(c) who have had not less than one year's experience in button turning by machine and are employed in the setting up of turning machines :-

Proposed Piece Work Basis Time Rate 1s. 73d. per hour.

NOTE.—In the case of workers employed on Piece Work, each Piece Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker (i.e. a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the process in question) not less than the Piece Work Basis Time Rate applicable or if no Piece Work Basis Time Rate be applicable, not less than the General Minimum Time Rate applicable.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES.

(4) As respects male workers for whom minimum rates are proposed to be varied or fixed in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates specified in paragraphs (1) and (2) above, in the manner set out in Sections II. and III. of Part III. of the Schedule to the Notice V. (12) issued by the Trade Board and dated 3rd January, 1924, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable as set out in paragraphs (1) and (2) above in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board and set out in Part III. of the above-mentioned Notice V. (12), to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

APPLICATION OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

(5) The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts to all Male Workers in respect of whom minimum rates of Wages are proposed by this Notice to be varied or fixed, for all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button Manufacturing) Order, 1925, as set out in Part II. of the above-mentioned Notice V. (17).

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary and Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 6th July, 1926.
