The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891, His Majesty the King is authorised by Order in Council to fix the fees to be taken in respect of any matter or thing done by a Consular Officer in the execution of his office, and to vary such fees by way of increase or decrease, and to abolish fees, and to create new fees:

And whereas by certain Orders in Council fees to be taken by Consular Officers have been fixed:

And whereas it is expedient to make certain provisions respecting the amounts of fees fixed by Orders in Council made or which may hereafter be made under the before mentioned Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the before mentioned Act, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Consular Fees (Amendment) Order in Council, 1926.

II. Whenever any fee is leviable under the Consular Salaries and Fees Act, 1891, and the amount of such fee, if computed in accordance with the provisions in force of any Order in Council made thereunder, would either be less than sixpence or, if greater, would not be a multiple of sixpence, then in every such case the fee, which shall be taken, shall be sixpence or such sum, being a multiple of sixpence and

greater than the amount so computed, as is nearest thereto.

III. This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

And the Right Honourable Sir Austen Chamberlain, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Act, 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), His Majesty in Council, was pleased to make the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Order, 1924 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") and the Forestry (Title of Commissioners of Woods) Order, 1924:

And whereas the Forestry Commissioners and the Commissioners of Crown Lands have made a joint representation that provision should be made by His Majesty in Council in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas for the purposes of the said representation, plans hereinafter referred to as "deposited plans" have been prepared in duplicate, signed by the Commissioners of Crown Lands, and sealed with the seal of the

Forestry Commissioners, and one set of deposited plans has been deposited with the Commissioners of Crown Lands and one with the Forestry Commissioners:

And whereas the properties which are the subject of transfer under this Order consist of woods and forests within the meaning of the Act and of other properties subject at the date of transfer to the same local management as such woods and forests:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Subject as hereinafter provided, there are hereby transferred to and vested in the Forestry Commissioners:—

(1) all the estate, interest, rights, powers and liabilities of the Crown and of the Commissioners of Crown Lands, not transferred to and vested in the Forestry Commissioners by the principal Order, in or in connection with any lands under the management or control of the Commissioners of Crown Lands which are either—

(a) lands situate within the external boundaries of the New Forest and the Forest of Dean, which said boundaries are respectively defined by green verge lines on the deposited plans, marked "A. New Forest" and "F. Forest of Dean"; or

(b) lands delineated and coloured green on any other of the deposited plans marked respectively "B. Bere Woods", "C. Parkhurst Forest", "D. Alice Holt Forest", "E. Woolmer Forest", "G. Highmeadow Woods", "H. Dymock Woods", "I. Hope Wood", "J. Hazelborough Woods", "K. Inverliever Woods", "L. Clearwell Woods", "M. Tintern Woods", and "P. Bedgbury Woods";

(2) all the estate, interest, rights, powers and liabilities of the Crown or of the Commissioners of Crown Lands as Lord of the Manor or Lordship of St. Briavels, or the Hundred of St. Briavels, the Manors of Staunton and English Bicknor and the Manor and Liberty of Newland in the County of Gloucester, or in or in connection with any mines or minerals (other than Mines Royal) appertaining or reputed to appertain to the Lordship of any such manor, or in or in connection with any other hereditaments appertaining or reputed to appertain as aforesaid:

Provided that there shall not be included in the transfer effected by this subparagraph—

(a) any estate, interest, rights, powers or liabilities (except in respect of mines and minerals) in or in connection with the lands coloured red on the deposited plan marked "N. St. Briavels" which appertain or are reputed to appertain to the Manor of St. Briavels; or

(b) any estate, interest, rights, powers or liabilities in or in connection with the lands coloured red on the deposited plan marked "O. Symonds Yat" which appertain or are reputed to appertain to the Manor of English Bicknor.

2. There are hereby retransferred to His Majesty so as to be under the management

and control of the Commissioners of Crown Lands; any estate, interest, rights, powers or liabilities transferred to the Forestry Commissioners by the principal Order and vested in them at the date of this Order in or in connection with any of the lands herein mentioned, that is to say—

(a) lands situate in any parish mentioned in the First Schedule to the principal Order, other than lands specified in Article one of this Order, and other than that portion of the Clearwell Woods, described in paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to the principal Order, which is situate in Newland Parish; and

(b) lands delineated and coloured red on the plan marked "M. Tintern Woods".

