At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 26th day of *July*, 1926.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th day of July, 1926 (N.P. (2) 1873), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th June, 1920, to sanction, *inter alia*, the grant of an allowance of six pence a day to Engine Room ratings, other than Artificers and Mechanician ratings, when placed in charge of the machinery of Small Craft, whether steam or motor driven, the Horse Power of which exceeds 100, except when such Craft form part of the equipment of Your Majesty's Ships or are maintained in reserve :

“And whereas it is found necessary from time to time to employ on sea-going service Small Craft forming part of the equipment of Your Majesty's Ships or maintained in reserve :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to pay, at our discretion, an allowance of six pence a day to Engine Room ratings, other than Artificers and Mechanician ratings, placed in charge of the machinery of such Small Craft, whenever employed on passage of over twenty-four hours' duration or absent at sea overnight.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by subsection (1) of section five of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922 (Session 2), that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that under the law in force in the Irish Free State any tax is payable in

respect of a subject of charge in respect of which a corresponding tax is payable also in Great Britain; and

(b) that arrangements as specified in the declaration have been made with the Government of the Irish Free State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where there is a charge both to the British tax and to the Irish tax in respect of the same subject matter;

then, unless and until the Declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the British tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Irish tax, have the effect of law in the Irish Free State:

And whereas the arrangements set out in the Schedule to this Declaration have been made with the Government of the Irish Free State:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that under the laws in force in the Irish Free State succession duty or legacy duty is payable in respect of subjects of charge in respect of which a corresponding duty is payable also in Great Britain; and

(b) that the said arrangements have been made with the Government of the Irish Free State with a view to the granting of relief in cases where there is a charge both to the said British duty and to the said Irish duty in respect of the same subject matter.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief in respect of Double Taxation (Succession and Legacy Duty) (Irish Free State) Declaration, 1926."

#### SCHEDULE.

##### ARRANGEMENTS FOR RELIEF IN RESPECT OF DOUBLE TAXATION TO SUCCESSION DUTY OR TO SUCCESSION DUTY AND LEGACY DUTY.

(a) Where the Commissioners of Inland Revenue are satisfied that the forum of administration of a settlement is in the Irish Free State and that under that settlement Succession Duty is payable in the Irish Free State by reason of a death of a person dying on or after the first day of April, 1923, in respect of any settled personal or moveable property, they shall allow a sum equal to the amount of that duty to be deducted from the Legacy Duty or Succession Duty payable in Great Britain in respect of that property on the same death.

(b) Where the Revenue Commissioners of the Irish Free State are satisfied that the forum of administration of a settlement is in Great Britain and that under that settlement Succession Duty is payable in Great Britain by reason of a death of a person dying on or after the first day of April, 1923, in respect of any settled personal or moveable property, they shall allow a sum equal to the amount of that duty to be deducted from the Legacy Duty or Succession Duty payable in the Irish Free State in respect of that property on the same death.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section"), it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:—

"5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

"(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1926, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the *London Gazette*.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of twenty per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of twenty per cent.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vic., c. 60), it is enacted that whenever it appears to His Majesty the King in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there, His Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being remeasured in His Majesty's Dominions, be deemed to be of the

tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes, as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the Government of Estonia and are now in force in that country:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:--

1. This Order may be cited as the Estonian Tonnage Order, 1926.

2. Estonian ships, the certificates of registry or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 28th November, 1917, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

WHEREAS by Section 18 of the Extradition Act, 1870, it is, amongst other things, enacted that if by any law or ordinance made after passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, His Majesty may, by the Order in Council, applying the said Act in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the said Act:

And whereas by a law enacted by the Legislature of the Bahamas Islands the short title of which is "The Extradition Act, 1926," it is provided that all powers vested in, and acts authorised, or required to be done by a Police Magistrate or any Justice of the Peace in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals in the United Kingdom under the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, are vested in, and may in the Bahamas Islands be exercised and done by, any Magistrate in relation to the surrender of fugitive criminals under the said Acts:

Provided that a Magistrate in an Out Island shall, on the apprehension of a person under the said Acts, forthwith cause such person to be brought before and to be further dealt with by a Magistrate at Nassau:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that the said Act shall not come into operation until His Majesty shall by Order in Council direct that the said Act shall have effect within the Colony as if it were a part of the Extradition Act, 1870, and the said Act shall thereafter come into operation so soon as such Order in Council shall have been published in the Gazette:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Extradition Act, 1870, and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, direct that the Bahamas Islands Extradition Act, 1926, shall have effect in the Bahamas Islands without modification or alteration as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870.

