

the streets or parts thereof declared to be "restricted streets" by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 3) Order, 1925, and included in the approved routes or parts thereof set out in Column 2 of the said Schedule, such number of omnibuses, in excess of the number of omnibuses which he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulation 2,

as may be necessary to enable him to maintain upon such last-mentioned approved routes the services shown opposite to them respectively in Column 3 of the said Schedule; provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.