3. Nothing in this Order shall have effect so as to transfer to the Forestry Commissioners any estate, interest, rights, powers or liabilities of the Crown or of the Commissioners of Crown Lands in or in connection with—

(a) any mines or minerals lying under lands which, by virtue of notice given by the Earl of Dunraven as owner thereof under section sixty-eight of the Dean Forest Mines Act, 1838, were exempted from the operation of that Act, except where—

(i) the estate of the Crown in the lands was transferred to the Forestry Commissioners by the principal Order or is so transferred by this Order; or

(ii) the lands under which the mines or minerals lie are not the property of the Crown;

(b) any fisheries or rights of fishing excepted and reserved to His Majesty by paragraph 2 of the exceptions and reservations contained in the First Schedule to the principal Order;

(c) any foreshores, mines royal, or other prerogative rights of the Crown.

4.—(1) The provisions contained in articles three, four (except paragraph (3) thereof) and six of the principal Order shall apply to the property transferred under this Order as if it were so transferred under that Order, and references to that Order in the said provisions shall be deemed to include references to that Order as amended by this Order.

(2) Where any property which was transferred under the principal Order is retransferred under this Order, the said provisions shall have effect as if the property so transferred and retransferred were property retained within the meaning of the principal Order as amended by this Order.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Crown Lands Acts or in any other Act which confers an exemption from stamp duty—

(a) no exemption from stamp duty granted by any of those Acts in force at the date of this Order shall extend to any instrument hereafter entered into by or with the Forestry Commissioners in the exercise of any powers relating to property transferred to those Commissioners under the principal Order or this Order or to the management of any such property;

(b) no such instrument as is referred to in paragraph (a) of this Article shall, after the

date of this Order, require to be enrolled in the Office of Land Revenue Records and Enrolments;

(c) no consent other than the consent of the Treasury shall be required to enable the Forestry Commissioners to make any arrangements which may be, in their opinion, expedient for the adjustment or settlement of any doubtful or disputed rights or claims of those Commissioners in or to any property (including any forestal right), the management or control of which would, if such rights or claims were established in favour of the Commissioners, be vested in them by the principal Order or this Order.

6. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purposes of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if this Order were an Act of Parliament.

7. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Order, 1926, and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Forestry (Transfer of Woods) Orders, 1924 to 1926.

The following Address of the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in General Assembly, having been transmitted by His Grace the Lord High Commissioner to the Right Honourable Sir John Gilmour, Bart., D.S.O., His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, has been by him laid before the King, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously:—

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY,

May it please Your Majesty,—

We, Your Majesty's dutiful subjects, Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, convened in General Assembly, have received with feelings of gratitude Your Majesty's gracious letter.

With all loyal respect we would tender to Your Majesty, to Our Gracious Queen, and to your Royal Family, an expression of our deep sympathy with you in the grievous loss of one so near and precious to you as the late beloved Queen Mother Alexandra, whose long life of gracious influence and queenly service had endeared her to the heart of the Nation and the Empire.

Before Your Majesty's letter was read in our Assembly, the Nation had entered on and passed through a grave and testing struggle. We pray that those who are entrusted with the task of conciliation will be wisely guided, and that a right and generous settlement in terms of Christian brotherliness will soon be reached, and peace and prosperity restored to our beloved land. We desire to renew our expression of loyalty and attachment to Your Majesty's person and throne, and of our confidence in Your Majesty's high Christian purpose, trust in your people, wide knowledge of them, and strong desire for their progress in all good.

There are no more loyal subjects in Your Majesty's vast dominions than the members of this National Church, and we, therefore, welcome Your Majesty's renewed assurance of solicitude for the welfare of the Church of Scotland, and your firm determination to uphold it in the full and free enjoyment of its just rights and privileges. If anything were needed to deepen our loyalty it would be found in the confirmation given of these assurances by Your Majesty's joining in our national worship during your residence in Scotland.

We are very greatly encouraged in our work for the spiritual good of our beloved country by Your Majesty's expression of interest in our proceedings, and in especial in the present endeavours to heal the divisions of the Church in Scotland. We are grateful to God Who has led His Church, within this land into a closer fellowship, and Who is accomplishing those things for the good of His Church, which, of ourselves, we are unable to perform. It will be our earnest prayer that this General Assembly may be so guided and ruled in its decisions that all may be for the glory of God, for the furtherance of the Gospel, for the deepening of the spirit of Christian unity amongst the Churches, and for the promotion of the highest welfare of the people of Your Majesty's ancient kingdom of Scotland.

