described portion of the said Parish of Horton, upon part of the north-east by the said detached portion of the Parish of Gussage Saint Michael, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the northeast, upon the north and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the Parish of Gussage Saint Michael from the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles at the point near Remedy Gate where such boundary crosses the middle of the road leading from Sutton Holms to St. Giles's Park, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of such road for a distance of 581 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Cranborne to Wimborne Minster, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last mentioned read for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to the Wimborne Lodge entrance to St. Giles's Park, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of such road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the gates at the said entrance to St. Giles's Park, and extending thence first north-westward and then in various directions along the fence forming the southern boundary of the said park for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence crosses the middle of the River Allen, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the River Allen for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles from the said Parish of Horton.

" III. Also all that detached portion of the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the east by the said Parish of Edmondsham, upon the south by the said Parish of Horton, upon the west partly by the said Parish of Horton and partly by the said detached portion of the Parish of Gussage Saint Michael, and upon the north by a detached portion of the said Parish of Gussage All Saints.

" IV. And also all that detached portion of the said Parish of Gussage Saint Michael which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the east by the said detached portion of the Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles, upon the south-west partly by the said Parish of Horton and partly by the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles, upon the north-west by the said Parish of Wimborne Saint Giles, upon the north by the said Parish of Edmondsham, and upon the north-east by the said detached portion of the Parish of Gussage All Saints."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to Incumbents of the Parishes out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall

have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Salisbury.
