**COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY
(No. 2) DIRECTIONS, 1926, MADE BY
THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE
EMERGENCY REGULATIONS, 1926.**

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations, 1926, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. No person shall use any coal for the purpose of propelling any pleasure-boat by steam,

electricity, or other mechanical power in or upon the waters of any harbour, estuary, river, canal, lake or other inland water in Great Britain, unless a permit in writing, authorising the use of the coal for such purpose, shall first have been granted by the Secretary for Mines or his duly authorised representative.

2. In these Directions the expression "pleasure-boat" includes any ship, steamer, launch, boat or other vessel used for carrying passengers, whether on payment of a fare or otherwise, excepting a public ferry-boat whilst employed as such.

3. These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 2) Directions, 1926, shall be read with the Coal (Emergency) Directions, 1926, as though they formed part thereof, and shall come into force on the 10th day of June, 1926.