And the Right Honourable Leopold Stennett Amery, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of June, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Brent Eleigh and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Milden, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Brent Eleigh and Milden, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Milden is now full the Reverend Cyril Fairfax Ford being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Brent Eleigh is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Brent Eleigh a pension (hereinafter referred to as the said pension) of £150 per annum to the Reverend Clement Havergal, late Incumbent of such Benefice:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly

recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Brent Eleigh and the said Benefice of Milden shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Brent Eleigh with Milden,’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent (or if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall not approve as aforesaid) then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall, with the approval of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent (or if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall not approve as aforesaid) then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That at any time and from time to time after the union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay-workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £120 in any one year.

“ 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Brent Eleigh shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Milden and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ 5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices of Brent Eleigh and Milden an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

“ 6. That upon the union taking effect, or upon the cessation of the said pension, whichever shall the later happen, all the Tithe rentcharges, glebe lands, and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the respective Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Bungay, Saint Mary, both in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bungay Saint Mary, the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect or of the cessation of the said pension, as the case may be, due and payable to the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged respectively and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Bungay, Saint Mary, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Bungay, Saint Mary, respectively, and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefices of Bury Saint Edmunds, Saint James, and Bungay, Saint Mary, or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the yearly rentcharges hereby created as aforesaid, then the said yearly rentcharges in both cases, or



rentcharge in either case in which equivalent endowments shall have been granted conveyed and annexed as aforesaid, shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable. And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the said Scheme or any part thereof within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Sutton, Saint Nicholas, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sutton, Saint Michael, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Sutton, Saint Nicholas, and Sutton, Saint Michael, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Sutton, Saint Nicholas, and Sutton, Saint Michael, are now full, the Reverend Ivor Moore Haines being the present Incumbent thereof:

" And whereas the said Ivor Moore Haines has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

" And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Sutton, Saint Nicholas:

" And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Sutton, Saint Nicholas, and Sutton, Saint Michael, now belongs to one and the same Patron:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Sutton, Saint Nicholas, and the said Benefice of Sutton, Saint Michael, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sutton, Saint Nicholas with Saint

Michael,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Ivor Moore Haines if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Sutton, Saint Nicholas, and Sutton, Saint Michael, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sutton, Saint Nicholas, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

CROWN OFFICE ACT, 1877.

THE COAL (EMERGENCY) SUPPLEMENTARY (No. 3) DIRECTIONS, 1926, DATED JULY 27TH, 1926, GIVEN BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE EMERGENCY REGULATIONS (No. 4), 1926.

The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Emergency Regulations (No. 4), 1926, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby direct as follows:—

1. The Coal (Emergency) Supplementary Directions, 1926, shall be amended by the insertion of the following paragraph between paragraphs (a) and (b) of Article 4 of the said Directions:—

(aa) Foreign coal, that is to say any coal which is not British coal, to an amount not exceeding one hundredweight in any period of two consecutive weeks, may also be supplied and acquired without permit for consumption in any domestic premises. The supply and acquisition of such coal shall be alternative and not supplementary to any supply or acquisition under the last preceding paragraph of this Article, but shall not be subject to the proviso contained therein.

2. These Directions may be cited as the Coal (Emergency) Supplementary (No. 3) Directions, 1926, and shall come into force on the twenty-ninth day of July, 1926.

### ARTIFICIAL SILK.

REGULATIONS, dated July 21, 1926, made by the Commissioners of Customs and Excise under Provision 8 of Part III of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1925 (15 and 16 Geo. 5. c. 36), for relieving from duty Artificial Silk to be used in the manufacture of Tissues in part of Artificial Silk and in part of other fibre and intended for exportation.