We have received with gratitude Your Majesty's Royal donation of £2,000, which we shall use our best endeavour so to apply as to extend the blessings of religion in the Highlands and Islands.

We hail with the utmost pleasure and satisfaction the renewed appointment, as Your Majesty's representative at this General Assembly, of the Right Honourable the Earl of Elgin and Kincardine, whose known interest in Church life and work, as well as the historic name he inherits, make welcome his return as Lord High Commissioner: the General Assembly have already had experience of his ability, interest, and courtesy.

We pray that the blessing of Almighty God, our Heavenly Father, may rest upon Your Majesty, our gracious Queen Mary and the Royal Family; that Your Majesty's throne may be established in righteousness, and that Your Majesty may be long spared in health and happiness to reign over a loyal, prosperous, and religious people.

May it please Your Majesty,

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England; on Friday, the

18th June, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 21st June, 1926, to Saturday, the 26th June, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms, which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

SPECIAL PROVISIONAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING AN OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATION OF DRAUGHTSMAN IN THE HYDROGRAPHIC DEPARTMENT OF THE ADMIRALTY.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 25; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the examination. A candidate who attained the age of 18 on the first day of the examination would be admitted, but a candidate who attained the age of 25 on that day would not be admitted.

The following exceptions to the above age limits are allowed:—

(i) Persons who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may be admitted to the examination up to any age.

(ii) Persons serving at the time of the examination as unestablished draughtsmen in the Hydrographic Department of the Admiralty who have completed six months' service in that capacity may be admitted to the examination up to any age.

(iii) Persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

Candidates who become eligible for the offer of an appointment on the result of this examination will be assigned for un pensionable service if they have attained the age of 50 at the date of the examination; and no offer of appointment will be made to any candidate who has attained the age of 60.

2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914 and the 11th November, 1918.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

4. No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

6. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:

1. Drawing.
2. English.
3. Arithmetac
4. Geography.
5. Mathematics.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in drawing and in the aggregate. A high standard of draughtsmanship is required.

7. Of the vacancies to be filled 50 per cent. will be filled by appointment in order of merit from the list resulting from the examination; the remaining vacancies will be reserved for candidates at the examination who served in His Majesty's Forces during the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, and who are not among the successful candidates in order of merit, provided a sufficient number of such candidates qualify for appointment. Any deficiency in the number of such qualified ex-service candidates may be met by the appointment of qualified candidates without such service.

8. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made in the writing of the candidate, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. A fee of £1 will be required from each candidate attending an examination.

The wages payable for employment in agriculture of all male workers who are engaged for a shorter period than a week shall be not less than wages at the same rate per hour as would have been payable if they had been engaged by the week or longer period.

7. *Female Workers.*

The wages payable for employment in agriculture of female workers of 14 years of age and over shall be not less than 5d. per hour.

8. (a) For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker other than a male or female casual worker, who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

(b) In the case of a male or female casual worker, the hours of work shall not include meal times, but where by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work, such worker shall be entitled to not less than one hour's pay at the rate applicable to such worker.

(iii) All employment on a Sunday.

C. In the case of female workers:—

(i) All employment in excess of 44 hours per week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

(ii) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(iii) All employment on a Sunday.

12. For the purpose of the application of the above minimum rates the West Riding of Yorkshire Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 20th November, 1925, defined the following as the benefits or advantages which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash and the values at which they are to be reckoned for the purpose:—

The West Riding of Yorkshire Agricultural Wages Committee, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do, by this Order, vary, as from 14th June, 1926, their Order of the 20th November, 1925, defining the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment for the purpose of the application of any differential rates of wages for overtime fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, which, for the purposes of the said Act, shall be deemed to include the cities and county boroughs of Bradford, Leeds, Sheffield, Wakefield and York, and the county boroughs of Barnsley, Dewsbury, Halifax, Huddersfield and Rotherham, and hereby Order that such employment shall be as follows:—

1. In the case of male workers employed in agriculture as defined in clauses 1 and 2 of the Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 10th June, 1926, fixing minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture in the said area:—

(a) All employment in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in excess of 48 hours in Winter and 52½ hours in Summer, and also in excess of the additional 12 hours on weekdays and 3 hours on Sundays for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

(b) All employment except one hour for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock after 12 noon on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(c) All employment on Sundays in excess of 3 hours for work in connection with the care of and attention to stock.

