## (2) PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

As respects Male Workers for whom General Minimum Time Rates are proposed to be varied in Paragraph 1 above, Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed minimum rates specified in Paragraph 1 above in the manner set out in Part II of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30), shall apply in substitution for the proposed minimum rates otherwise applicable as set out in Paragraph 1 above, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Paragraph 11 of the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## (3) APPLICATION OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers of the classes specified in Paragraph (1) of this Notice in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1924, as set out in Paragraph 15 of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice Q. (30).

NOTE.—No variation is proposed by the Trade Board in the Piece-work Basis Time Rate at present applicable to the above-mentioned classes of workers.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 22nd June, 1926. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W.1.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