The Commissioners of Customs and Excise in pursuance of Provision 8 of Part III of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1925, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. Any person intending to export tissues in part of artificial silk and in part of other fibre and desiring to obtain, without payment of duty, artificial silk to be used in the manufacture of such tissues, shall give such security for the due exportation of such tissues as the said Commissioners may require and shall from time to time make application in writing to the said Commissioners in the form provided by them for that purpose for the delivery, without payment of duty, of the quantity of artificial silk for the time being required by him, giving the particulars required by such form, and such form when filled up and signed by such person (hereinafter called "The Exporter") shall be delivered to the Collector of Customs and Excise for the Collection in which the exporter carries on business, together with a specification from the manufacturer to whom the order for a fabric intended for exportation has been given, showing the respective weights of artificial silk and other fibre to be put into the fabric, and the length, width, and square yardage of the fabric and any other particulars required by the Commissioners.

2. If the Collector shall be satisfied that the artificial silk in respect of which an application is made is to be used in the manufacture of tissues in part of artificial silk and in part of other fibre and intended for exportation, he shall grant authority in writing to the exporter for delivery without payment of duty of the quantity of artificial silk specified in the authority.

3. Upon the production of the request and authority to the proper Officer of Customs and Excise at the ship, bonded warehouse, or factory where the artificial silk is lying, and on the special regulations applicable to artificial silk delivered from a factory or bonded warehouse being complied with, the person

entitled to delivery shall be allowed delivery without payment of duty, in accordance with the authority, of such quantity of artificial silk, not exceeding the quantity specified in the authority, as he shall require, provided that the aggregate of the quantities of artificial silk delivered without payment of duty under any authority shall not exceed the total quantity permitted by the authority.

4. The Exporter shall as soon as it is available or as soon as it has been manufactured, furnish to the Collector by whom an authority was granted a sample of the tissue containing artificial silk delivered without payment of duty.

5. Before the tissues containing any artificial silk which has been delivered without payment of duty are packed for the purposes of exportation, the exporter shall prepare a Shipping Bill in duplicate in such form as the Commissioners shall require in respect of such tissues and containing such particulars of the artificial silk contained therein as the Commissioners may consider necessary and shall at least 12 hours before such packing deliver one copy of the Shipping Bill to the proper Officer of the Customs and Excise station in which his premises are situated and shall produce the goods for examination by such officer.

6. Before the exportation of the said goods the exporter shall deliver the other copy of the Shipping Bill to the Collector of Customs and Excise at the Port of shipment.

7. All artificial silk delivered without payment of duty in respect of any application made in accordance with these Regulations shall be used in the manufacture of tissue as aforesaid and such tissue shall be exported within six calendar months of the date of such delivery unless the Commissioners shall allow an extension of time in any particular case.

8. The Exporter and the manufacturer of the goods shall furnish to the Commissioners such particulars as they may require of the artificial silk contained in any tissues produced for exportation, and shall also produce to any Officer of Customs and Excise any invoices, documents or books necessary to verify such particulars.

9.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as "The Artificial Silk (Through Ticket) Regulations, 1926."

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict., c. 63), applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

## CITY OF BRADFORD.

## BYE-LAWS AS TO MOTOR OMNIBUSES.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that on the 23rd day of July, 1926, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Bradford in pursuance of sections 41 and 45 of the Bradford Corporation Act 1925 duly made the bye-laws following, that is to say:—

1. In the Bye-laws hereinafter set forth the expression "the Corporation" means "The Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Bradford," the expression "Omnibus" means a motor omnibus and the expression "Conductor" includes any officer or servant in the employment of the Corporation who shall have charge (whether sole or otherwise) of an omnibus

2. These Bye-laws shall extend and apply to all omnibuses of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws.

3. Every intending passenger shall enter an omnibus by the appointed place of entrance and not otherwise and every passenger shall depart from an omnibus by the appointed place of exit and not otherwise. When an omnibus is stationary no person shall board the same until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so

4. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any omnibus when the same is in motion.

