The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of May, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Burston and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Shimpling both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich :

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Burston and Shimpling duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report :

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the approval of the said Bishop of Norwich embodies certain modifications thereof :

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Burston is now full, the Reverend Francis Thomas Smith being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Shimpling is at present vacant :

“ And whereas the said Francis Thomas Smith has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect :

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Burston and the said Benefice of Shimpling shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Burston with Shimpling ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Francis Thomas Smith if he is then Incumbent

of the said Benefice of Burston shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Burston shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Shimpling and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that two thirds of the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice of Claxton with Carleton, situate in the said Diocese of Norwich and that the remaining one third of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Shimpling shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Burston shall have the second and the third turns.

" 5. That upon the expiration of a period of two years after the date of the union taking effect all the Tithe Rent charge Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Thurgarton in the said Diocese of Norwich, with the annual sum or yearly rentcharge hereinafter mentioned that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £75 to be as from the date of the expiration of the period hereinbefore mentioned due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thurgarton and the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thurgarton or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of June and the first day of December in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thurgarton and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply.

" Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant, convey and annex

to the said Benefice of Thurgarton any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Norwich for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of £75 hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £75 shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

" And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in

Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of May, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Diddlebury with a portion of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Holdgate and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Tugford with the residue of the said Benefice of Holdgate, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Salop and in the Diocese of Hereford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Diddlebury with a portion of the said Benefice of Holdgate and (2) of the said Benefice of Tugford with the residue of the said Benefice of Holdgate, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Diddlebury and Tugford are now full, the Reverend Goodwin Purcell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Diddlebury and the Reverend Russell Henry Jeffrey being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tugford, and the said Benefice of Holdgate is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Russell Henry Jeffrey is also the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Shipton, situate in the said County of Salop and in the said Diocese of Hereford:

“ And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice of Diddlebury with Bouldon when the unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Diddlebury:

“ And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Holdgate belongs to the Bishop of Hereford save that the Bishop of Worcester has the right of one presentation or nomination in every series of four presentations or nominations to such Benefice:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Diddlebury and so much of the said Benefice of Holdgate as is situate within the Civil Parish of Diddlebury shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefices of Diddlebury with Bouldon ’ and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided, and that such United Benefice shall be included

in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Ludlow.

“ 2. That the Church of the Parish of Diddlebury shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Diddlebury with Bouldon and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Diddlebury shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for such United Parish.

“ 3. That the said Benefice of Holdgate after the severance of the portion referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme and the said Benefice of Tugford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Much Wenlock but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Tugford and Holdgate shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 4. That with the consents of the said Goodwin Purcell and Russell Henry Jeffrey (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme) if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Russell Henry Jeffrey shall have vacated the said Benefice of Shipton, the unions shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Russell Henry Jeffrey shall still be Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shipton and of the said Benefice of Tugford, then the unions shall take effect upon the next vacation of that one of the said Benefices of Shipton and Tugford which shall first be vacated after that day.

“ 5. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Holdgate shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford.

“ 6. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Diddlebury shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Diddlebury with Bouldon.

“ 7. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall collate present or nominate to the United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the Bishop of Hereford shall have the first turn of collation presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made after the union, the Bishop of Worcester shall have the second turn and the Bishop of Hereford shall have the third and all succeeding turns for ever thereafter.

“ 8. That after the said unions have taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice of Diddlebury with Bouldon shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Diddlebury.

“ 9. That upon the said unions taking effect all those Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £67 2s. 11d., now or formerly payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holdgate and arising within that portion of the said Benefice of Holdgate which is proposed to be united to the said Benefice of Diddlebury as aforesaid together with all sums of money, stocks, annuities, or other property being or

representing the proceeds of the sale redemption or other conversion of the whole or any part of such Tithe Rent Charge shall be severed from the said Benefice of Holdgate and shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Diddlebury with Bouldon, and all other the endowments and property belonging to the said Benefice of Holdgate shall belong to the United Benefice of Holdgate with Tugford.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th

day of April, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for dividing the Parish of Radipole, in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury, into two distinct and separate parishes:

