The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 15th day of April, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Thornthwaite, and of the New Parish of Newlands, both in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

“ Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 6th day of October, 1841, and published in the London Gazette on the 24th day of December, 1841, part of the Parish of Crosthwaite, in the said County of Cumberland and in the said Diocese of Carlisle, was assigned as a Chapelry District to the consecrated Church known as Thornthwaite Chapel, in the said Parish of Crosthwaite, and the said Chapelry District was named ‘ The Thornthwaite Chapelry District ’:

“ And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 19th day of June, 1868, and published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month, part of the said Parish of Crosthwaite was assigned as a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church, situate within the limits of the Chapelry of Newlands, in the said Parish of Crosthwaite, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘ The District Chapelry of Newlands ’:

“ And whereas the said Thornthwaite Chapelry District and the said District Chapelry of Newlands have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Thornthwaite and of the said New Parish of Newlands should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of the said Diocese of Carlisle (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Thornthwaite and of the said New Parish of Newlands shall be altered so that all those portions of the said Parish of Crosthwaite and of the said New Parish of Thornthwaite which are described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Newlands:

“ And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“ The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Newlands, in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Crosthwaite and of the New Parish of Thornthwaite, both in the said County and Diocese, which taken together, are bounded upon the south by the said New Parish of Newlands, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Newlands from the said New Parish of Thornthwaite crosses the middle of the road leading from Newlands past the western side of the farmhouse known as Uzzicar to Braithwaite, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 61 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to Uzzicar farmhouse, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 469 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Above Derwent published in the year 1925 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme or Representation from the close numbered 466 upon the same
