FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he proposes to make new Regulations under Section 79 of the Act, in substitution for the Regulations dated 27th July, 1925, for the lifting by hand of heavy weights in the manufacture, dyeing or finishing of woollen or worsted textiles.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, London, S.W. 1.

Objections to the draft Regulations by or on behalf of any persons affected by the Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State, Home Office, London, S.W. 1, within 30 days from the date of this notice. Every such objection must be in writing and must state (a) the draft Regulations or portions of draft Regulations objected to; (b) the specific grounds of objection; and (c) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT ACT, 1907.

BY an Order dated the twenty-fourth day of August 1926, the Minister of Health has declared that, on and after the 18th day of October 1926 the following provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the Urban District of Denby and Cumberworth, namely:—

Part II (streets and buildings), other than Sections 24, 27 and 31;

Part III (sanitary provisions), other than Section 51;

Part IV (infectious diseases), other than Sections 61, 66 and 67;

Part V (common lodging-houses); and

Part VI (recreation grounds).

The above provisions are declared to be in force subject, as regards Sections 30, 35, 38 and 75 to the conditions specified in the Order.

TRAMWAYS ACT, 1870.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 1st day of September, 1926, the Wigan Corporation, in pursuance of Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, duly made the following Bye-laws and Regulations, viz. :—

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO TRAMWAYS AND MOTOR OMNIBUSES.

The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Wigan, being assembled in Council at the Town Hall in the said Borough, on the 1st day of September, 1926, acting by the Council as Promoters and as the Local Authority for the said Borough do hereby under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, as applied by Section 3 of the Wigan Light Railway Order, 1908, and by the Wigan Corporation Act, 1921; and every other power enabling them in that behalf make the following Bye-laws and Regulations, namely :—

INTERPRETATION.

1. Throughout these Bye-laws and Regulations the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Wigan. The word "Tramways" means the Tramway and Light Railway Systems worked by the Corporation whether situate within the Borough of Wigan or in any other District; the word "Car" means any carriage or Car run upon the Tramways and any motor omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; the word "Conductor" means any Officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of a car; and the word "Driver" means any Officer or Servant of

the Corporation driving or helping to drive a car. "Duly authorised Officer or Servant" means any conductor or driver or any other Officer or Servant of the Corporation charged with the duties of supervising drivers and conductors or in relation to offences under these Bylaws and Regulations in connection with or appertaining to any waiting room or premises used in connection with the Tramways, the person or persons in charge of such waiting room or premises.

REPEAL OF FORMER BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

2. From and after the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force all Bye-laws and Regulations heretofore made by the said Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses with respect to Tramways shall be repealed; but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal may be continued and prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

EXTENT OF BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

3. The Bye-laws and Regulations herein-after set forth shall extend and apply to every car of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

ENTERING AND LEAVING CARS.

4. Every person shall enter and depart from a car by the step of the hindermost or Conductor's platform, and not otherwise. When a car stops, no person shall board the car until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any car in motion.

SMOKING.

5. No person shall smoke or carry any lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or upon any car in any tramway waiting room except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

PLAYING MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS.

6. No passenger or other person shall while riding in or upon any car or using any tramway waiting room sing or whistle, or play or perform upon any musical instrument or make any other noise which shall in the opinion of the Conductor be objectionable to passengers.

INTOXICATED AND INFECTED PERSONS.

7. No person who in the opinion of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant is in a state of intoxication or affected by any dangerous contagious or infectious disorder or disease, or who for any other reason is in the opinion of any duly authorised Officer or Servant unfit to be a passenger in or on any car or to enter any tramways waiting room or any other premises used in connection with the tramways, shall enter or mount upon any car or enter any premises as aforesaid and if any such person shall attempt to so enter or be found in or upon any car or in or upon any such premises it shall be lawful for the conductor or any other duly authorised Officer or Servant to prevent such entrance upon or into or remove any such person from the car or premises as aforesaid, and if such person shall

have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of such fare or any part thereof. No person shall place any article likely to spread any contagious or infectious disease upon any car or in premises as aforesaid.

OBJECTIONABLE PERSONS.

8. Any person whose dress or clothing might in the opinion of the Conductor of the car or other duly authorised Officer or Servant soil injure or damage the seats, linings, curtains, cushions, or other fittings of any car, or the dress or clothing of any passenger shall not be entitled to enter, mount or remain in or upon any car or to enter or remain in or on any tramways waiting room or any other premises used in connection with the tramways any may be prevented from entering, mounting or remaining in or upon any car or from entering or remaining in or on such waiting room or premises and shall not enter, mount or remain in or upon any car or enter or remain in or on any such waiting room or premises after being requested not to do so by any such Officer or Servant, and if found in or upon any car or in or on any such waiting room or premises shall on the request of the Conductor or any such Officer or Servant leave the car or such waiting room or premises upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned or tendered to him and, on his refusal to do so, he may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant. Provided that on cars specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this Bye-law and Regulation, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment. Provided, further, that in top covered double deck cars any such person shall, if so directed by the Conductor travel in the upper deck when there is seating accommodation available thereon.

LANGUAGE OR CONDUCT.

9. No person shall swear or use obscene offensive or abusive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any car or in or upon any tramways waiting room or any other premises used in connection with the tramways, or spit or commit any nuisance in or upon, or from or against any car or tramways waiting room or other premises as aforesaid or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger or of any person lawfully using any such waiting room or premises aforesaid. No person shall distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind or beg or collect alms or subscriptions, or sell, expose for sale or attempt to sell any article, or play any games or gamble or throw down and leave in or upon any car, tramway station, waiting room, or premises, as aforesaid, any waste paper or other refuse or deposit remnants of food or fruit or any other objectionable matter in or upon any car or in or upon any waiting room or premises aforesaid.

