Notice I (15) dated 22nd

December, 1922, and

(3) That they propose to fix minimum rates of wages for male and female workers employed in those branches of trade included in the trade specified in the appendix to the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order 1926 and not included in the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Perambulator and Invalid Carriage) Order 1919.

Particulars of the minimum rates proposed to be varied, cancelled and fixed, are available for inspection at the address shown below or may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary, fix and cancel, which may be lodged with them within two months from 30th April, 1926. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that objections should state precisely and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
