

2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The part of the Civil Parish of Wanstead which was transferred by the recited Order to the Civil Parish of Woodford shall cease to form part of the Wanstead Sub-district of West Ham Registration District and shall be added to and form part of the Woodford Sub-district of the same Registration District.

4. The part of the Civil Parish of Woodford which was transferred by the recited Order to the Civil Parish of Wanstead shall cease to form part of the Woodford Sub-

district and shall be added to and form part of the Wanstead Sub-district.

5. The Registrar of the existing Woodford Sub-district shall be the Registrar of that Sub-district as altered by this Order.

RURAL DISTRICT OF LOUTH.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the 21st June, 1926, the Minister of Health has declared that on and after the 12th day of July, 1926, the following provisions of the Public Health Acts

Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Rural District of Louth, namely:—

Sections 15, 16, 23, 25, 27 and 33 comprised in Part 2 (streets and buildings);

Sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 44, 45, 46 and 47, comprised in Part 3 (sanitary provisions); and

Sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 59, 60, 62, 63, 64 and 65 comprised in Part 4 (infectious diseases):

Provided that such of the sections hereby declared to be in force as are specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall unless and until the Minister by Order otherwise directs have effect subject to the condition that the words set forth in the second column of that Schedule shall be added to and form part of the section opposite to which they are set.

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject as regards Sections 23, 25, 27 and 35 to the conditions specified in the Order.