DAMAGE TO CAR.

10. No person shall wilfully, cut, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, linings or body of the car or remove or deface any number plate printed or other notice in or on the car or break or scratch any window of or

otherwise wilfully damage any car. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws, and regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

PAYMENT OF FARE.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, and whether the fare shall have been demanded or not, before leaving the car pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant the fare legally payable for the journey or for the stage thereof travelled by such passenger. Upon payment of the fare the passenger shall receive and accept a ticket for the journey or stage in respect of which the fare is paid, such ticket shall be only available by the car on which it is issued and for the passenger to whom it is given or in respect of whom it is issued. A passenger travelling beyond the stage or journey to which the ticket issued is available shall pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for the distance travelled by the passenger beyond the stage or journey to which the fare had been paid.

TICKETS.

12.—(a) Every passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do by the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up the ticket issued in such a condition that the number can be read and any other material portion thereof identified or in default pay the fare legally payable for the distance or stage travelled over by such passenger.

(b) Any ticket for the time being issued by the Corporation in respect of a fare shall only be available for the car on or for which it is issued (except in the case of return, transfer, or season tickets), and no passenger shall (except as expressly provided for by these Bye-laws and Regulations) be entitled to leave any car for any purpose whatsoever at any stage and resume his journey by a different car from that on or for which such ticket was issued without payment of a fresh fare from the point at which the passenger entered the second or other car.

(c) Tickets shall not be transferable.

(d) Return, transfer or season tickets shall only be available if used in accordance with the conditions upon which the same are issued.

(e) No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

(f) No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any car or on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which had already been used on a previous journey or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions upon which it is issued.

WORKMEN'S TICKETS.

13. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Tramways shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

LUGGAGE AND PARCELS.

14. No person shall without the consent of the Conductor take or attempt to take upon any car any personal luggage exceeding twenty-eight pounds in weight or any parcel (not being personal luggage of not more than twenty-eight pounds in weight accompanied by a passenger) or any luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) which from its size or otherwise is in the opinion of the Conductor unsuitable for conveyance in or upon the car. All luggage conveyed in or on any car shall be placed in such positions and in such parts of the car as shall be directed by the Conductor. A passenger shall in respect of all luggage taken or brought by him upon any car pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer or servant the appropriate charge in accordance with the scale of charges for the time being applicable to the carriage of parcels or luggage upon a car, and displayed in the car.

TRAVELLING ON STEPS, ETC.

15. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall travel on the steps or platforms of any car, or stand on the upper deck, or stand or sit on the railing, guards, or buffers of any car and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or a duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation, shall enter or mount any car. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any car, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior on the lower deck of the car with the consent of the Conductor.

FULL NUMBER OF PASSENGERS.

16. When any car contains on the lower deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided on such lower deck, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain thereon, except by the express permission of the Conductor first obtained and upon a breach of this Bye-law and Regulation, and on a refusal to leave a car a passenger may be immediately removed from a car by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation. When a car contains on the upper deck thereof the full number of passengers for which seating accommodation, according to the notice thereof attached to the car, is provided, on such upper deck no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain thereon.

Dogs.

17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed on the lower deck of any car and no dog or other animal shall be allowed upon the upper deck of any car except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Any dog or other animal allowed on the upper deck of any car shall be carried or held on leash. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any car except by permission of the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or found in or on any car shall be removed from

the car by the person in charge of such dog or other animal immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation. No dog shall be allowed in or taken into any tramways waiting room.

FIREARMS.

18. No person shall enter, mount upon or remain or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement, or any material or substance which may in the opinion of the Conductor be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil, injure or damage any car or the clothing of any passenger.

INTERFERENCE WITH OFFICERS, SIGNALS, ETC.

19. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Officer or Servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any tramway or any car, tramways waiting room or premises belonging to the Corporation and used in connection with the tramways.

No person other than the Conductor or Driver or other duly authorised Officer or Servant of the Corporation shall signal a car to start or shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, switches, lights, ventilators, trolley-cords, platform chains, or any part of a car or its equipment, or without reasonable cause signal a car to stop.

No person shall wilfully, in any way, obstruct, impede or interfere with a car or the traffic on the Tramways Undertaking.

DISABLED CARS.

20. If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the Conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the Conductor, enter a disabled or damaged car.

CARS PROCEEDING TO SHEDS.

21. No person shall travel upon a car which is proceeding to a shed and is not on its usual route unless permitted to do so by the Conductor, and where such person is so permitted, he shall pay the usual fare payable on such route.

POWER TO REMOVE PASSENGERS COMMITTING OFFENCE.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any car, any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the car by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

CONDUCTORS AND DRIVERS TO ENFORCE
BYE-LAWS.

23. Every Conductor and Driver of a Car and every other duly authorised Officer or Servant shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof.

PENALTY.

24. Any person infringing any of the foregoing Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding forty shillings, and in the case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not exceeding ten shillings in addition to the first-mentioned penalty for every day during which such offence continues.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS TO BE PLACED
IN CARS.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, tramway station, waiting room, or shelter, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

COMMENCEMENT OF BYE-LAWS.

26. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of December, 1926.