5. No person shall smoke whilst in or on any omnibus except when in a compartment or on a seat specially set apart by the Corporation for that purpose, and no person shall spit in or from or against any omnibus.

6. No passenger shall whilst travelling in or on any omnibus play or perform upon any musical instrument.

7. No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, and no person who for any other cause is unfit, in the opinion of the Conductor, to be a passenger, shall enter or mount any omnibus or attempt to do so. Any person who shall offend against this Bye-law shall, in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed, be liable to be summarily removed, or prevented from entering or mounting, by or under the direction of the Conductor.

8. No person whilst in or on any omnibus shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on or against any omnibus or any tramway station, waiting-room, or other premises used in connection with the omnibuses, of the Corporation.

10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions or linings, or remove or deface any number plate or printed or other notice in, or on any omnibus, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise damage any omnibus. Any person who shall offend against this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed, in addition to being liable to pay to the Corporation the amount of any damage done.

11. A person whose dress or clothing might, and a person carrying any article which might,

in the opinion of the Conductor, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of the omnibus, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the Conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain in or on any omnibus, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found in or on any omnibus shall, on request of the Conductor leave the same, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned. Provided that in regard to omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from mounting, entering or remaining in or on any omnibus under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment, but, if so directed by the Conductor he shall travel upon the upper deck (if any) provided that it is under cover.

12. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for the journey and in any case, whether the said fare shall have been demanded or not, shall pay such fare before he shall leave the omnibus.

13. Each passenger shall show his ticket, if any, when required so to do, to the Conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

14. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface any ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible, or wilfully use or attempt to use any ticket which shall have been in any respect materially altered or defaced.

15. Each passenger may take with him into an omnibus personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, and such luggage shall be placed only in such position in the omnibus as shall be indicated to the passenger by the Conductor. The Conductor may decline to take into or upon the omnibus any luggage of a form or nature calculated, in his opinion, to annoy or inconvenience any passenger.

16. No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Corporation, shall travel on any of the steps or platforms of any omnibus, or stand on the upper deck (if any), or sit on any railing or guard of any omnibus, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting, shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

17. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger or a duly authorised officer of the Corporation, shall enter or mount, or attempt to enter or mount, any omnibus.

18. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

19. When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall mount, enter or remain in or on any such omnibus after warning by the Conductor not to do so.

20. Except as hereinafter mentioned no person shall allow or permit any dog or other animal to be in or on any omnibus or any part thereof: provided that any person may allow a dog held by a leash to accompany him if he first obtain the consent of the Conductor and if he pay, on demand, the prescribed charge for the dog. Any person who shall be accompanied by a dog or other animal in or on any omnibus or any part thereof shall, notwithstanding any such consent as is hereinbefore mentioned, on the request of the Conductor forthwith remove from the omnibus such dog or other animal and, if he shall fail to comply forthwith with such request, the dog or other animal may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

21. No person shall enter or mount, or attempt to enter or mount, any omnibus; or travel, or attempt to travel, in or on any omnibus with loaded fire-arms, or with any article, instrument or implement which might, in the opinion of the Conductor, be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

22. No person shall bring into, or place upon, any omnibus any clothing, or other article, likely to spread any dangerous, contagious or infectious disease or disorder and any such clothing, or other article, found in or on any omnibus may be removed therefrom by or under the direction of the Conductor.

23. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus, and no person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or in any way interfere with the omnibus or its mechanism or equipment.

24. In any case in which an omnibus is run and reserved for any special purpose, which shall be indicated by a notice conspicuously exhibited upon such omnibus, no person other

than the person or persons for whose conveyance the omnibus is reserved shall enter or mount, or attempt to enter or mount, the omnibus.

25. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause, unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand the return of the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available omnibus the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person, other than a servant or officer of the Corporation, shall, except with the consent of the Conductor, enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.

26. Any person who shall offend against or commit a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable, if the offence is continued, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter prescribed, to be immediately removed from the omnibus, by or under the direction of the Conductor, and, if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to its return.

27. The Conductor shall enforce these Bye-laws and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

28. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

29. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position in each omnibus in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

30. These Bye-laws shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1926.
