PETROLEUM ACT, 1926.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules
Publication Act, 1893, that the Secretary of
State for the Home Department proposes,
after the expiration of forty days from this
date, to make Regulations under Section 9 and
the Third Schedule of the Petroleum Act, 1926,
for the conveyance of petroleum spirit by road.

The chief points dealt with by the Regula-
tions are the construction and capacity of tank
wagons or other vehicles to be used for the
purpose and the precautions to be taken for the
prevention of fire and explosion.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

VARYING AND FIXING OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THE CHAIN MAKING TRADE.

The Chain Trade Board (Great Britain)
have issued a Notice dated 12th August, 1926,
setting out all the Minimum Rates of wages
in operation under the Trade Boards Acts for
workers engaged in the making of Dollied or
Tommied Chain from iron of sizes No. 6
I.S.W.G. up to and including $\frac{3}{16}$ inch, and
in making Hand Hammered Chain from iron
of sizes $\frac{3}{8}$ inch up to and including $\frac{1}{2}$ inch