“ Whereas the said Parish of Radipole comprises two distinct areas separated from one another by other parishes and by the Backwater of Weymouth Harbour, the more southerly area being thickly populated and including the Church of Saint Mary, Weymouth, which is the Parish Church of the said Parish of Radipole and the more northerly area being largely rural and including the Church of Saint Ann, Radipole, which is a Chapel of Ease to the said Parish Church of Saint Mary, Weymouth:

“ And whereas the said Church of Saint Ann, Radipole, is situate at a distance of more than two miles by road from the said Parish Church of Saint Mary, Weymouth, and there has been a considerable increase of population in the neighbourhood of the said Church of Saint Ann, Radipole:

“ And whereas we are satisfied that the existing arrangement by which the said Church of Saint Ann, Radipole, is served as a Chapel of Ease by the Incumbent of the said Parish Church of Saint Mary, Weymouth, as Rector of Radipole, is inconvenient and it appears to us to be desirable that the said Parish of Radipole should be divided into two separate and distinct parishes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas we have agreed, subject to the division of the said Parish of Radipole in the manner hereinafter set forth, to make out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, a grant of £275 per annum to the Rector or Incumbent of the proposed Parish of Saint Mary, Weymouth, and a grant of £50 per annum to the Rector or Incumbent of the proposed Parish of Radipole:

“ And whereas the said grants of the said yearly sums of £275 and £50 respectively will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument or Instruments to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and affixed his Episcopal Seal thereto), with the consents of the Reverend Ernest Augustus Eardley-Wilmot, of The Vicarage, Broxbourne, in the County of Hertford, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Arthur Evelyn Barnes-Lawrence, of Number 4, Upperton Gardens, Eastbourne, Clerk in Holy Orders and an

Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Reverend George Backhouse Durrant, of Number 4, Stanhope Villas, Bromley, in the County of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders; the Reverend Francis Edward Murphy, of The Rectory, Walcot, Bath, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the Reverend Charles Edward Wilson, of Christ Church Vicarage, Gipsy Hill, London, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Radipole (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Thomas Lancaster, as Rector or Incumbent of the said Parish of Radipole (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the said Parish of Radipole shall be divided into two separate and distinct parishes in the following manner, that is to say:—

“ I. There shall be a distinct and separate Parish which shall be named ‘ The Parish of St. Mary, Weymouth,’ and shall consist of that portion of the said existing Parish of Radipole which is situate to the south east of the middle of the viaduct which carries the Portland Branch Line of the Great Western and Southern Joint Railway across the Backwater of Weymouth Harbour, which portion is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured pink.

“ II. There shall be a distinct and separate Parish which shall be named ‘ The Parish of Radipole ’ and shall consist of the remaining portion of the said existing Parish of Radipole, which portion is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed and thereon coloured green.

“ III. The said proposed Parishes shall be in the Diocese Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery in which the said existing Parish of Radipole is situate, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Bishop of the said Diocese, the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry and the Rural Dean of the said Rural Deanery.

“ IV. The whole right of Patronage of each of the Churches and Cures of the said proposed Parishes shall belong to the Patrons of the Church and Cure of the said existing Parish of Radipole upon the trusts and subject to the limitations and provisions upon and subject to which the Patronage of the said Church and Parish of Radipole is now vested in the said Patrons.

“ V. No rights of pewholders in the Churches of the said proposed Parishes shall be disturbed or diminished by the proposed division of the said Parish of Radipole.

“ VI. The said Church of Saint Mary, Weymouth, shall be the Parish Church of the said proposed Parish of Saint Mary, Weymouth, and the said Church of Saint Ann, Radipole, shall be the Parish Church of the said proposed Parish of Radipole.

“ VII. The rights, privileges and obligations of the inhabitants of the said proposed Parish of Radipole in respect to their present Parish Church shall be transferred to the said Church Saint Ann, Radipole.