2. In the case of all other male workers engaged by the week or longer period:—

(a) All employment in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in excess of 48 hours in Winter and 52½ hours in Summer.

(b) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(c) All employment on a Sunday.

3. In the case of female workers:—

(a) All employment in excess of 44 hours per week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

(b) All employment after 12 noon on Saturday or such other day (not being Sunday) in any week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(c) All employment on a Sunday.

4. For the purpose of this Order employment in Summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Saturday in October, and employment in Winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

IMPORTATION OF RAW CHERRIES
ORDER OF 1926.
(DATED 11TH JUNE, 1926.)

(D.I.P. 543).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:—

Commencement.

1. This Order shall come into operation on

the sixteenth day of June, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.

Restriction on Importation of Raw Cherries.

2. For the prevention of the introduction of the Cherry Fruit Fly the landing in England or Wales of any raw cherries shipped from any port in European France is hereby prohibited unless each consignment is accompanied by one of the certificates specified below:—

(a) In the case of raw cherries grown in France a certificate in the form specified in the Schedule hereto, issued by a duly authorised official of the French Services d'Inspection Phytopathologique.

(b) In the case of raw cherries not grown in France a certificate of origin visé by a Local Authority in the country of origin; the country and place where the raw cherries were grown shall be stated in such certificate.

The certificate prescribed in this Article shall be delivered to an Officer of Customs at the same time as, and together with, the entry relating to the consignment.

Disposal of raw cherries landed in contravention of this Order.

3. Raw cherries shipped from any port in European France and landed in England or Wales without such a certificate as is prescribed in this Order shall be forthwith destroyed by and at the expense of the Importer unless they are authorised to be disposed of otherwise by a licence issued by an Inspector, and any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Article as to destruction or with the conditions (if any) imposed by such licence shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Powers of Entry.

4. An Inspector may, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, enter any premises and examine any raw cherries on such premises which he may suspect as being landed in contravention of this Order; and any person who shall wilfully obstruct or impede the Inspector in the exercise of his powers of entry or examination shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Definitions.

5. In this Order "Inspector" means an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Requirements of Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1922 not affected.

6. The restrictions hereby imposed shall not affect the requirements of the Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1922.

Short Title.

7. This Order may be cited as the IMPORTATION OF RAW CHERRIES ORDER OF 1926.

2. To authorise the Company to purchase by agreement additional land for the purposes of their undertaking and to sell or lease any lands vested in or acquired by the Company and not for the time being required for the purposes of their undertaking.

3. To enable the Company to purchase and take on lease houses cottages and other buildings for persons in their employ and offices showrooms and other buildings and to fit up maintain and let any such buildings.

4. To authorise the Company to purchase or take on lease lands and adapt the same for the purpose of a sports or recreation ground for persons in their employ including ground for cricket football bowls lawn tennis and other games and upon such lands to erect construct and maintain all proper and convenient houses pavilions dressing-rooms and other buildings works and conveniences.

6. To authorise the Company to have and exercise within the added area all powers rights and privileges which they have within their existing limits of supply.

7. To authorise the Company to raise additional capital for the purposes of their undertaking by the creation and issue of new ordinary shares or stock and of new preference shares or stock, and by borrowing on mortgage and by the creation and issue of debenture stock, or by any one or more of such means, and to make provisions for regulating the raising of such additional capital, including provisions as to the rights privileges and liabilities of the holders of shares or stock in the new capital and of mortgages and debenture stock of the Company.

To empower the directors of the Company to issue so as to be redeemable preference shares or stock and redeemable debenture stock, to make provision with respect to the redemption of such shares or stocks either by a payment in cash or by the issue of other shares or stock (redeemable or otherwise) and to authorise the creation and issue of new shares or stock for any such purpose and the re-issue of any redeemable preference shares or stock or debenture stock after redemption.

10. To further define and continue the standard rate of dividend on the existing ordinary capital of the Company, and to prescribe the standard rates of dividend on ordinary capital hereafter issued by the Company and to continue the sliding scale for determining the authorised rates of dividend from time to time on the ordinary capital of the Company but on the basis of the price charged by the Company for gas supplied by them in the several quarters of the year or half year.
