CITY OF LICHFIELD.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT, 1925.

BY an Order taking effect on the 23rd day of August, 1926, the Minister of Health has consented to the adoption by the Town Council of Lichfield of sections 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath), 22 (preventing soil, &c., from being washed into streets), 44 (offensive trades), and the sections contained in Part V. (watercourses, &c.) of the Public Health Act, 1925, and has repealed the following provisions of the local Act Geo. III, c. 42, for the purpose of bringing that Act into conformity with the Public Health Act, 1925, namely:—

So much of section 26 (paving of streets, &c.) as relates to any subject-matter of section 23 (lopping of trees overhanging highways) of the Public Health Act, 1925.

So much of section 40 (naming of streets and numbering of houses) as relates to any subject-matter of sections 18 and 19 (naming of streets) of the Public Health Act, 1925.

So much of section 57 (removal of spouts and gutters) as relates to any subject-matter of section 21 (prevention of water flowing on footpath) of the Public Health Act, 1925.

So much of section 56 (removal of posts, signs, &c.) and of section 58 (prevention of future projection) as relates to any subject-matter of section 24 (projections against or in front of houses or buildings) of the Public Health Act, 1925.

EAST NOTTINGHAMSHIRE. ELECTRICITY.

(Application for Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application has been made by the Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire Electric Power Company (hereinafter called "the Company"), whose principal office is at 66, Queen Street, in the city of London, to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes, as defined by the above Acts, within the Urban District of Warsop; the Rural Districts of Leake, Newark and Southwell; the Rural District of Bingham (except the Parishes of Edwalton, Holme-Pierrepont and Radcliffe on Trent, which are included in the area of supply of the Corporation of Nottingham under the Nottingham Corporation Act, 1923); the Parishes of Barton in Fabis, Bradmore, Bunny, Burton Joyce, Calverton, Cossall, Gotham, Lambley, Strelley, Thrumpton, Trowell and Woodborough in the Rural District of Basford; the Parishes of Blidworth, Haywood Oaks, Lindhurst and Sookholme in the Rural District of Skegby; so much of the Parish of Toton in the Rural District of Stapleford as lies to the north-east of an imaginary line, drawn from a point in the old main road from Long Eaton to Nottingham in front of the Malthouse in a southerly direction along the centre of the said main road towards Long Eaton, to a point one hundred yards south of the water course dividing the enclosures numbered 36 and 37 on the 25-inch Ordnance Map Nottinghamshire sheet XLI 15 (Edition of 1914), thence in a straight line across the enclosures numbered 60 and 59, and along the eastern boundary of the enclosure numbered 111 on the 25-inch Ordnance Map Derbyshire Sheet LVI 3 and Nottinghamshire sheet XLV 3, thence in a straight line across the enclosure numbered 114 to a point on the road leading from Toton towards Attenborough Station forty-five yards west of the south-western corner of the enclosure numbered 113, thence along the said last-mentioned road in an easterly direction to a point one hundred and fifty feet north-east of the junction of the said road with the road leading towards Barton Ferry, thence in a south-easterly direction parallel with and at a distance of one hundred and fifty feet from the Barton Ferry Road to Barton Ferry on the River Trent; and the Parishes of Kingston upon Soar and Ratcliffe upon Soar (administered by the Rural District Council of Shardlow), (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Company to exercise within the area of supply all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for the supply of electricity.
