APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR SIXTEEN HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metro-

polis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Sixteen Hackney Carriages at Chelsea Bridge Road, S.W., and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

On South-west side of roadway, commencing at a point twelve yards from the North-east corner of Royal Hospital Grounds and extending South-eastward by kerb. Three carriages to stand North-west of Urinal and thirteen South-east of same.

Front of vehicles toward the North-west.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT. STREET COLLECTIONS.

REGULATIONS, DATED JULY 2, 1926, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE POLICE, FACTORIES, & C. (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT, 1916 (6 & 7 GEO. 5, C. 31), WITH REGARD TO STREET COLLECTIONS OF MONEY OR THE SALE OF ARTICLES FOR OTHER THAN TRADE PURPOSES.

By virtue of the powers conferred upon me by Section 5 of the Police, Factories, & C. (Miscellaneous Provision) Act, 1916, I, being the Police Authority for the Metropolitan Police District, hereby revoke as from the 1st October, 1926, the Regulations dated 15th September, 1923 (S.R. & O. 1923, No. 1133), with respect to the places where and the conditions under which persons may be permitted in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District to collect money or sell articles for the benefit of charitable or other purposes, and make the following Regulations in place thereof which shall come into force on the 1st October, 1926.

(1) No collection of money (other than a collection taken at an open-air meeting) or sale of any article shall be made in any street or public place within the Metropolitan Police District unless the society, committee, or other body of persons responsible for such collection or sale shall have obtained from the Commissioner of Police a permit for such collection or sale. All applications for permits shall be referred to an Advisory Committee appointed by the Commissioner and approved by the Secretary of State.

(2) Application for a permit shall be made in writing in the form contained in the Schedule hereto not later than the first day of the month preceding that month in which it is proposed to hold the collection or sale, and every application shall be made in the name of a committee or other body consisting of not less than three persons, who shall be jointly responsible for the collection or sale.
