TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 and 1918.

VARYING AND FIXING OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THE CHAIN MAKING TRADE.

The Chain Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued a Notice dated 12th August, 1926, setting out all the Minimum Rates of wages in operation under the Trade Boards Acts for workers engaged in the making of Dollied or Tommied Chain from iron of sizes No. 6 I.S.W.G. up to and including 31 inch, and in making Hand Hammered Chain from iron of sizes  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch up to and including  $\frac{17}{37}$  inch