“ VIII. The Parsonage House of the said existing Parish of Radipole situate in Weymouth shall be the parsonage house of the said proposed Parish of Saint Mary, Weymouth, and vested in the Incumbent of the said proposed Parish and his successors as part of the property of the Benefice.

“ IX. All the tithe rentcharges tithe redemption moneys and glebe lands and hereditaments (inclusive of the so-called parsonage house situate at Radipole but other than the said Parsonage House of the existing Parish of Radipole situate in Weymouth) belonging to the Rectory of the said existing Parish of Radipole shall become vested in the Rector or Incumbent of the proposed Parish of Radipole and his successors as property of the Benefice.

“ X. The Incumbent of each of the proposed Parishes shall be styled Rector and his Benefice shall be styled a Rectory.

“ XI. Each Rector or Incumbent shall be a body corporate and shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within his Parish.

“ XII. Banns of marriage may be published and marriages, baptisms, churchings and burials may be solemnised in the Parish Church of each of the proposed Parishes and each Rector or Incumbent shall be entitled to receive and to retain for his own use all fees payable in respect of the said offices thus solemnised in his church.

“ XIII. The existing Parish of Radipole and the Rectory or Incumbency thereof and the whole right of Patronage thereof shall cease and determine and all rights endowments or emoluments of the said Rectory or Incumbency which may not have been hereinbefore mentioned shall be transferred to the respective Rectors or Incumbents of the proposed Parishes within which they arise.

“ XIV. The said Thomas Lancaster shall become the first Rector or Incumbent of the said proposed Parish of Saint Mary, Weymouth, immediately upon the division hereinbefore recommended of the existing Parish of Radipole taking effect and the Benefice of the Rectory of the Parish of Radipole thereupon constituted shall be filled by the appointment thereto of a Clerk as in the case of any other vacant Benefice.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Canewdon and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Paglesham, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Canewdon and Paglesham duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Canewdon and Paglesham are now full, the Reverend James Woodward being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Canewdon and the Reverend Courtenay Balderston Jennings being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Paglesham:

“ And whereas there is charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Paglesham a pension in excess of £150 per annum to the Reverend William Fraser late Incumbent of such Benefice:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Canewdon and the said Benefice of Paglesham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Canewdon with Paglesham ’ but the parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices

shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Paglesham only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Canewdon and the then Incumbent of Paglesham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Canewdon only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Paglesham and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Paglesham if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Canewdon shall have been instituted to Canewdon subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Canewdon before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Canewdon following such avoidance of the Benefice of Paglesham and the then Incumbent of Paglesham shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that the stipend to be assigned to such Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall not exceed £250 per annum.

“ 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Canewdon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Paglesham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ 5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Paglesham having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Canewdon having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and very alternate turn thereafter.

“ 6. That upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the said pension payable to the said William Fraser if such pension has

not ceased before the union takes effect all the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands, and all (if any) other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the respective Incumbents for the time being of the several hereinafter mentioned Benefices that is to say the Benefice of South Benfleet; Westcliff, Saint Paul; and Walthamstow, Saint Oswald; all in the said Diocese of Chelmsford with the three annual sums or yearly rent charges hereinafter mentioned that is to say in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of each of the said Benefices of South Benfleet; Westcliff, Saint Paul; and Walthamstow, Saint Oswald: a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £45 15s. 9d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the Statutory provisions for the time being and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge and to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the half yearly instalment of the said yearly rent charge to be paid on each half yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid Statutory provisions have become payable in respect of such sum of £45 15s. 9d. Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. The said yearly rent charges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect or as from the date of the cessation of the said pension as the case may be due and payable to the respective Incumbents of the said three Benefices of South Benfleet; Westcliff, Saint Paul; and Walthamstow, Saint Oswald; and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of any of the said Benefices of South Benfleet; Westcliff, Saint Paul; and Walthamstow, Saint Oswald; respectively or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by half yearly instalments on the first day of January and the first day of July in every year. And for the recovery of the said yearly rent charges the Incumbents of the respective Benefices of South Benfleet; Westcliff, Saint Paul; and Walthamstow, Saint Oswald; and their respective successors shall have and be entitled to all such or the like powers and remedies as are expressed to be conferred by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in relation to rent charges within the purview of that Section. Provided always that if at any time by reason of any redemption of Tithe Rent Charge belonging to the said United Benefice or any sale of or other transfer of the right to receive any such Tithe Rent Charge the endowments chargeable with the said yearly rent charges shall no longer include any sum whatsoever of Tithe Rent Charge then and in such case as from the date on which such redemption sale or transfer shall take effect the amount of the said yearly rent charges shall cease to be regulated by the value of Tithe Rent Charge and shall thereafter in each case be a fixed annual sum equivalent to the amount payable in respect of the said yearly rent charge for the year ending on the half yearly day for the payment thereof which last preceded the aforesaid date, and provided

