

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 15TH JULY, 1926.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1925, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Order.

1. The provisions of Part 1 of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920 (*Restrictions on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) as applied by the Order of the Minister (No. 4249) dated the 31st May, 1926, to the Area described in the Schedule to the latter Order, shall not apply to the movement of sheep of the Kerry Hill Breed to or from the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order, provided that the following conditions are complied with.

Special Conditions Applicable to Sheep Moved to the Sales referred to in this Order.

2. All sheep exposed at the special Sales specified in the Schedule to this Order shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) The sheep shall be accompanied by a Certificate of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the sheep are moved to the effect:—

(i) that the sheep have within 56 days before the movement been dipped twice

under the supervision of an Inspector of the Local Authority, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved for Sheep Scab by the Minister or purporting to be so approved.

(ii) that the sheep, since the second dipping, have been kept isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground or saleyard.

(b) Such Certificate shall on the arrival of the sheep at the said special Sales, be delivered up to the Inspector of the Ministry.

(c) The sheep may be moved from the said special Sales only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, authorising movement of the sheep to any destination in Great Britain and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be specified in the licence.

(d) All sheep exposed at the said special Sales shall be kept separate from all other sheep during movement to and from the sales and whilst being exposed thereat.

SALMON AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES ACT, 1923.

OUSE AND CAM DISTRICT FISHERY ORDER, 1926.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.
