successors, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish and to his successors for the time being a perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £150 to be payable half-yearly on the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in every year free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, rates, charges, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), the first of such half-yearly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £150 to be made on such of the said half-yearly days as shall happen next after the date of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District and to be a proportionate part of the said half-yearly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said half-yearly day of payment and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon certain hereditaments situate in the said Parish of Horton:

"And whereas the said perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of £150 has been so appointed, granted and confirmed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a yearly sum of £150 to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £150 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Horton, of the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles and of the said Parish of Gussage Saint Michael, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of the Ascension, Woodlands.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said

District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Anthony, Earl of Shaftesbury, his heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or any of them, or any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of the Ascension, Woodlands, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Horton, in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury, which is bounded upon the east and upon the north-east by the Parish of Verwood and Westmoors, upon the north partly by the Parish of Edmondsham, partly by a detached portion of the Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles, partly by a detached portion of the Parish of Gussage Saint Michael, all in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles, upon the north-west and upon the west by the said Parish of Gussage All Saints and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Gussage All Saints from the said Parish of Horton at the point in the middle of the River Allen near Stanbridge Mill where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Horton from the Civil Parish of Woodlands, and extending thence generally south-eastward along the said Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 3 miles and 50 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary is crossed by an imaginary straight line drawn from Monmouth's Ash to the middle of the Horton Common crossing over the Salisbury and Dorset Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 73 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said crossing, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the road leading from such crossing towards Lower Common and Three Legged Cross for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the footpath leading towards Crab Orchard, and extending thence first north-eastward, then eastward and then again north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 251 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Horton from the said Parish of Verwood and Westmoors.

"II. Also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles which is bounded upon the south-west, upon the south and upon the south-east by the above