also that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex or if by any other instrument in accordance with statutory authority there shall at any time be annexed to the said Benefices of South Benfleet; Westcliff, Saint Paul; and Walthamstow, Saint Oswald; or any of them any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being be a just and fair equivalent for all or any of the yearly rent charges hereby created as aforesaid then the said yearly rent charge in any case in which equivalent endowments shall have been granted, conveyed and annexed as aforesaid shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable. And provided further that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or Measures, or of any other Act of Parliament or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chelmsford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the Scheme or any part thereof within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order as it is hereby ordered that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further

to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 6th day of October, 1841, and published in the London Gazette on the 24th day of December, 1841, part of the Parish of Crosthwaite, in the said County of Cumberland and in the said Diocese of Carlisle, was assigned as a Chapelry District to the consecrated Church known as Thornthwaite Chapel, in the said Parish of Crosthwaite, and the said Chapelry District was named ‘ The Thornthwaite Chapelry District ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 19th day of June, 1868, and published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month, part of the said Parish of Crosthwaite was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church, situate within the limits of the Chapelry of Newlands, in the said Parish of Crosthwaite, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Newlands ’:

“ And whereas the said Thornthwaite Chapelry District and the said District Chapelry of Newlands have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Thornthwaite and of the said New Parish of Newlands should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of the said Diocese of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Thornthwaite and of the said New Parish of Newlands shall be altered so that all those portions of the said Parish of Crosthwaite and of the said New Parish of Thornthwaite which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Newlands:

“ And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Newlands, in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Crosthwaite and of the New Parish of Thornthwaite, both in the said County and Diocese, which taken together, are bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Newlands, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Newlands from the said New Parish of Thornthwaite crosses the middle of the road leading from Newlands past the western side of the farmhouse known as Uzzicar to Braithwaite, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 61 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to Uzzicar farmhouse, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 469 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Above Derwent published in the year 1925 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation from the close numbered 466 upon the same

**COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY  
(No. 2) DIRECTIONS, 1926, MADE BY  
THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE  
EMERGENCY REGULATIONS, 1926.**

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations, 1926, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. No person shall use any coal for the purpose of propelling any pleasure-boat by steam,

electricity, or other mechanical power in or upon the waters of any harbour, estuary, river, canal, lake or other inland water in Great Britain, unless a permit in writing, authorising the use of the coal for such purpose, shall first have been granted by the Secretary for Mines or his duly authorised representative.

2. In these Directions the expression "pleasure-boat" includes any ship, steamer, launch, boat or other vessel used for carrying passengers, whether on payment of a fare or otherwise, excepting a public ferry-boat whilst employed as such.

3. These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 2) Directions, 1926, shall be read with the Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1926, as though they formed part thereof, and shall come into force on the 10th day of June, 1926.

3. Any existing rate or Order in so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded in respect of any premises for the harvest period.

*In the county of the West Riding of Yorkshire.*

The parish of Bradfield; so much of the parish of Langsett as lies to the south and west of the road from Sheffield via Langsett and Crow Edge to Hepworth, and such part of the city and county borough of Sheffield as lies to the west of the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the county boundary near Ringinglow, thence via Ringinglow, Andwell Lane, Blackbrook Road, Rails Road, Bingley Lane and Hopwood Lane to the city boundary. (Now in Force.)
