DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION.

(DR. JOHN SYMINGTON STEWART.)

Whereas Dr. John Symington Stewart, M.B., Ch.B., of 252, Morrison Street, Edinburgh, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts.

And whereas the said Dr. John Symington Stewart cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or supply raw opium or any of the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, and No. 12 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, as amended by Regulation 5 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1926, I hereby give notice that I withdraw as from to-day's date, from the said Dr. John Symington Stewart, the authorisations granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and supply raw opium and the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

And I also direct, as from the same date, that the exception in Regulation 4 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1921, which permits dangerous drugs to be supplied on a prescription given by a duly qualified medical practitioner shall not apply in respect of prescriptions given by Dr. John Symington Stewart.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN THE AREAS COMPRISING (1) THE COUNTY OF YORKSHIRE, (2) THE COUNTIES OF EAST LANCASHIRE AND WESTMORLAND, (3) THE COUNTIES OF MONMOUTHSHIRE, RADNORSHIRE, BRECKNOCKSHIRE, CARMARTHENSHIRE, CARDIGANSHIRE, PEMBROKESHIRE AND GLAMORGANSHIRE.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, 1st August, 1922, and 1st April, 1926, respectively, the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (England and Wales) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female workers as set out in the Notices R.B. (22) and R.B. (23), issued by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) and dated 28th February, 1923, in their application to workers employed in the three above-mentioned Areas, AND TO FIX General Minimum Piece Rates (Log Rates) for certain classes of male workers in such Areas.
