

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of a person serving in a civil situation to which she was admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. Arithmetic.
3. Typewriting.
4. One of the following:—French, German, Shorthand.

*No candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in English and in Typewriting.*

The Civil Service Commissioners may, at their discretion, restrict the examination in Typewriting to such a number of candidates at the head of the list resulting from the marks awarded for the work in the other subjects as they may think fit. The marks awarded for Typewriting to the candidates examined in that subject will be added to the marks awarded to those same candidates for their work in the three other subjects. The examination in Typewriting, as well as the examination in the other subjects, will be held at such times and places as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

6. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, so far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

7. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. A fee of ten shillings will be required from every candidate attending the Examination.

The Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in Belfast, Bristol, Edinburgh, London and Manchester, under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 21st September, 1926.

No person will be admitted to examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 22nd July, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

## MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

### IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 7 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act to make Regulations further amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations with respect to streets which by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Orders, 1925, have been declared by the Minister of Transport to be "restricted streets."

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (Amendment) Provisional Regulations, 1926, to come into operation forthwith as provisional regulations to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.
