A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas on the twenty-sixth day of July last, We did, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare by proclamation, in pursuance of the said Act, that a state of emergency existed:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that no such proclamation shall be in force for more than one month, without prejudice to the issue of another proclamation at or before the end of that period:

And whereas the continued cessation of work in Coal Mines does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

A Proclamation for the Summoning of Parliament.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS on the 30th day of April, 1926;. We were pleased, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Us by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, to issue a Proclamation of Emergency:

And whereas on the 29th day of May, 1926, the 28th day of June, 1926, and the 26th day of July, 1926, We were pleased, by virtue of the said powers, to make further Proclamations of Emergency:

And whereas the Proclamation of Emergency made on the said 26th day of July, 1926, will expire after one month from the date thereof:

And whereas We have this day been pleased to make a new Proclamation of Emergency under the said Act:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that where a Proclamation of Emergency has been made the occasion thereof shall forthwith be communicated to Parliament, and, if Parliament is then separated by such adjournment or prorogation as will not expire within five days, a Proclamation shall be issued for the meeting of Parliament within five days, and Parliament shall accordingly meet and sit upon the day appointed by that Proclamation, and shall continue to sit and act in like manner as if it had stood adjourned or prorogued to the same day:

And whereas the House of Lords stands adjourned to Thursday, the 21st day of October next, and the House of Commons stands adjourned to Tuesday, the 9th day of

November next:

Now, therefore, We, in pursuance of the said Act and all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim and give notice of Our Royal intention and pleasure that Our Parliament, notwithstanding that it now stands adjourned as aforesaid, shall assemble and be holden on Monday, the 30th day of August instant; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Monday, the 30th day of August.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- Lords Commissioners Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 3rd September, 1926, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 6th September, 1926, to Saturday, the 11th September, 1926, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders the amount applied for. must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION. (Dr. John Symington Stewart.)

Whereas Dr. John Symington Stewart, M.B., Ch.B., of 252, Morrison Street, Edinburgh, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts.

And whereas the said Dr. John Symington Stewart cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or supply raw opium or any of the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, and No. 12 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, as amended by Regulation 5 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1926, I hereby give notice that I withdraw as from to-day's date, from the said Dr. John Symington Stewart, the authorisations granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and supply raw opium and the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

And I also direct, as from the same date, that the exception in Regulation 4 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, which permits dangerous drugs to be supplied on a prescription given by a duly qualified medical practitioner shall not apply in respect of prescriptions given by Dr. John Symington Stewart.

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE AREAS COMPRISING (1) THE COUNTY OF YORKSHIRE, (2) THE COUNTIES OF EAST LANCASHIRE AND WESTMORLAND, (3) THE COUNTIES OF MONMOUTHSHIRE, RADNORSHIRE, BRECKNOCKSHIRE, CARMARTHENSHIRE, CARDIGANSHIRE, PEMBROKESHIRE AND GLAMORGANSHIRE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female workers as set out in the Notices R.B.
